

# LOCALIZATION OF CONFLICT INCIDENTS

<u>Note:</u> The following list is an overview of the incident data included in the ACLED dataset. More details are available in the actual dataset (date, location data, event type, involved actors, information sources, etc.). In the following list, the names of event locations are taken from ACLED, while the administrative region names are taken from GADM data which serves as the basis for the map above.

In Abia, 3 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Aba, Umuahia.

In Adamawa, 32 incidents killing 419 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Fufore, Garta, Gashaka, Gaya, Gombi, Gulak, Hong, Madagali, Madagali, Maiha, Mararaba Hildi, Michika, Mubi, Mubi, Pella, Sina, Toungo, Yola.

In Akwa Ibom, 5 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: Oron, Uyo.

In Anambra, 12 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Amawbia, Asaba, Awka, Ndikpa, Nnewi, Ogbaru, Onitsha.

In **Bauchi**, 9 incidents killing **74** people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Azare, Bauchi, Darazo, Lame, Mundu**.

In Bayelsa, 18 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: Brass, Ekeremor, Kaiama, Kolokuma/Opokuma, Mbiama, Nembe, Ogbia, Patani, Sagbama, Southern Ijaw, Yenagoa.

In Benue, 4 incidents killing 8 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Adekaa, Makurdi, Zongo.

In Borno, 46 incidents killing 1142 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Abadam, Bama, Bazza, Bulabulin, Chibok, Damasak, Damboa, Gajiganna, Galtimari, Gubio, Gumsuri, Gur, Gwoza, Hawul, Kamtahi, Karetu, Kautakari, Konduga, Kukawa, Lassa, Madari, Mafa, Maiduguri, Malam Fatori, Malari, Mobbar, Sambisa Forest Reserve, Shaffa, Shani, Uba.

In Cross River, 8 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Boki, Calabar, Danare.

In **Delta**, **14** incidents killing **5** people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Abraka, Amupke, Escravos, Ethiope East, Ika North East, Koko, Kokori, Sapele, Umuachi-Afor, Warri**.

In Ebonyi, 1 incident killing 0 people was reported. The following location was affected: Abakaliki.

In Edo, 14 incidents killing 9 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Benin City, Egor, Oredo.

In Ekiti, 5 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: Ado-Ekiti, Ifaki, Oye.

In Enugu, 3 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: Enugu, Ezeagu, Nsukka.

In **Federal Capital Territory**, **25** incidents killing **7** people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Abuja**, **Barangoni**.

In Gombe, 12 incidents killing 232 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Ashaka, Bajoga, Bolari, Gombe, Nafada.

In Imo, 6 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Ohaji, Owerri, Owerri West.

In Kaduna, 7 incidents killing 30 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Kaduna, Saminaka, Tataura, Tattaura, Ungwan Daudu.

In Kano, 5 incidents killing 216 people were reported. The following location was affected: Kano.

In Katsina, 1 incident killing 5 people was reported. The following location was affected: Kankara.

In **Kogi**, **6** incidents killing **7** people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Abugi**, **Kabba**, **Koton Karifi**, **Lokoja**.

In **Kwara**, **4** incidents killing **0** people were reported. The following location was affected: **Ilorin**.

In Lagos, 19 incidents killing 43 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Alausa, Ijanikin, Ikeja, Ikosi, Kirikiri, Lagos.

In Nassarawa, 19 incidents killing 127 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Akwanga, Arikya, Ashige, Garaku, Kadarko, Lafia, Obi, Shabu, Tudun Adabu.

In Niger, 3 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: Kontagora, Minna, Tunga.

In Ogun, 6 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: Abeokuta, Ijebu-Ode, Ilaro.

In Ondo, 4 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Akure, Elegbeka, Igbotako.

In Osun, 3 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Ife-Ife, Ondo.

In Oyo, 14 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Egbeda, Ibadan, Lagelu, Ona Ara.

In **Plateau**, 23 incidents killing 97 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Bachit, Barakin Ladi, Bassa, Dum, Jos, Kantoma, Rim**.

In Rivers, 14 incidents killing 7 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Abonnema, Afam Uku, Akpaji, Bori, Eleme, Obigbo, Onne, Port Harcourt, Tai.

In Sokoto, 1 incident killing 0 people was reported. The following location was affected: Sokoto.

In **Taraba**, **4** incidents killing **36** people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Gindin Waya**, **Sabon Gida**, **Wukari**, **Zing**.

In Water body, 1 incident killing 10 people was reported. The following location was affected: Malamfatori.

In Yobe, 15 incidents killing 166 people were reported. The following locations were affected: Biriri, Damagun, Damaturu, Fika, Garin Itace, Geidam, Goniri, Maiduwa, Ngamdu, Potiskum.

In **Zamfara**, **2** incidents killing **50** people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Lilu, Shinkafi**.

# **METHODOLOGY**

The data used in this report was collected by the Armed Conflict Location and Event Data Project (ACLED). ACLED collects data on reported conflict events in selected African and Asian countries, Nigeria being among them. ACLED researchers collect event data from a variety of sources and code them by date, location, agent, and event type. Based on these data, the Austrian Center for Country of Origin & Asylum Research and Documentation (ACCORD) compiles updates on conflict incidents.
