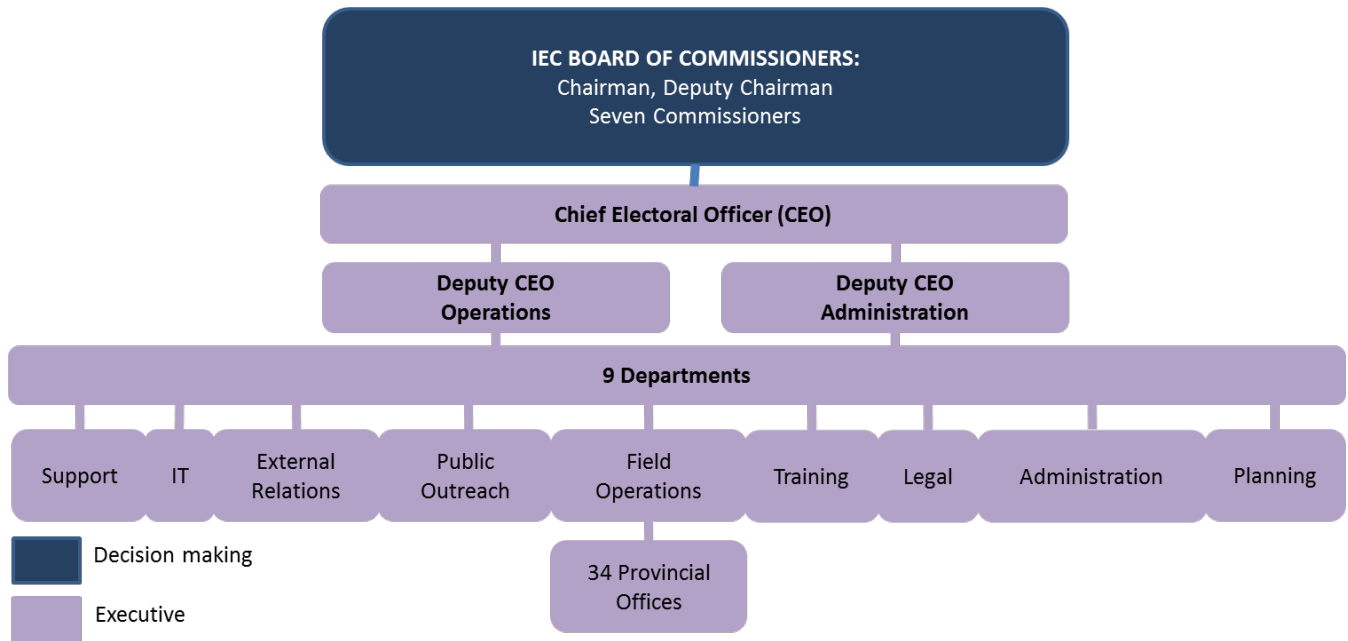


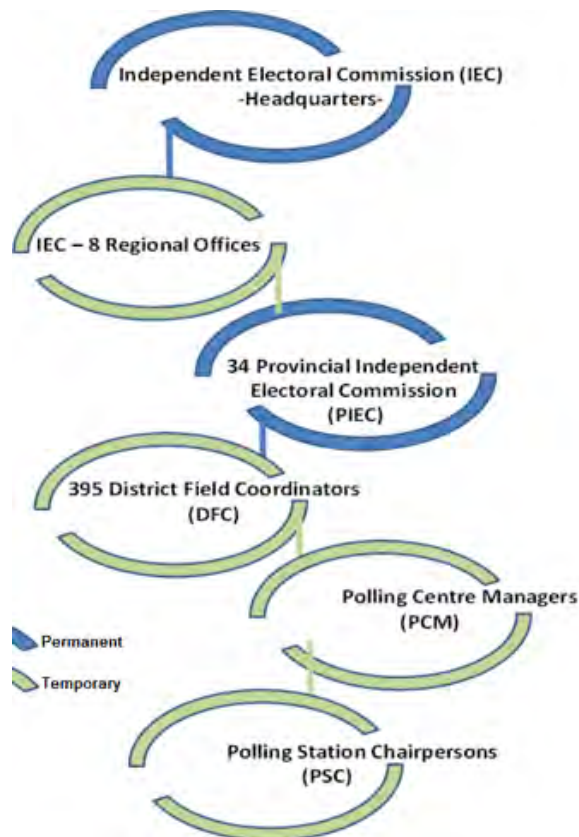

1.2 Regional structure of the Independent Election Commission

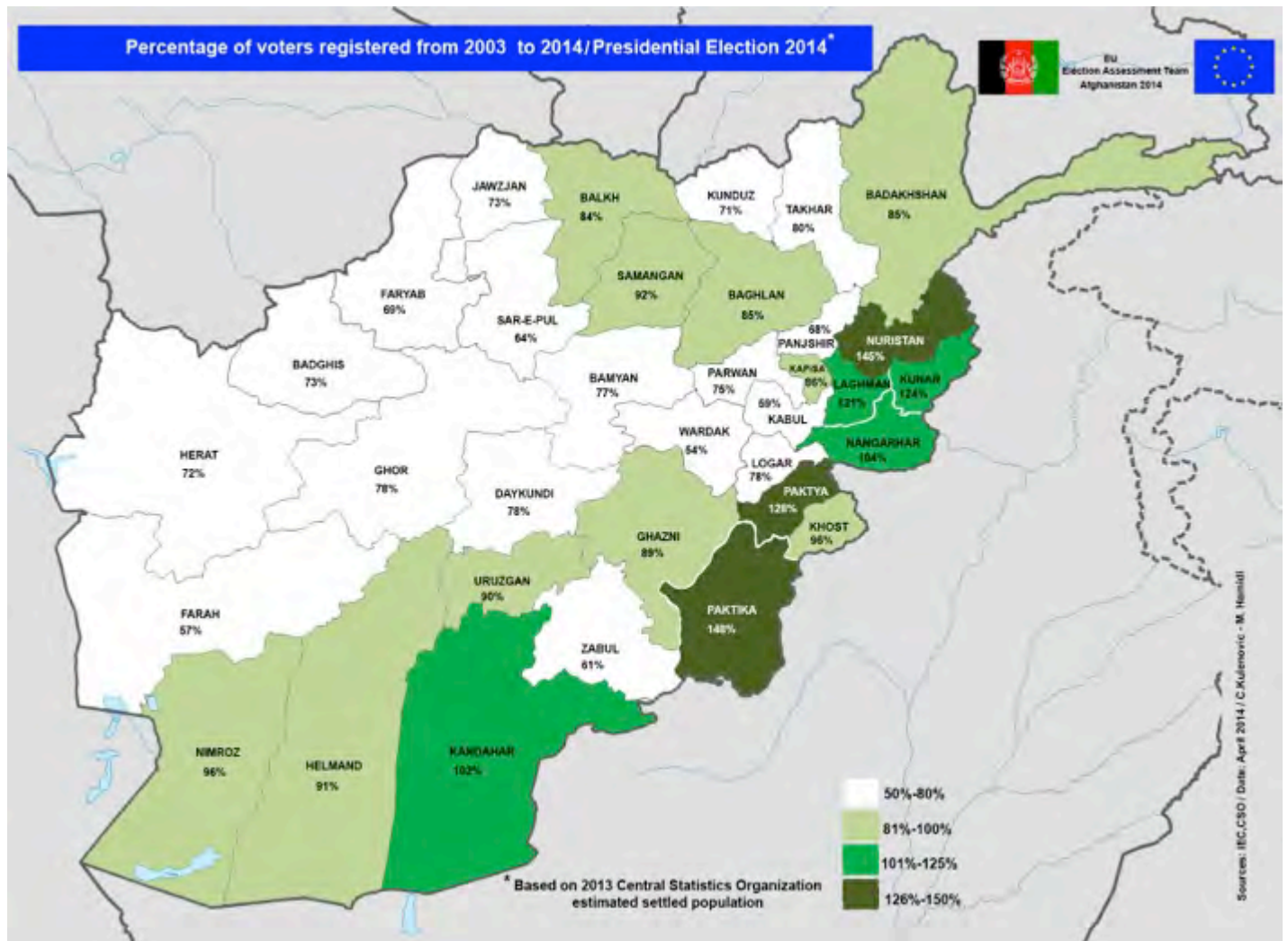

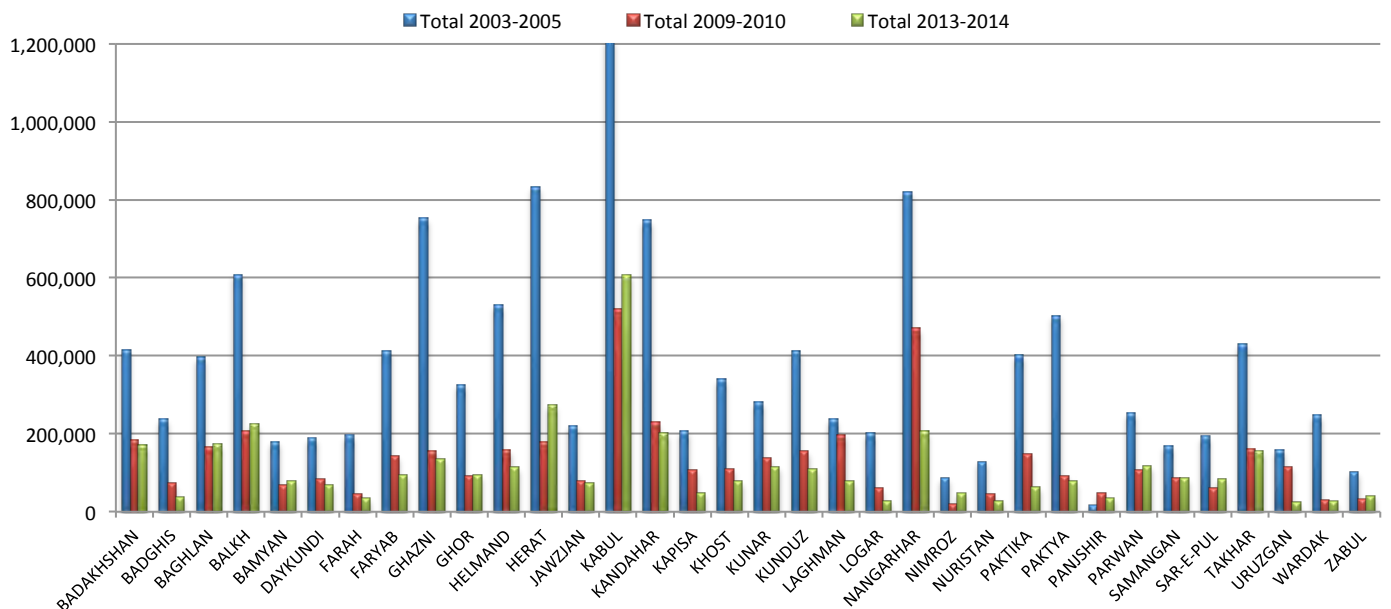

2.2 Comparison of three voter registration phases: 2003/2005, 2009/2010, and 2013/2014.

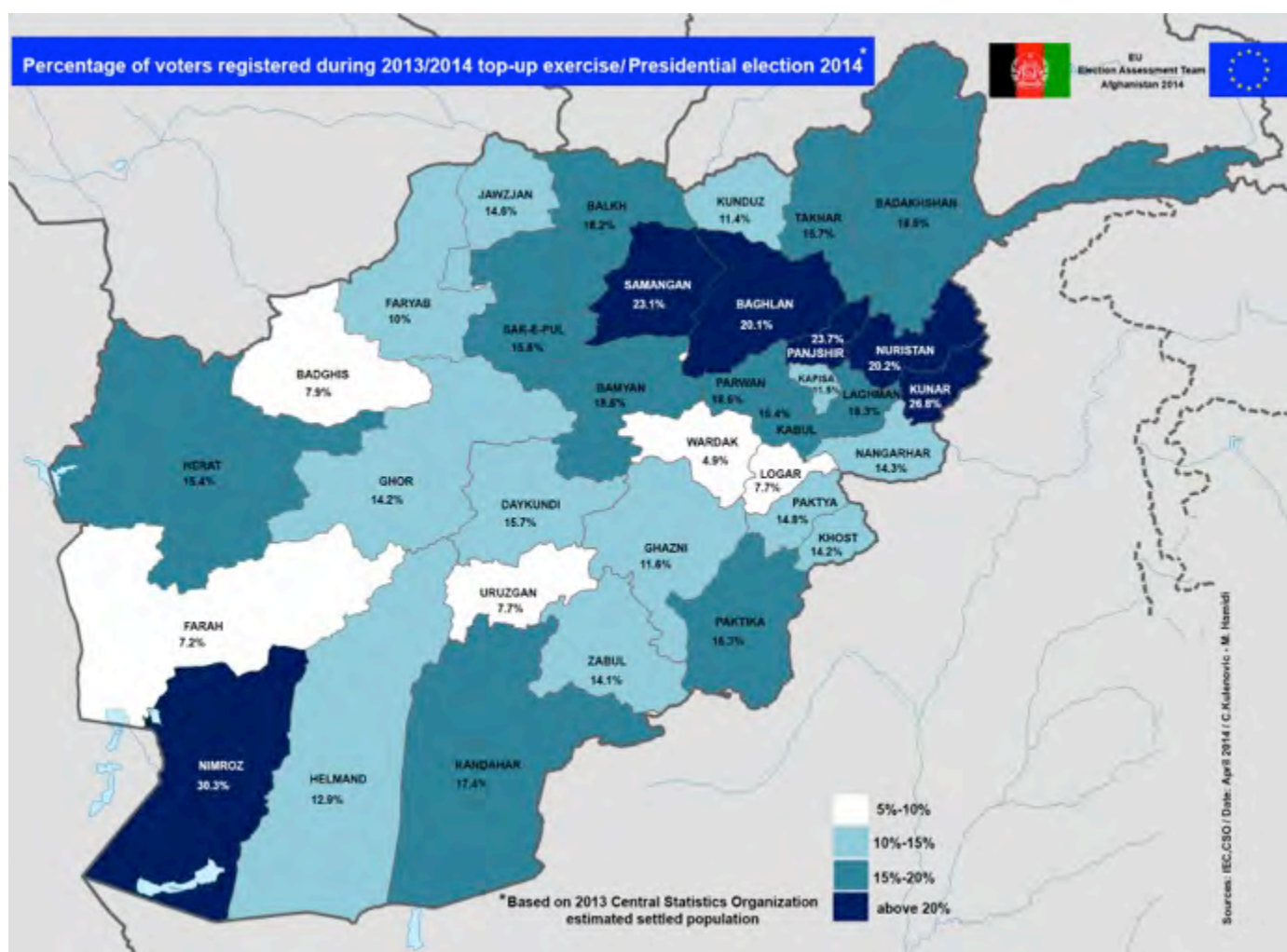

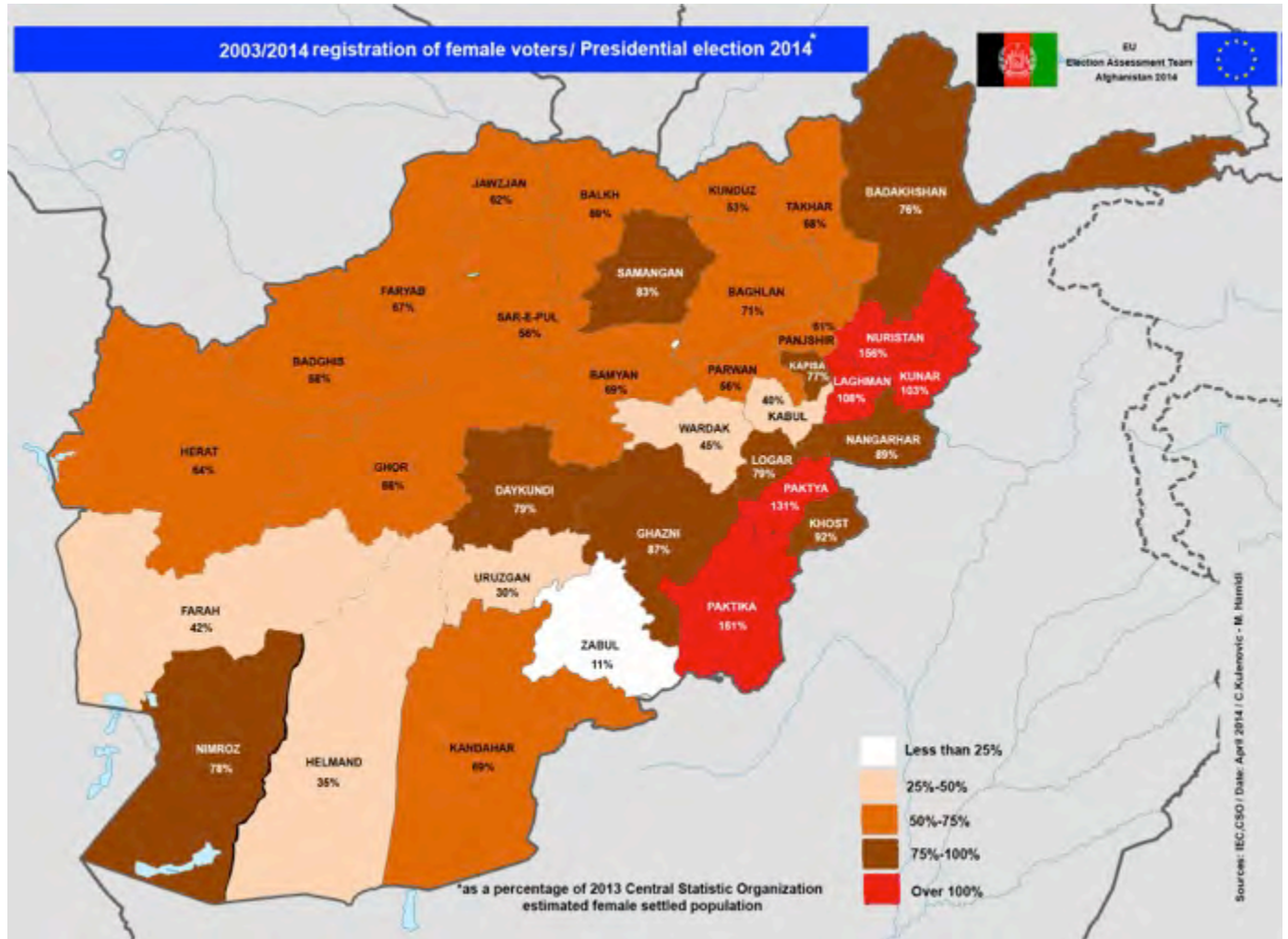

2.4 Percentage of voters registered during the 2013-2014 top-up exercise (out of 2013 CSO estimated settled population)

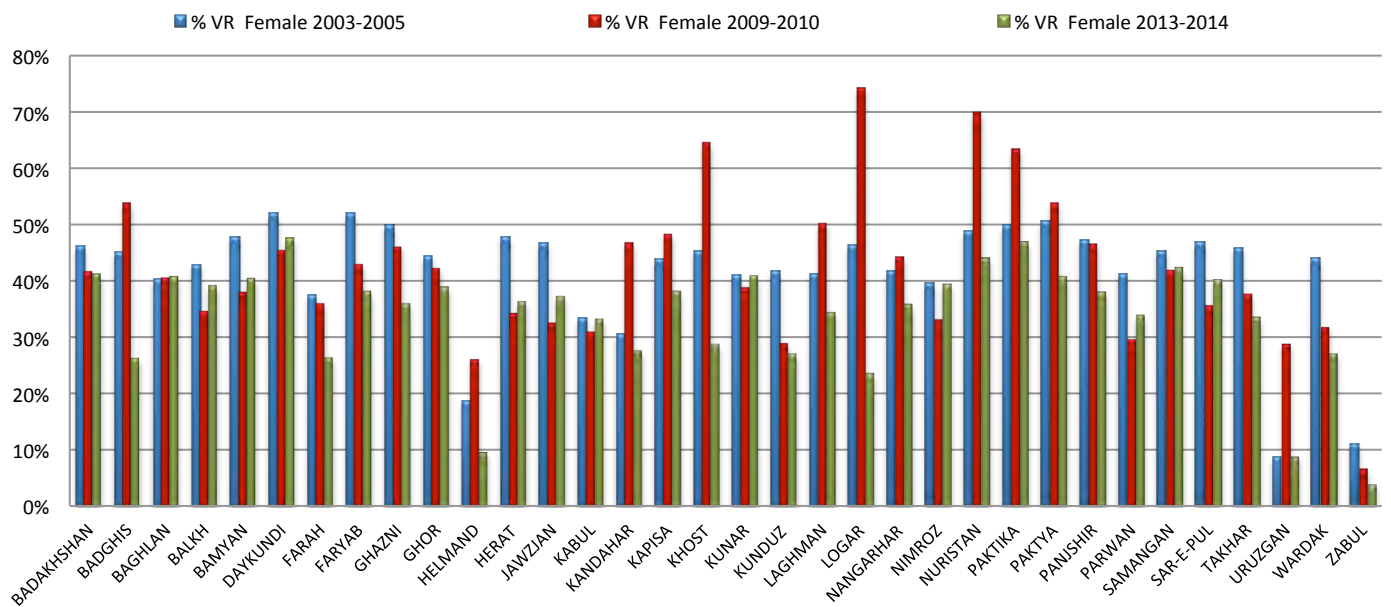

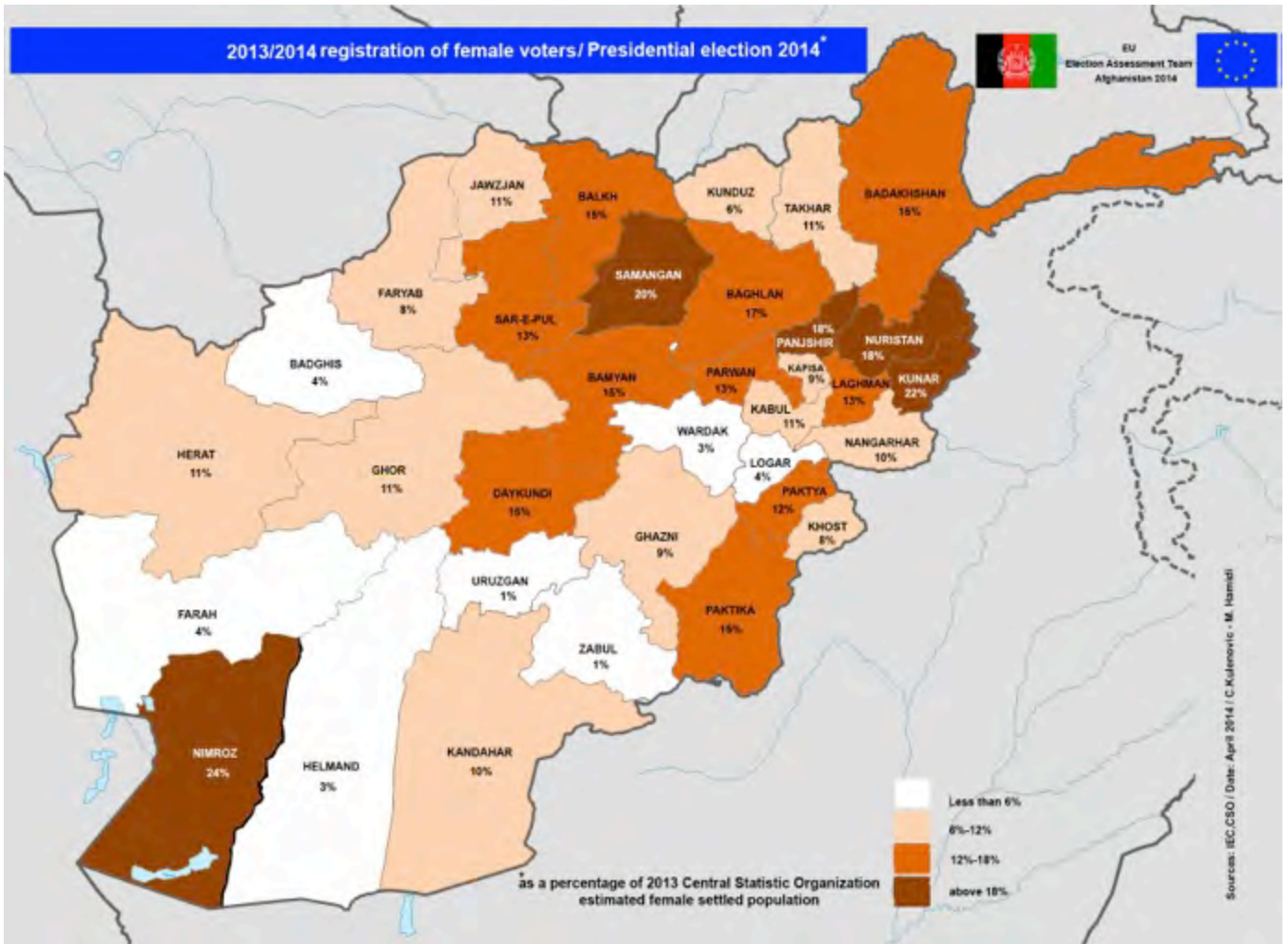
3.1 Women registration from 2003 to 2014 (out of the 2013 CSO estimated female settled population)



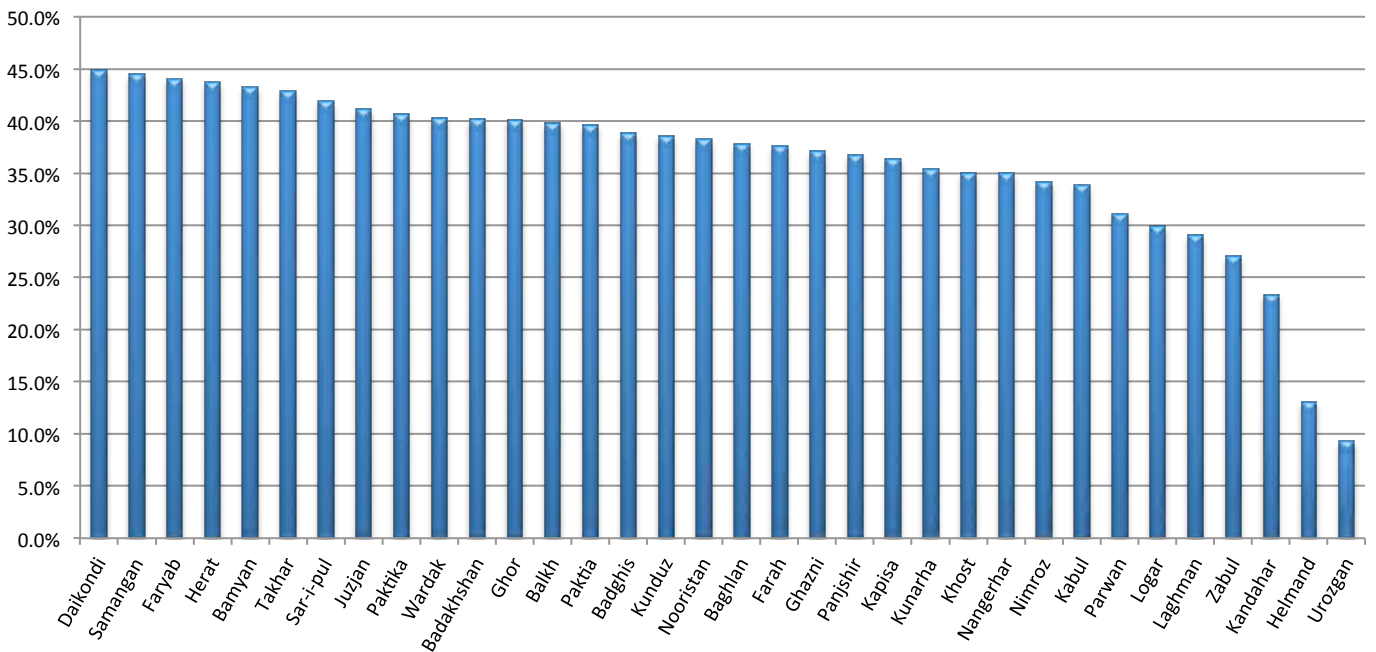
3.2 Women registration – comparison of three voter registration phases (2003/2005, 2009/2010, 2013/2014)



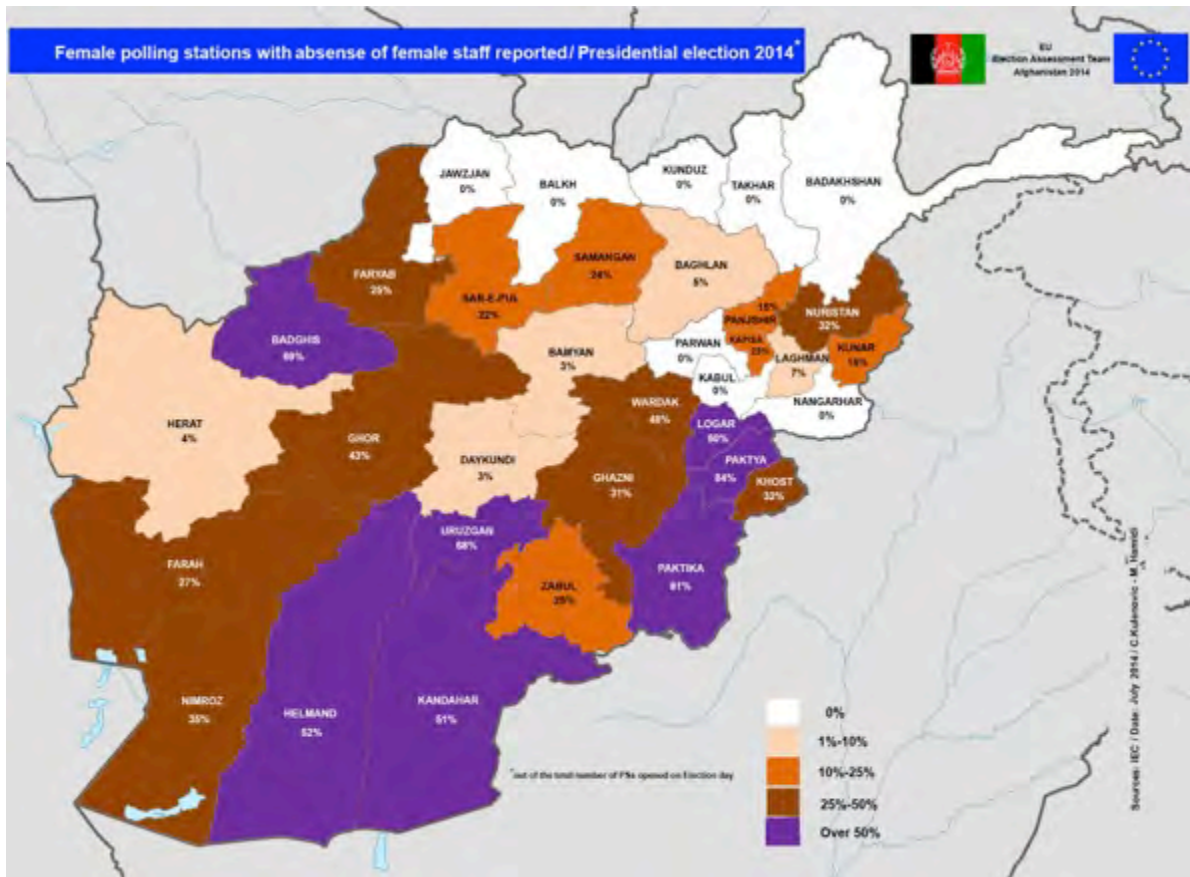
3.3 Women registered during the 2013-2014 top-up exercise (out of the 2013 CSO estimated female settled population)



3.4 Turnout of women in the Presidential election run-off

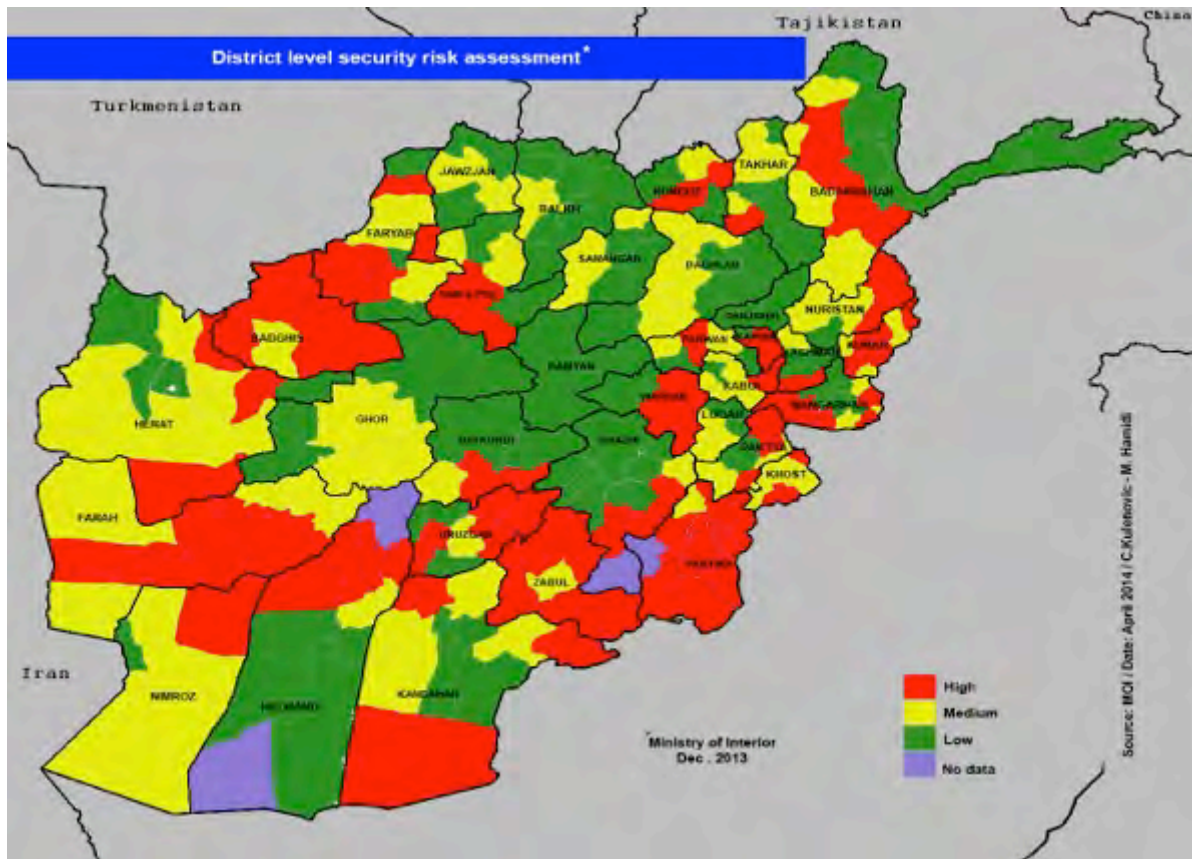


3.5 Female polling stations affected by a lack of female staff in the Presidential run-off

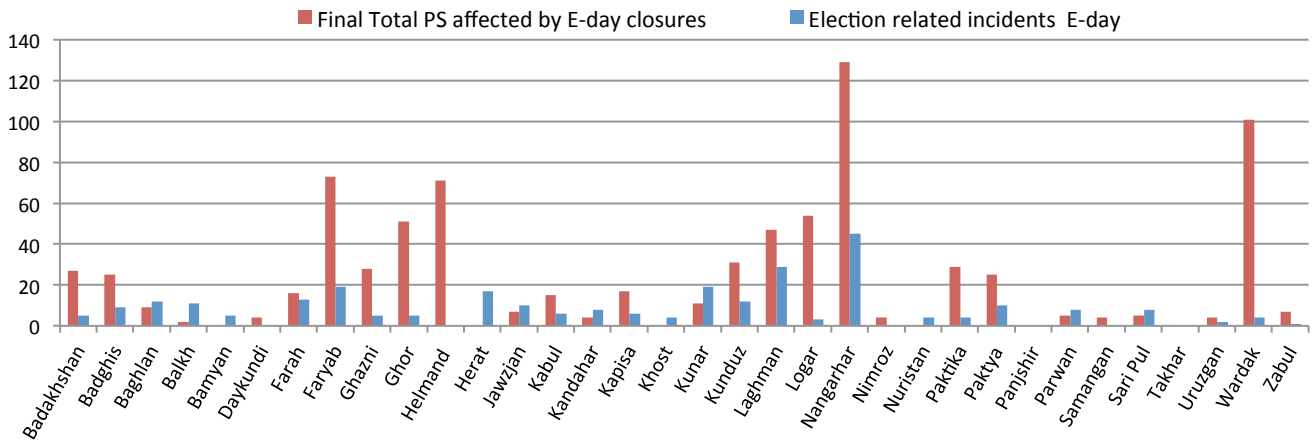

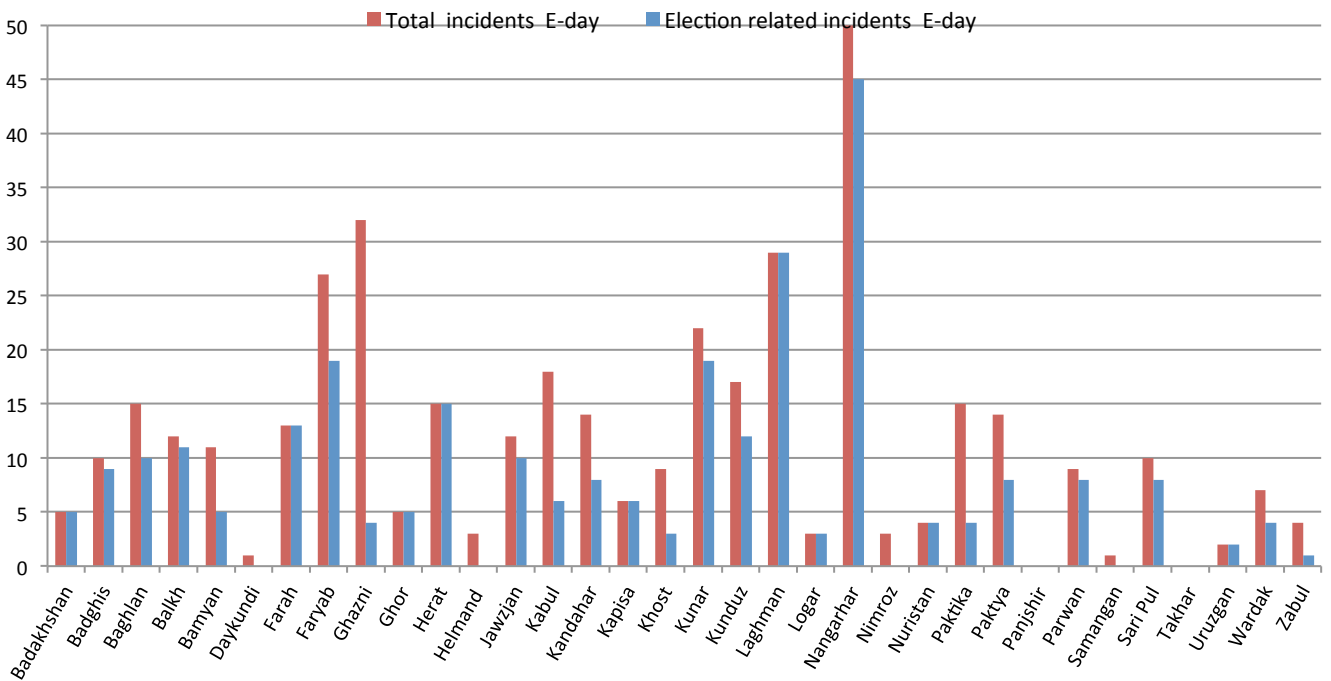
4.1 District level risk assessment (MoI – December 2013)



4.4 Polling stations closed on Election day – compared to the number of election related incidents (first round)

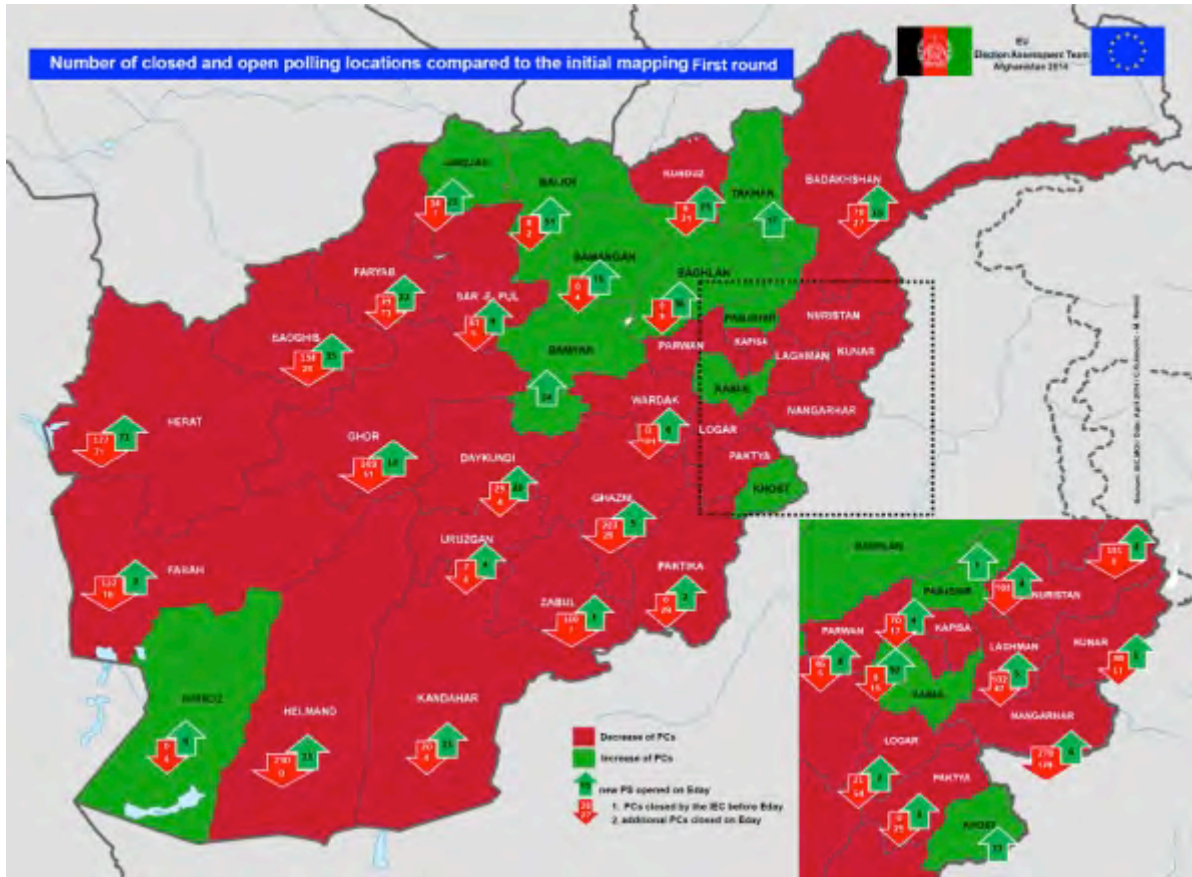


4.5 Total number of incidents– compared to the number of election related incidents (first round)

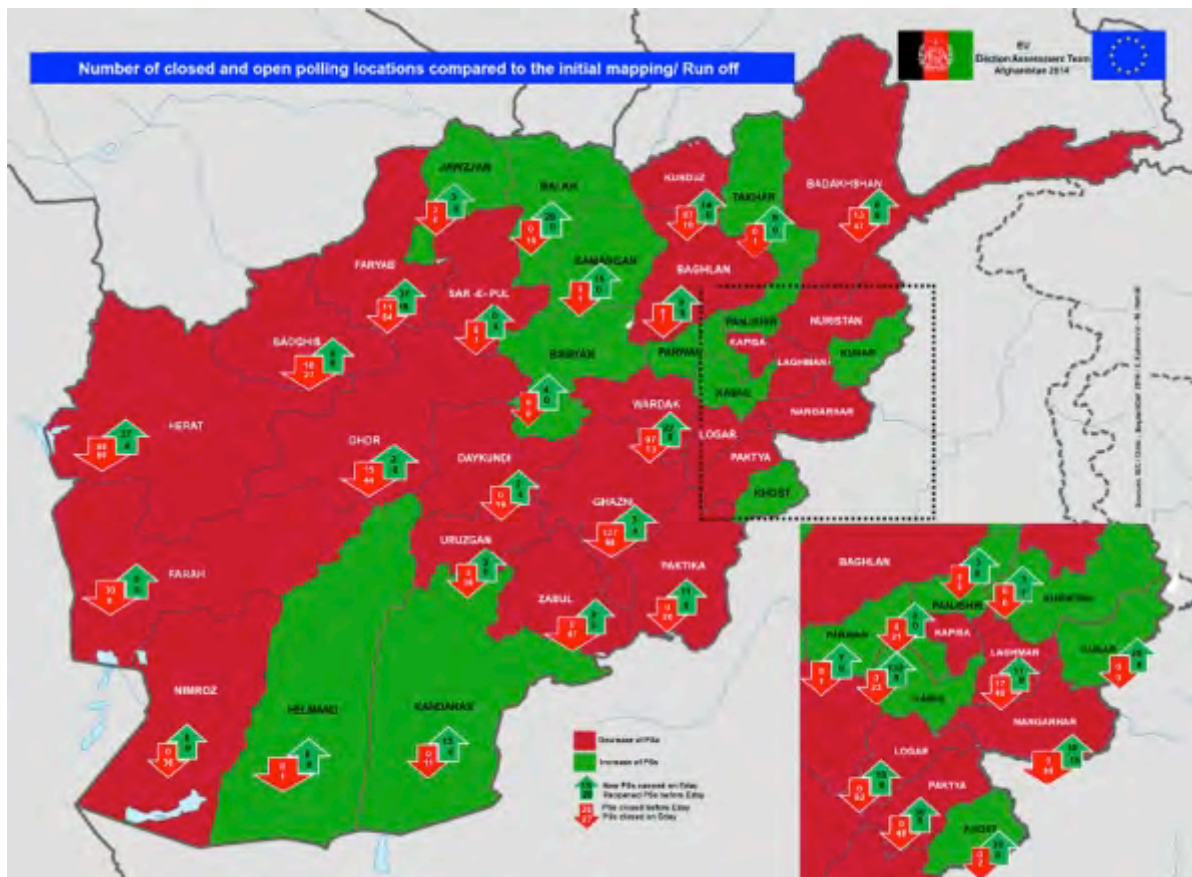

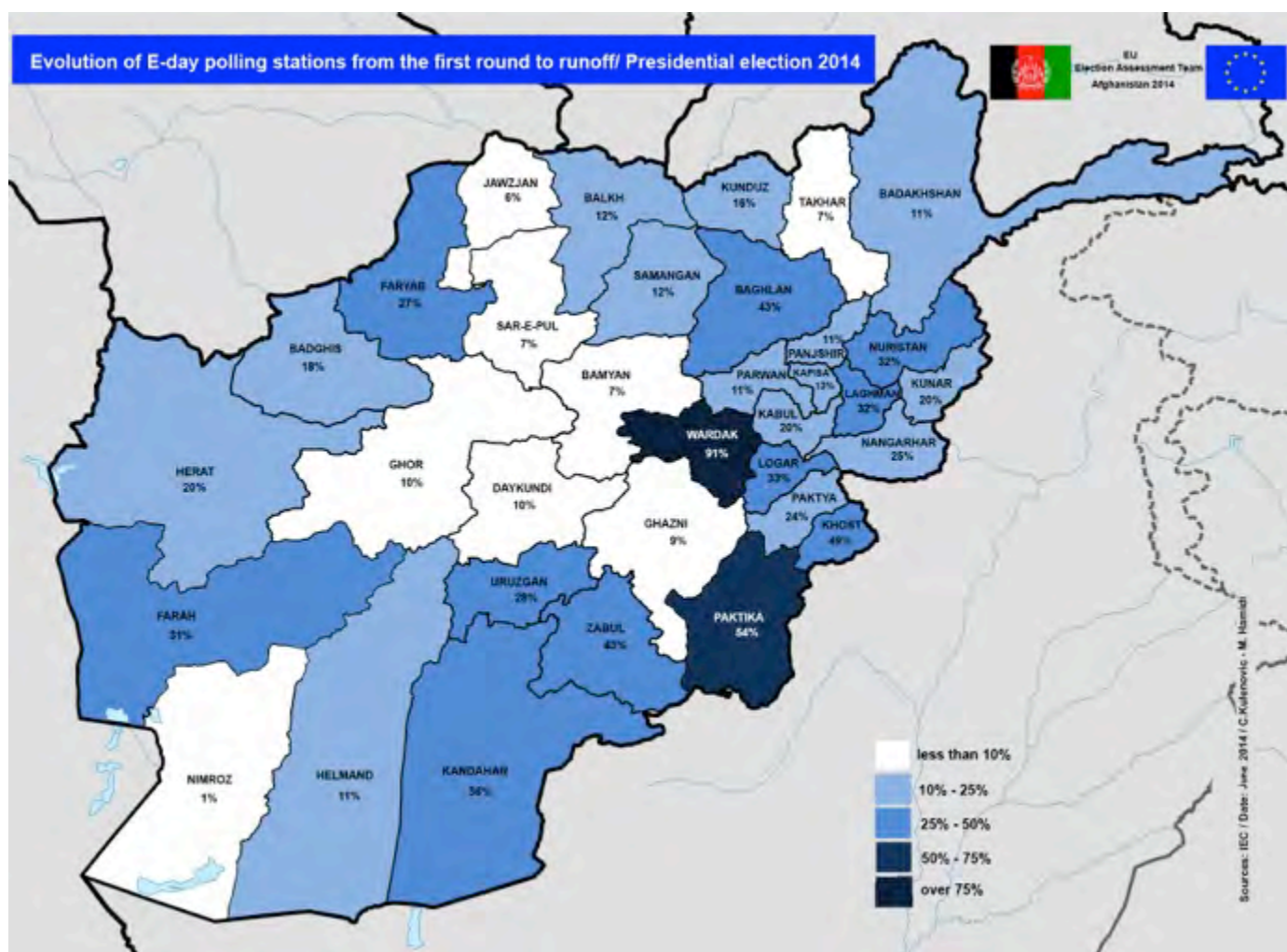
5.1 Polling stations status in comparison with the initial mapping – first round



5.2 Polling stations status in comparison with the initial mapping – run-off

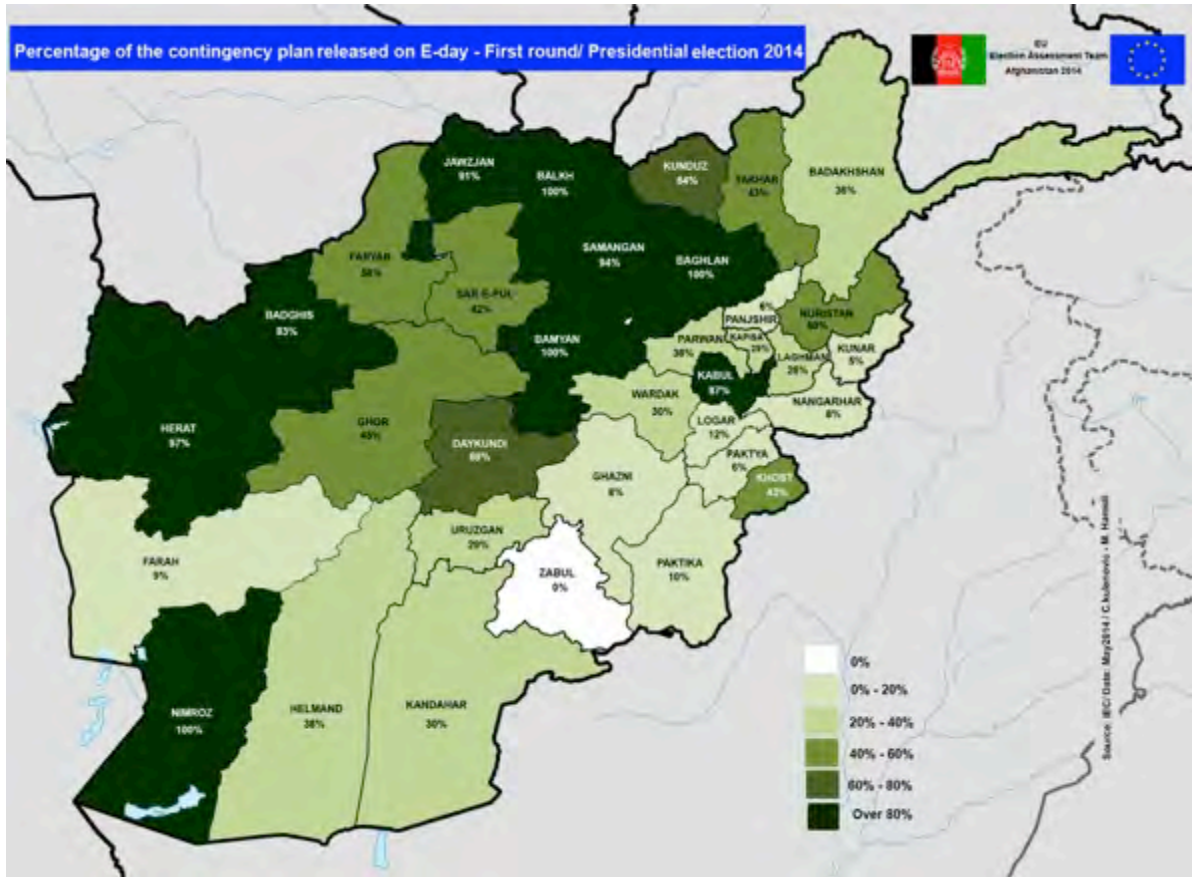


5.3 Evolution of the polling station mapping between the two rounds of the Presidential election

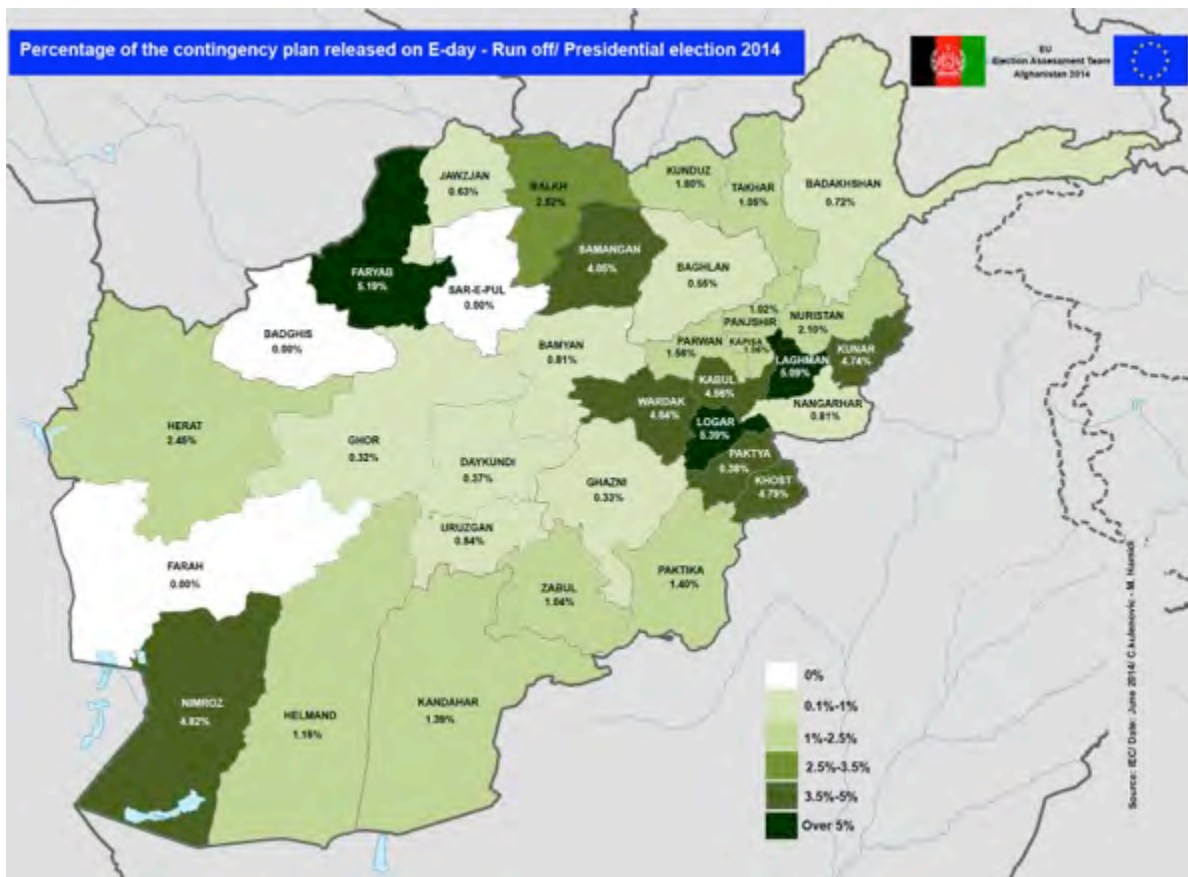

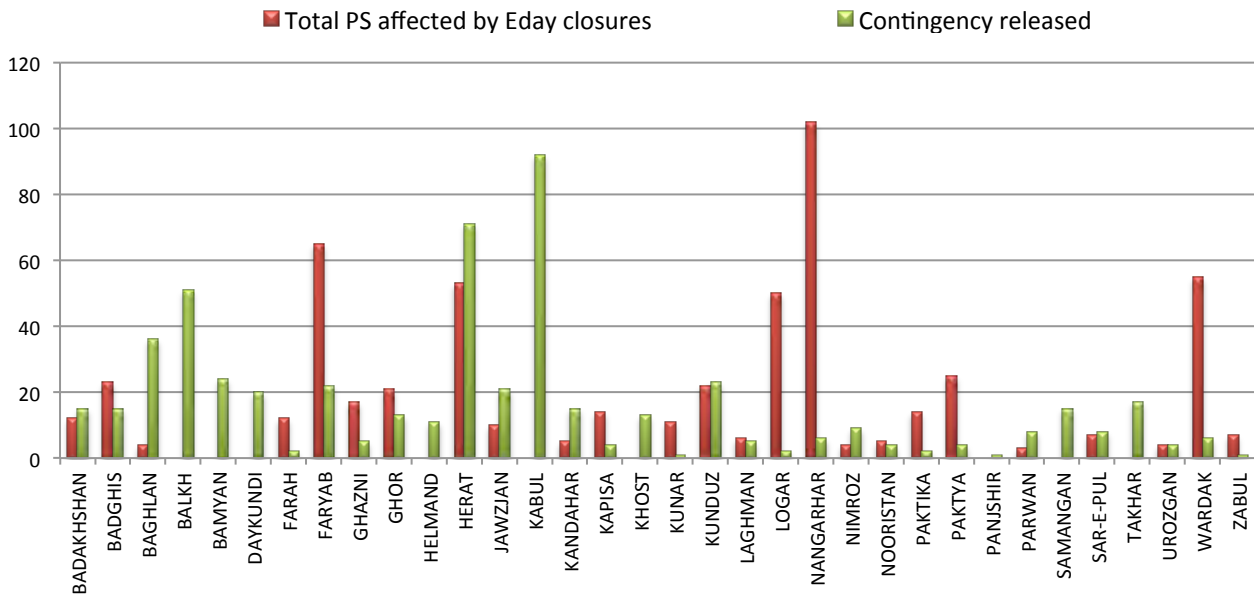
5.4 Contingency kits released (additional PSs opened on Election day) – first round



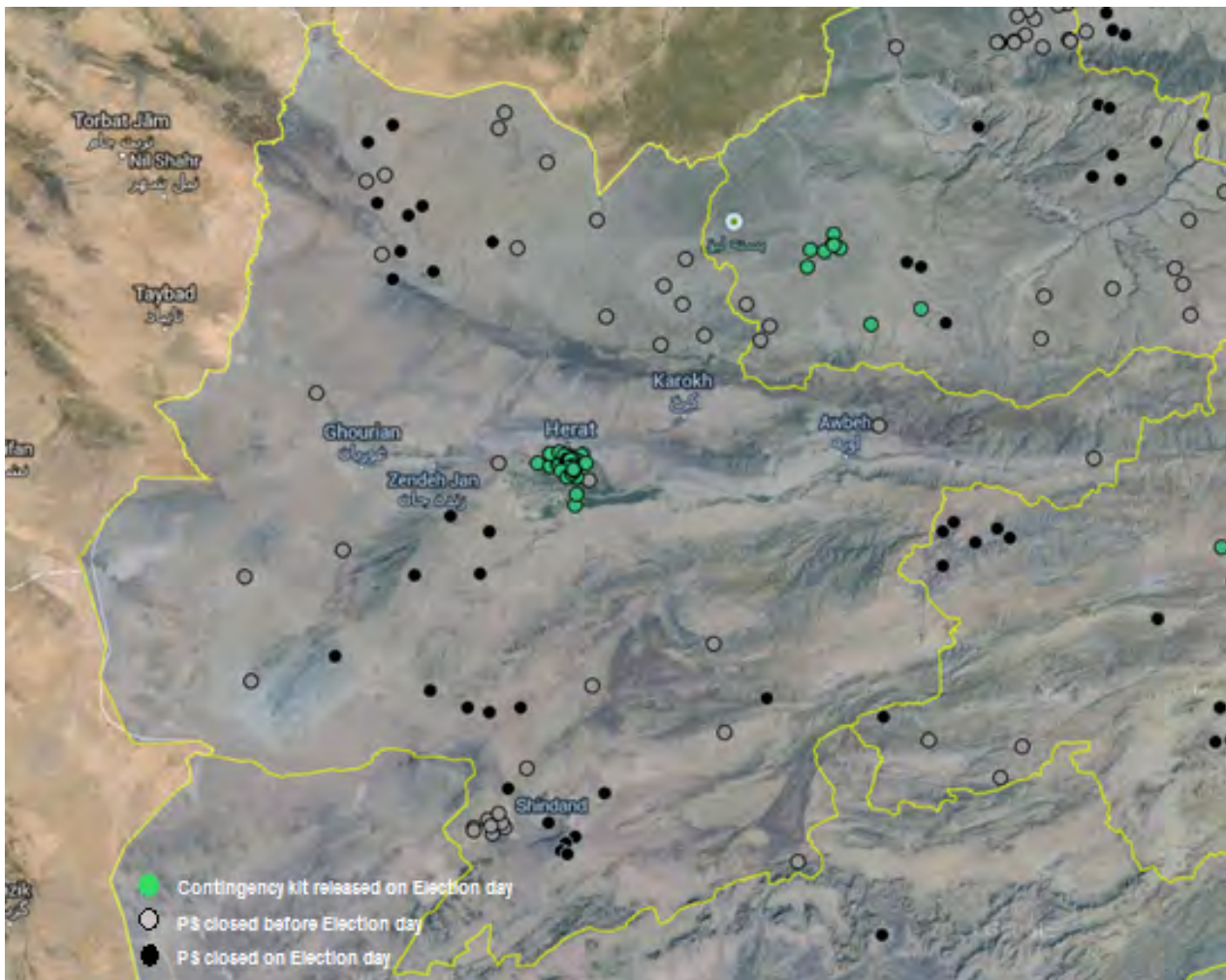
5.5 Contingency kits released (additional PSs opened on Election day) – run-off



5.6 Comparison between the closure of PSs with the contingency kits realised on Election day (first round)



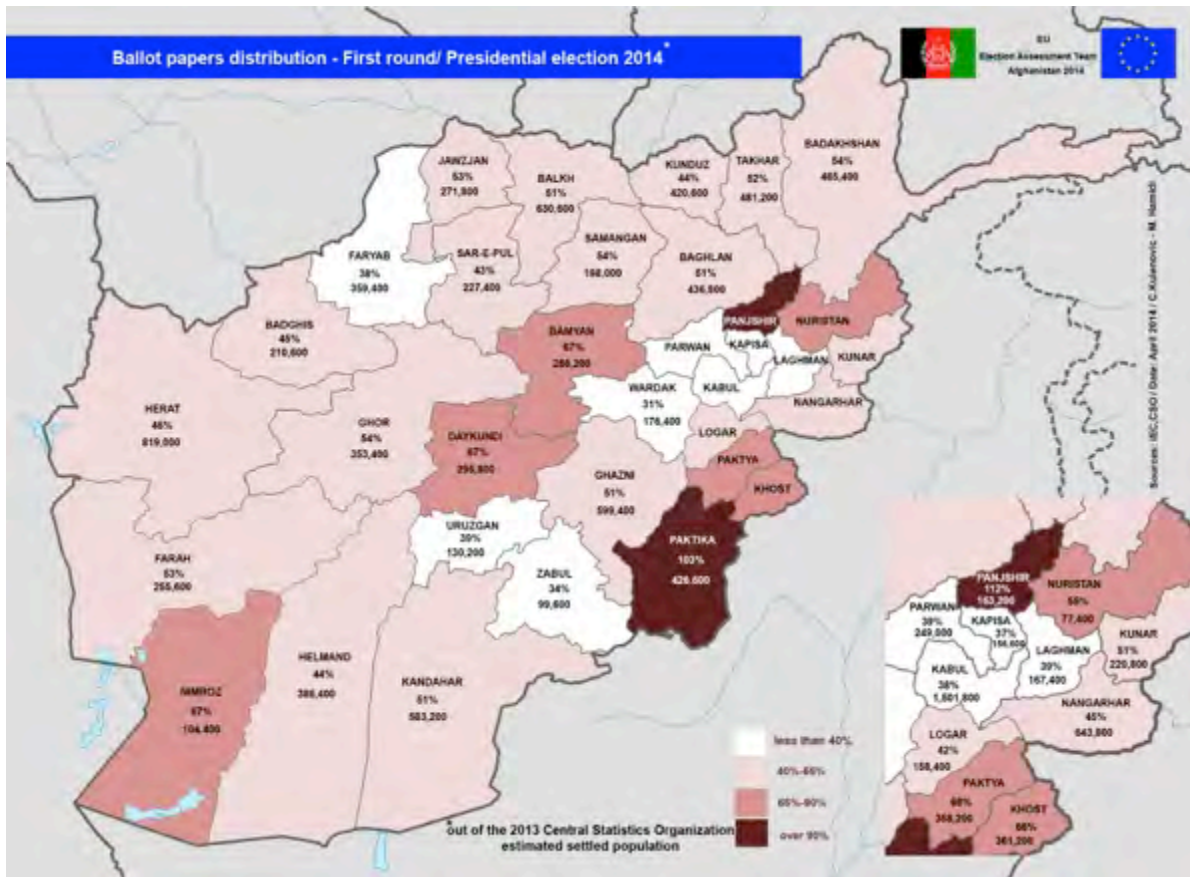
5.7 Herat – distribution of PSs closed before and on Election day with the contingency kits released (First-round)



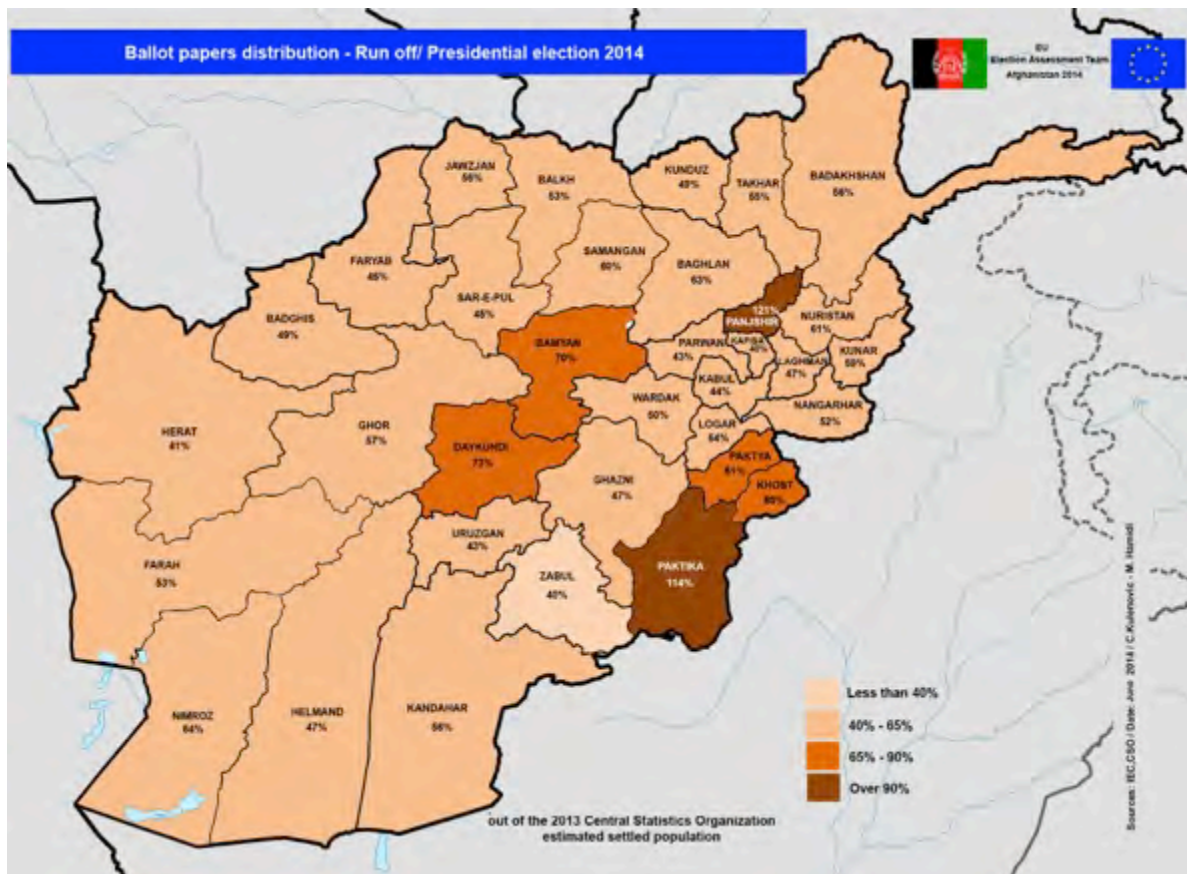

6.1 Ballot paper distribution – first Round

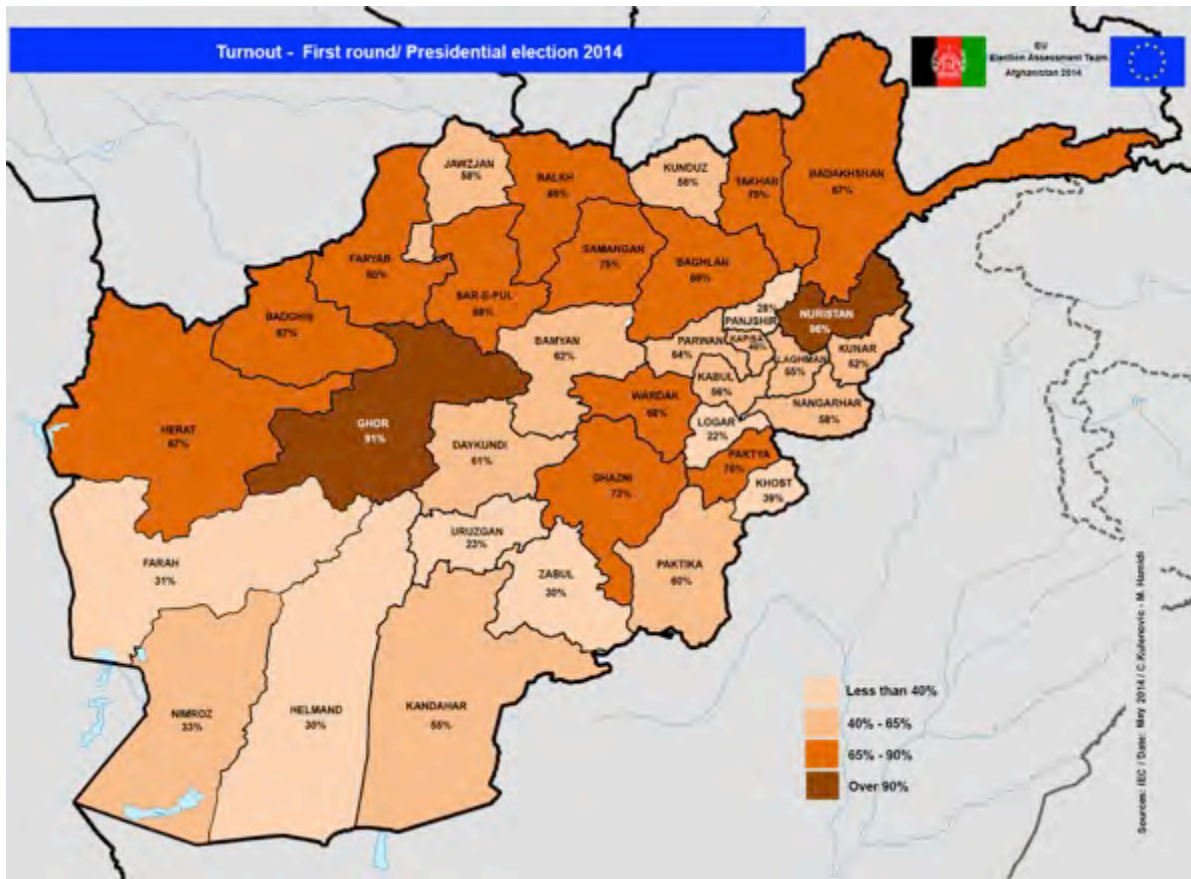


6.2 Ballot paper distribution – run-off

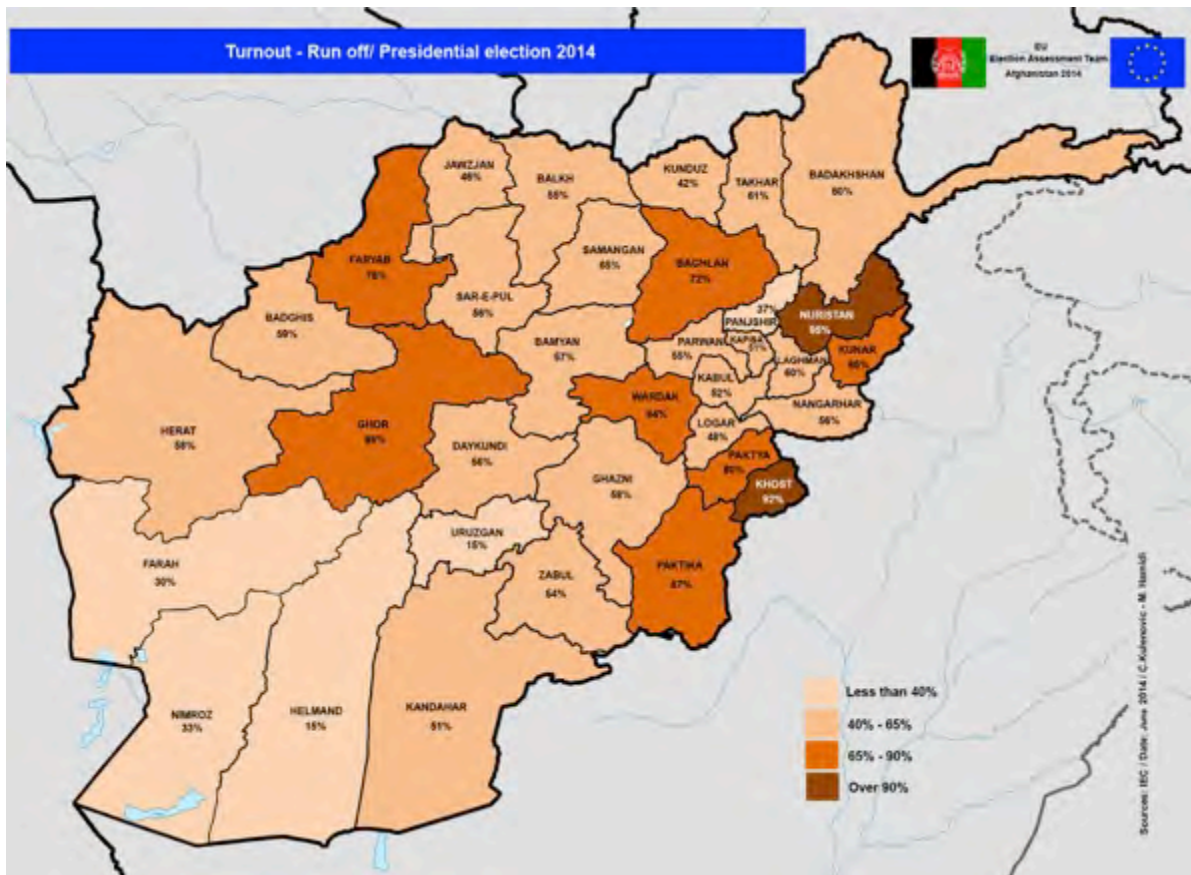

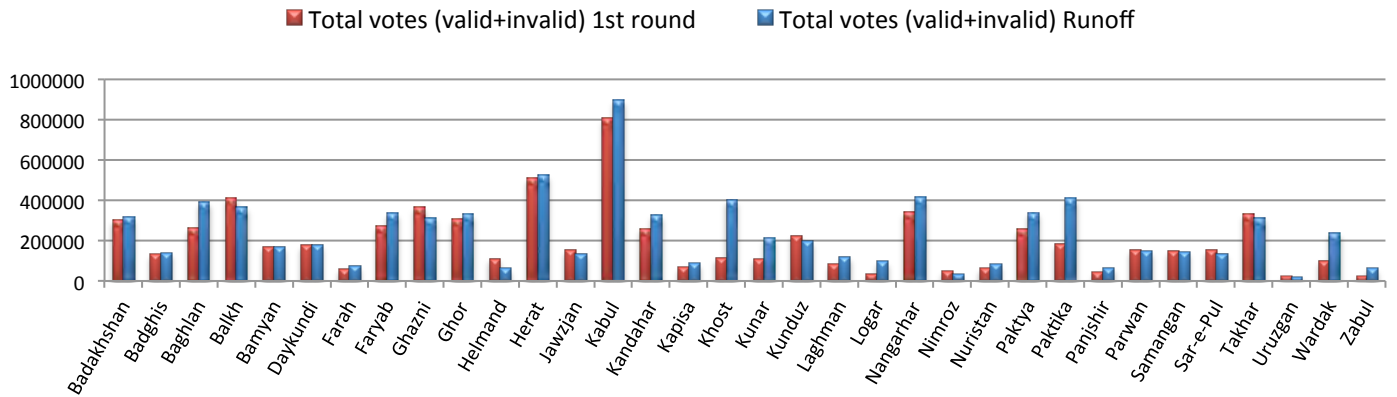

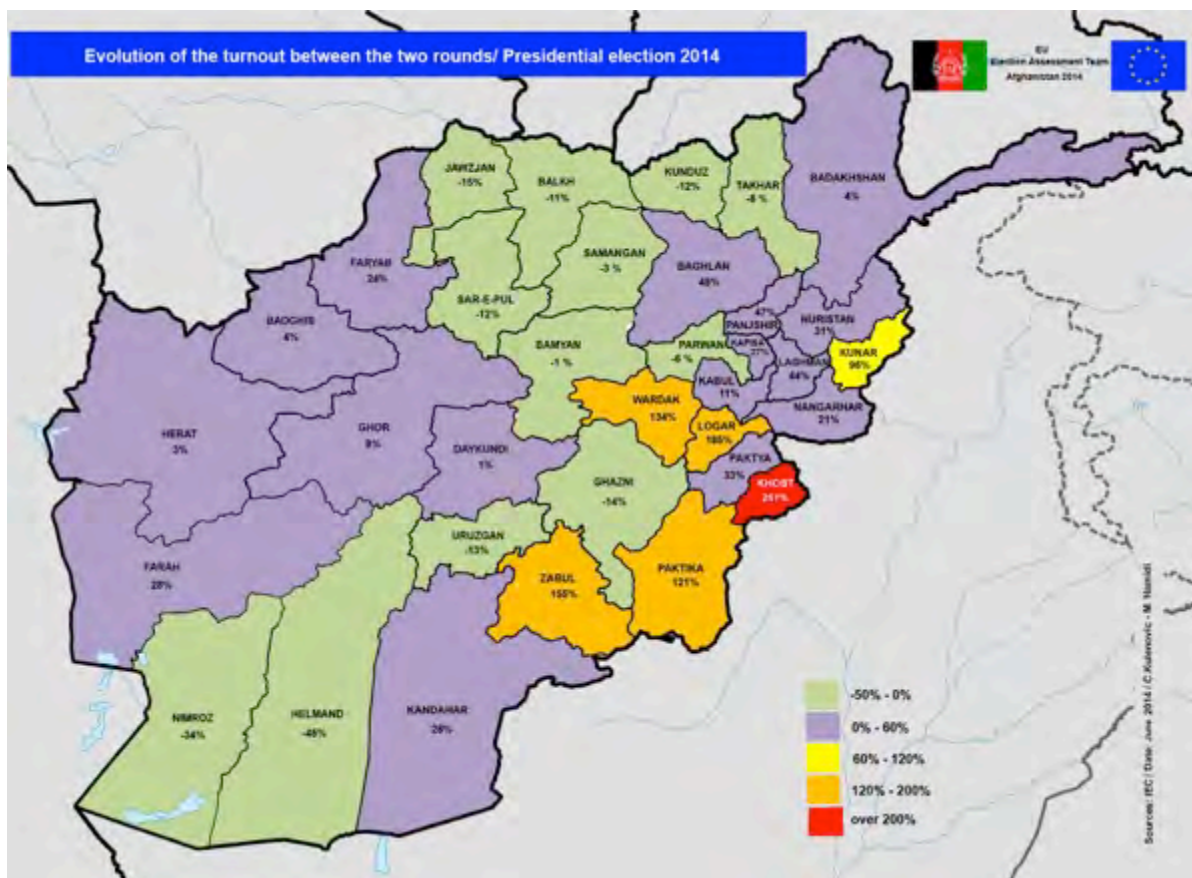

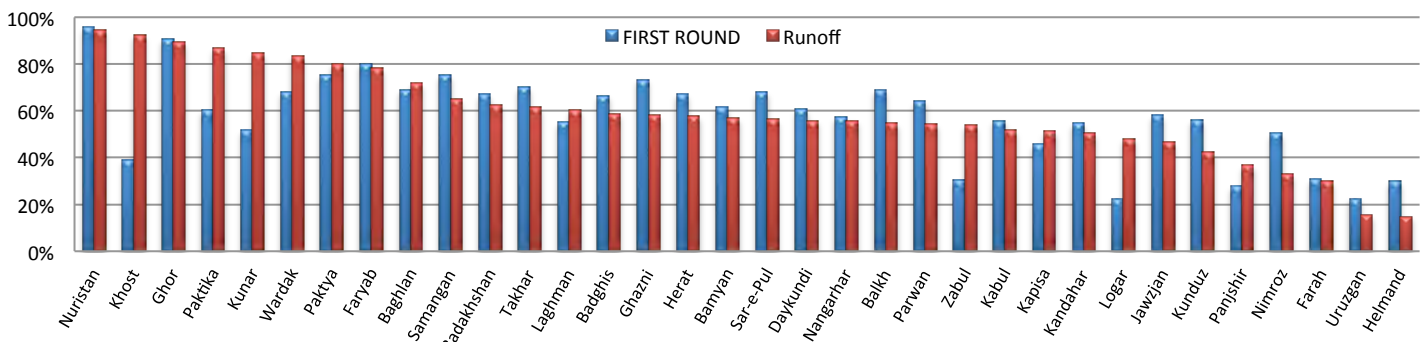
Total number of votes cast per province – comparison first and second rounds of the Presidential election

Ballot papers cast out of the total number of available ballot papers in the polling stations



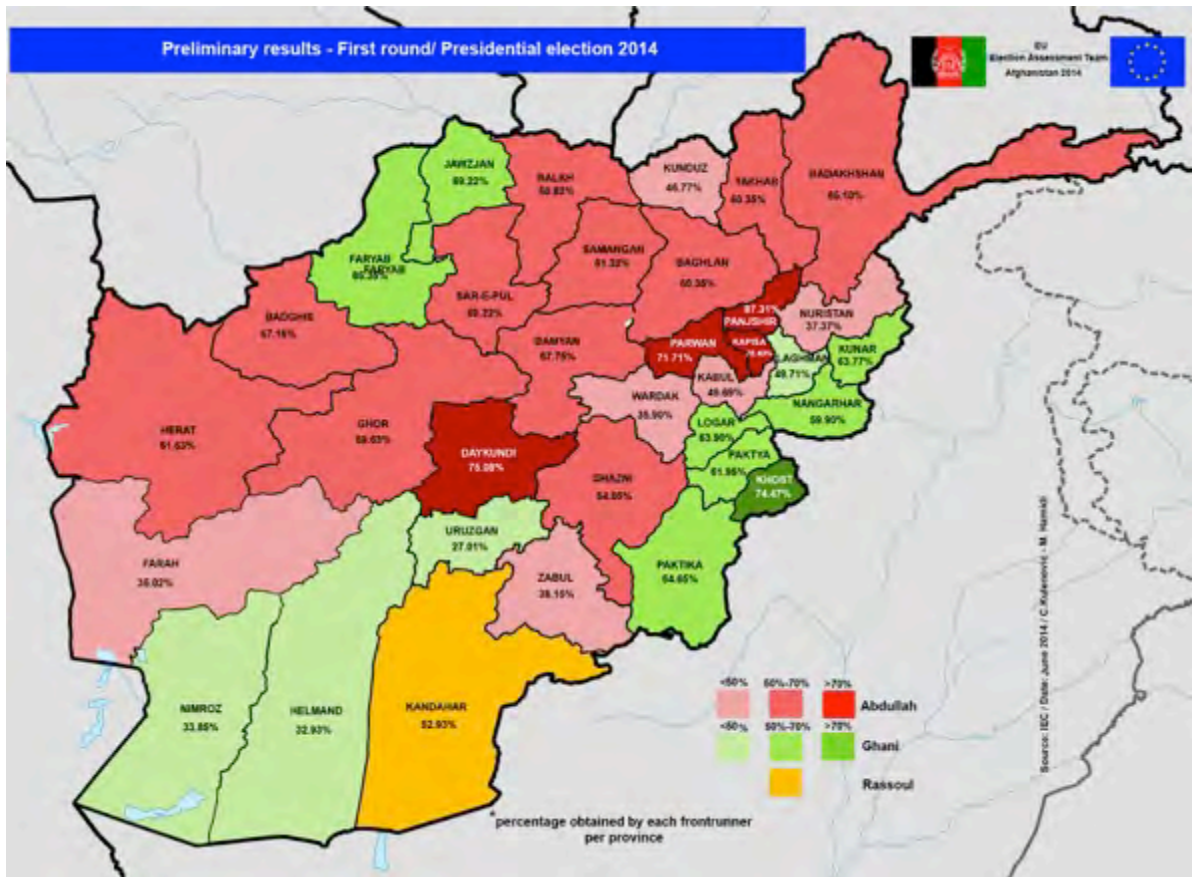

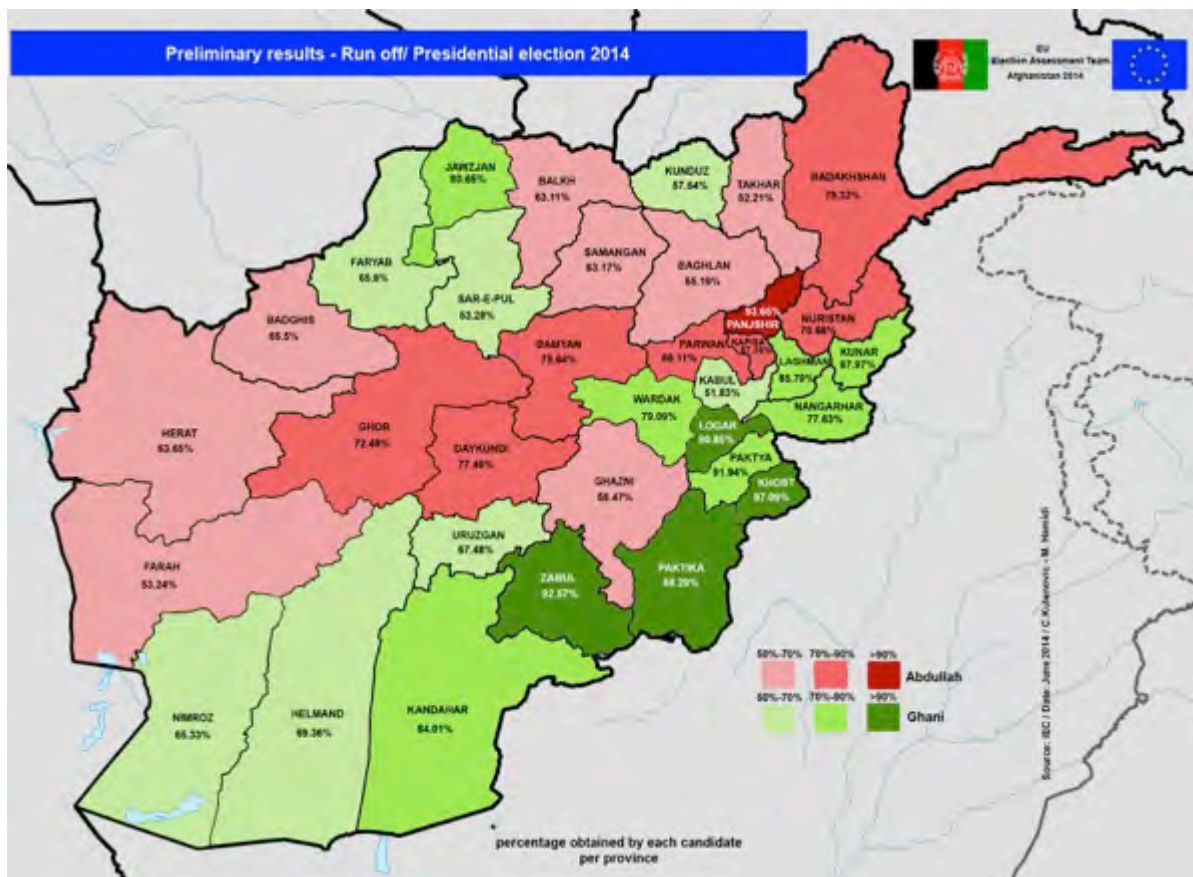

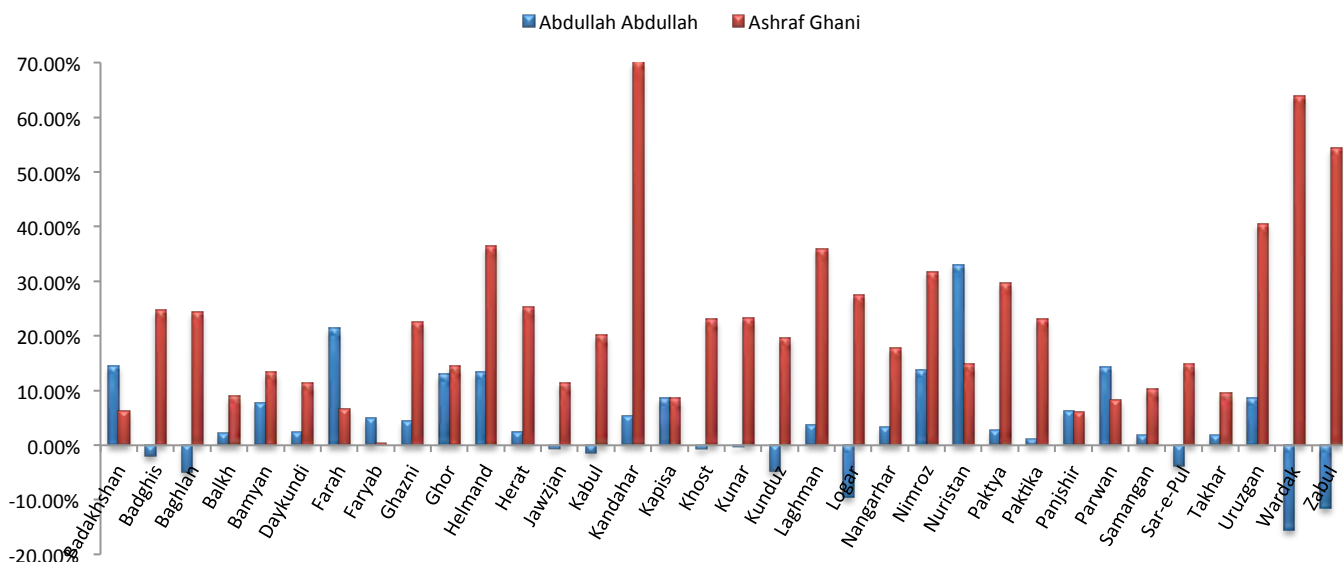
7.6 Preliminary Results per province (percentages of votes obtained by the leading candidate) - first round



7.7 Preliminary Results per province (percentages of votes obtained by the leading candidate) -run-off



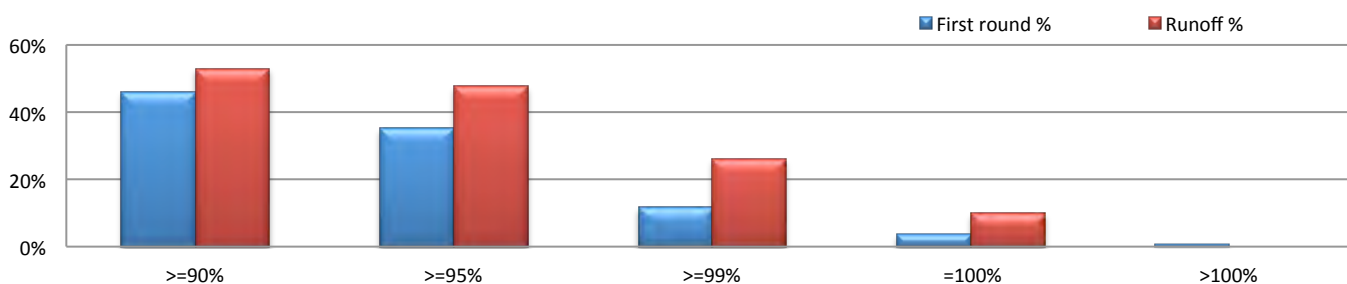
7.8 Evolution of the votes obtained by the two frontrunner between the two rounds of the election



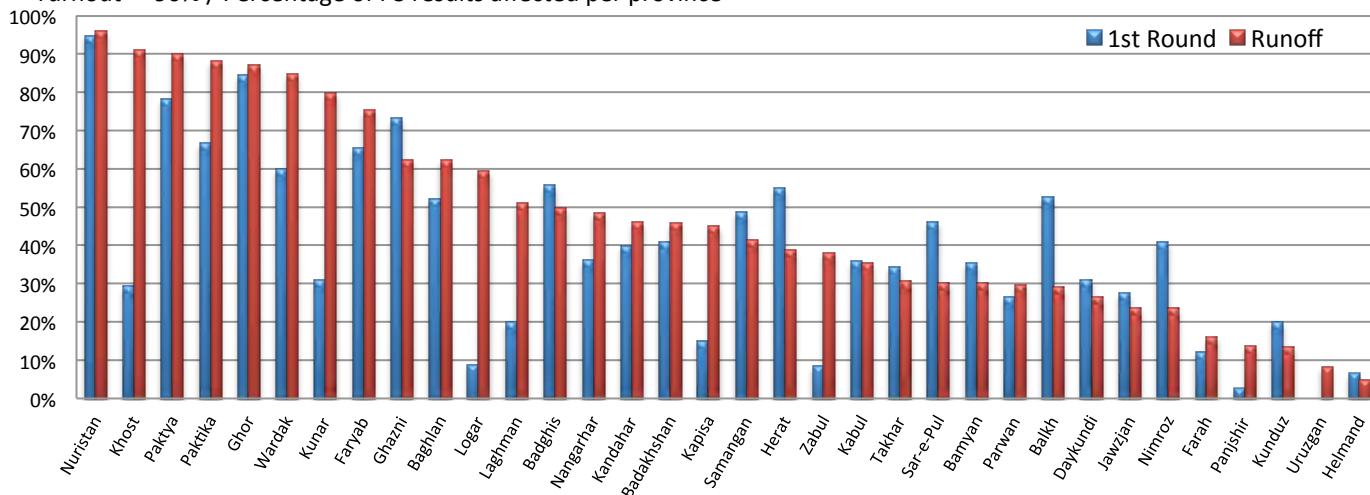

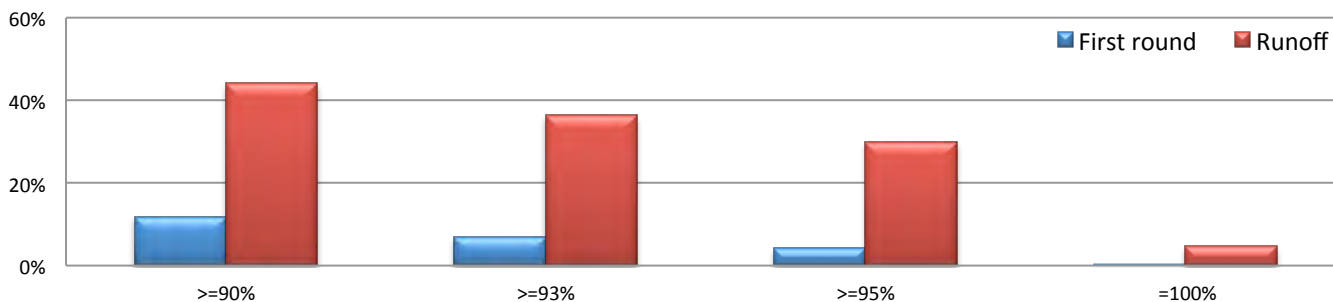


Turnout >=90% / Percentage of PS results affected per province

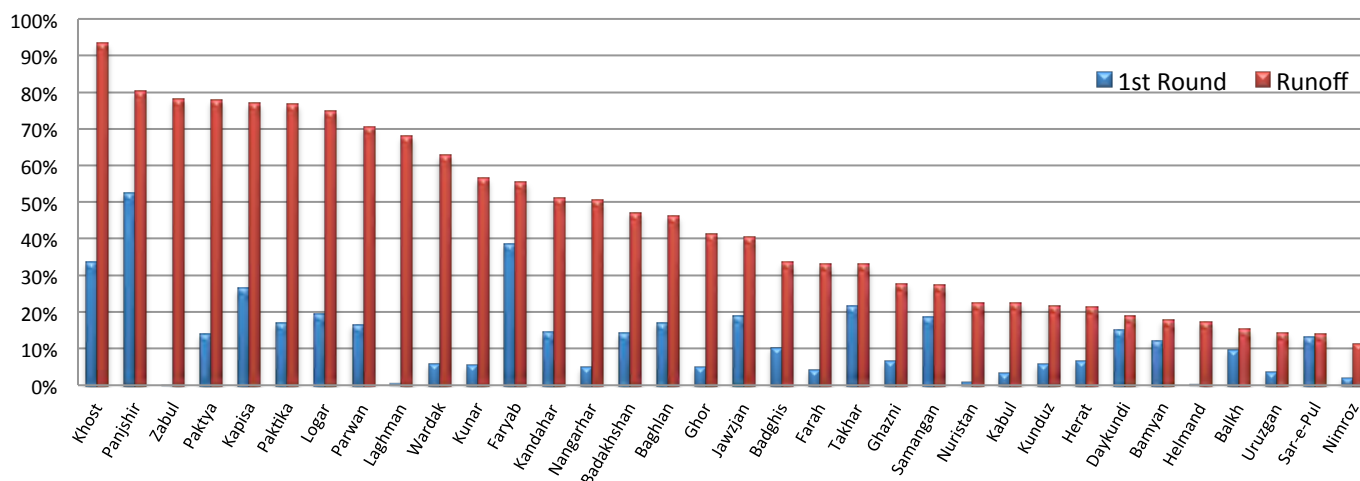

>=90% vote for one candidate / Percentage of PS results affected per province

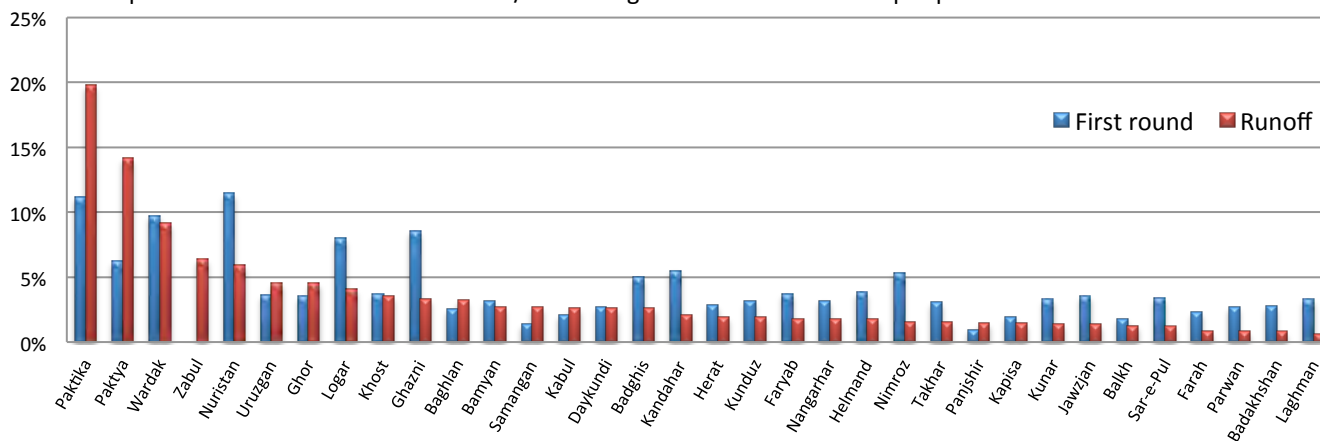


7.9.3 Distribution of the votes by hundreds

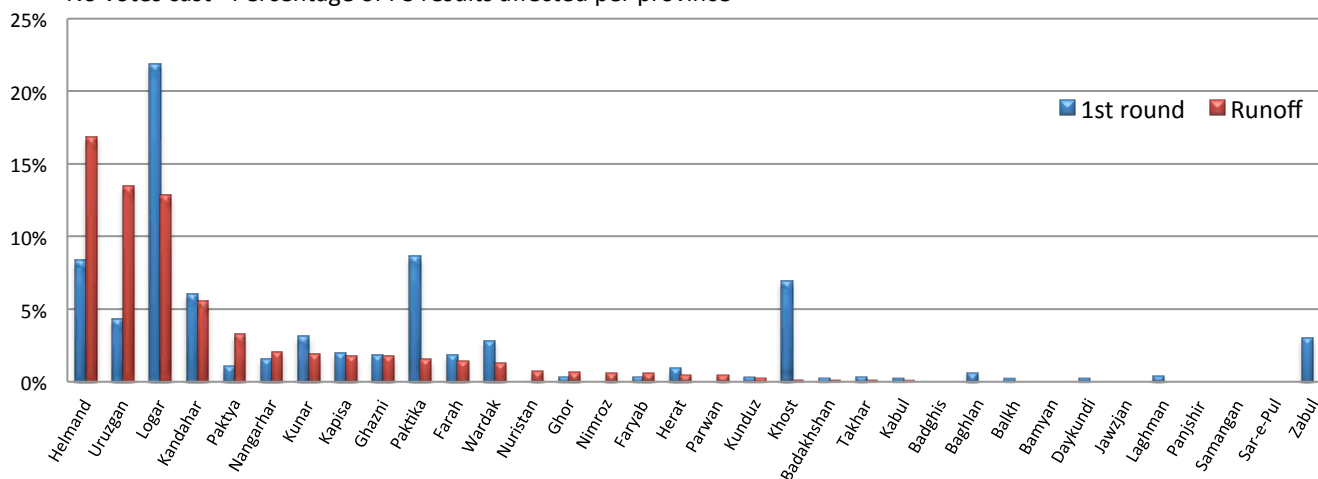
Multiples of hundreds for one candidate / Percentage of PS results affected per province

- The results forms of the PCs that reach the National Tally Centre (NTC) without IEC's TEBs, shall be referred to the Commission for making decision *in contradiction with the IEC Decision endorsed on 15 April amending de facto: "for further transparency of the electoral process, all result forms of the PSs that against the Commission's regulations, procedures and operational guidelines are put inside non-standard envelopes (paper, training, voter registration bags) or TEBs without stamp and signatures of the PS chairpersons and agents should be excluded from counting process"*.
- Results of PSs prepared in ordinary papers instead of results forms arranged by the Commission, shall be deemed void even if signed and stamped by the PS chairperson and agents. The result of PS recorded on a ballot paper shall not be included in counting process and referred to the Commission for decision.
- If results of two PSs have been recorded on one results form, such a case is individually presented to the Commission for decision. In case stamp and signatures of PS chairperson and agents on the mentioned results form are ruined or unseen, the mentioned votes shall be deemed void.
- In case of differences between the votes recorded on result form in numbers and letters, if the number of votes in letters is more than 600, the numbers are to be preferred; otherwise amount in letters shall be preferred.

- Those result forms that have neither been stamped nor signed by chairpersons + nor signed by candidates' agents, shall be audited.
- The PSs, result forms of which have neither been stamped nor signed by chairpersons, shall be audited;

- In case a result form has only been stamped or only signed by the chairperson and by one candidate's agent, the PS shall be audited.
- In case a result form has only been stamped or only signed by the chairperson and not signed by candidates' agents, the PS shall be audited.
- Those result forms that have neither been stamped nor stamped by chairpersons and also nor signed by candidates' agents and at the meanwhile they have cross outs, not having been corrected with a red pen, the PSs shall be audited and recounted.

Audit 2:

- PS results showing 599 and 600 votes cast.

Recounts

- If the number of blank, void, wasted and used ballot papers exceeds 600, the PSs shall be recounted with accepting 1% flexibility.
- The PSs, whose results forms are stamped and signed by at least two agents, while not signed by the PS chairperson, has no problem and shall not be audited and recounted. However, if a result form is not signed by agents, votes of the mentioned PS shall be audited and recounted.
- Inattention to filling out a result form that indicates wrong figures in terms of calculation.
- When the total number of the ballots used exceeds the total number of the ballots allocated to the relevant station and centre.
- If the number of votes cast in a female station differs significantly from the number of votes cast in a male station in a centre.

- Result forms in which figures and letters have cross outs and in accordance with procedure not corrected with a red pen, shall be recounted. In case letters have no cross out, they shall be processed.
- In case total of votes recorded on a result form for both candidates is more than 600, the mentioned station shall be recounted.
- In case votes of more than one PS have been recorded on one result form, votes of both PSs shall be segregated and recounted.

- 20 ballots are not marked in accordance with the procedure.

- If the IECC receives a complaint or information and asks for a recount to clarify the issue.
- If a candidate requests for a recount and the IEC and IECC approve the request.

- Ballot papers from a different PS within the same PC. Recount for each PS.
- 20 or more marked ballot papers are not detached from the stub.
- 20 or more ballot papers without a verification stamp.
- 20 or more ballot papers not marked according to procedure.

- Decision on 16 August 2014: with reference to the question 16 of the audit checklist, the IEC will approve recounts of those 6,000 ballot boxes which the two campaign teams have identified for special scrutiny.
- Audit Committee agreement on 8 August: 10 or more invalid votes are found in the votes cast.
- Audit Committee agreement on 8 August: 10 or more votes cast are found in the votes of the other candidate.
- Audit Committee agreement on 15 August: in the case the same voter card number is lodged 10 times or more in the voter list.
- Audit Committee agreement on 15 August: in the case the same voter card number is lodged 10 times or more in the voter list with one digit difference.

Invalidation of votes (partial invalidations):

- In case, the candidate and or his/her first degree relatives take possession of the electoral materials and ballot boxes with force in a way that others cannot make use of them.
- Use of fire arms or injuring tools in order to gain benefit or to disrupt the electoral process.
- Existence of evidence in regard to offering or giving bribe;
- Using the voting cards of other persons collectively, in the absence of the holders of the cards.

Audit 1:

- Votes of the PSs, ballot boxes of which are not those that have been taken into consideration by IEC for 2014 presidential and provincial councils' elections, shall be invalidated.
- All marked ballot papers not plucked from stubs shall be invalidated.
- All ballot papers that have no confirmation stamp on their backs shall be invalidated.
- In case ballot papers have not been marked in accordance with the procedure, only the mentioned ballots shall be invalidated.

- The marked ballot papers are not detached from the stub.
- Marked ballot papers without verification stamps.

- Similarly marked ballots: 15% of all obviously similarly marked ballots per station will be included into the vote count process, distributed in proportion to respective votes of the two candidates. All other obviously similarly marked ballots will be excluded from the count. The 15% of ballots will not apply in the case where all votes in the entire box are excluded as per conditions for invalidation of the results.
- In the case of 20 ballot papers or more with identical or significant patterns of same markings, these votes are invalidated; criteria completed on 5 August, introduction of a UN guideline including 5 cumulative criteria: i) similar shape of the mark, ii) similar size of the mark, iii) same location of the marks, iv) identical handwriting style, and v) same colour and type of ink; criteria modified on 8 August (audit committee) in the case of

20 ballot papers or more from one identical pattern of same markings, these votes are invalidated; criteria modified on 13 August (audit committee), in the case of 20 ballot papers or more from two patterns or more of 10 or more each or from a single pattern showing 20 or more similar markings, these votes should be invalidated.

Instances of invalidation of all votes of a Polling station (total invalidations):

- Marking of one hundred ballot papers with one marker;
- Unfolded ballot papers in favour of a candidate.
- Ballot papers marked in favour of a candidate, but not torn off from the stub.
- Similar or identical tick marks on the ballot papers, with 1 % of tolerance.
- The ballot box is not sealed, or is intentionally damaged.
- In case the reports of the provincial electoral commissions, DFCs, Candidates, agents and observers are proved to be true in regard to the existence of irregularities, intimidation and beatenning of the electoral staff by the candidates and or their supporters.
- Marking of the ballot papers contrary to the regulations of the Commission.
- The back of the ballot papers are not stamped;
- Interference of irrelevant persons in the electoral process within the PC or PS.
- In case the female PSs have beyond the limits the most casted votes compared to the male PS in the same centre.
- Falsification in the result form, in which the entered number of votes and the reconciliation part of the form has been intentionally changed in favour of a candidate.
- Entry of results on any other type of paper, except for the results form prepared by the Commission.
- Evidence of adding votes of candidates who have withdrawn or of other candidates in favour of another candidate.
- Any other instances, that the Commission while providing justified legal reasons count them as a fraud.

Added criteria for invalidation on 23 April 2014:

- A box containing ballots other than the boxes prepared by the Commission;
- If ballots are not marked according to relevant procedures.

Audit 1:

- In case result of vote counting of a PS has been recorded on white sheet.

Audit 2:

Added criteria for invalidation on 5 July 2014:

- The votes all PSs that as result of recounting were found to be more than 600 votes, must be invalidated.

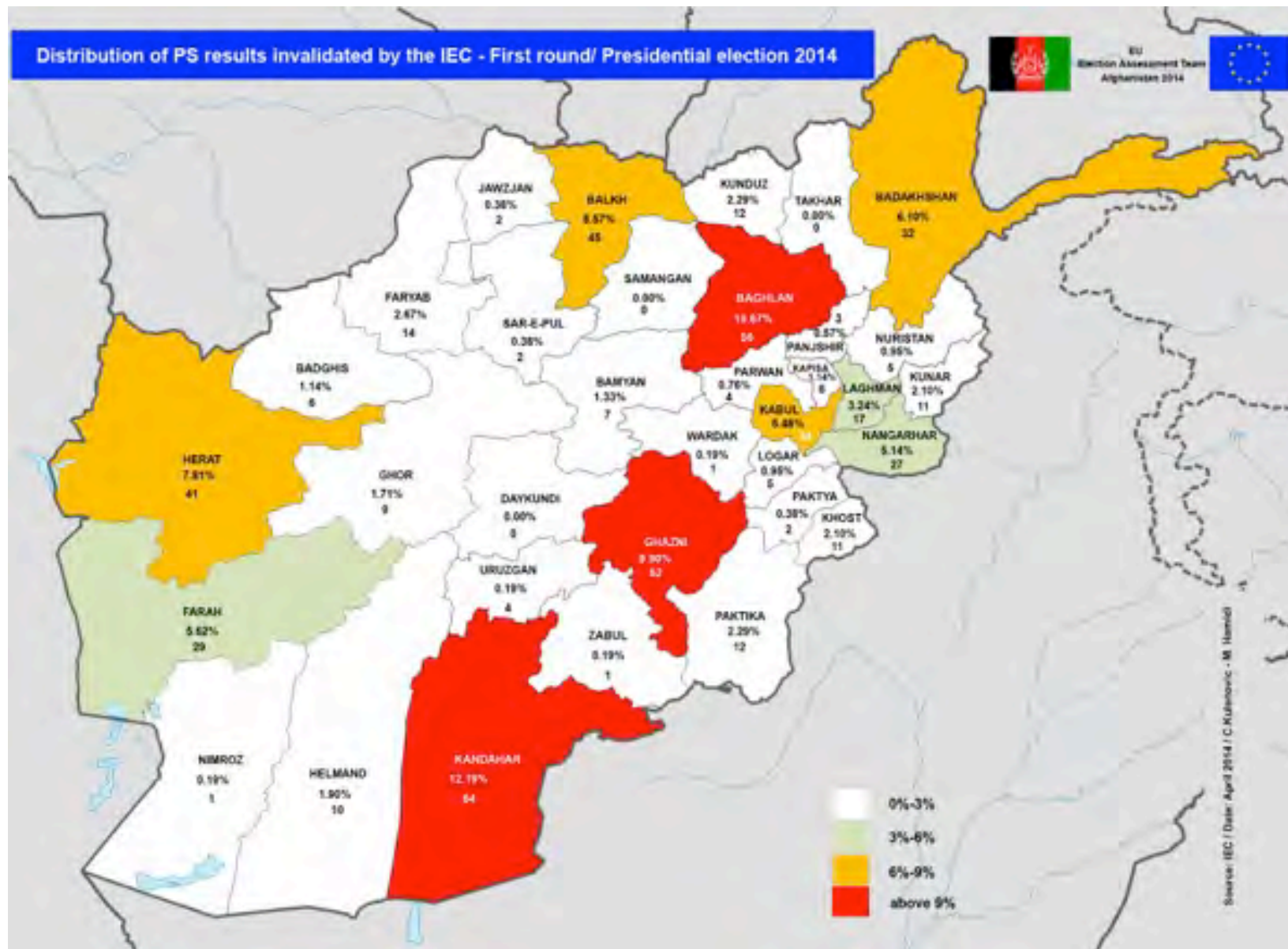
- The ballot box is not of the same type that the Commission distributed for the run-off elections.
- There are no ballots in the box or all ballots are not stamped or all are not marked in accordance with procedure or all are obviously similarly marked or all are still attached to the stub.
- There are reports in the journal of the PS Chairperson in regard to exertion of force, occurrence of fight and loss of control of the electoral material from the electoral staff.
- The list of voters is missing or blank and at least 33% of the all ballots in the box are not stamped or are not marked in accordance with procedure or are obviously similarly marked or are still attached to the stub.
- There are 10 or more voter ID card numbers logged sequentially on the list of voters and at least 33% of the all ballots in the box are not stamped or are not marked in accordance with the procedure or are obviously similarly marked or are still attached to the stub.
- The ballot box is broken/damaged to the extent that a hand could be placed inside the box, and there is visual evidence of tampering with the result sheet or bundled ballots.
- Two or more of the ballot box seals on the side of the box are broken or show obvious signs of tampering or the seals are sufficiently loose that a hand could be placed inside the box, and there is visual evidence of tampering with the results sheet or bundled ballots.
- The serial numbers of two or more of the ballot box seals on the side of the box do not match with the serial numbers recorded on the record of seals form in the ballot box, and there is visual evidence of tampering with the results sheets or bundled ballots.
- During deliberations on the validity of ballots in boxes that are lost or are otherwise missing, damaged or destroyed, all relevant information in the possession of the IEC and reports or information from other sources will be used.

Criteria for invalidation introduced on 16 August 2014:

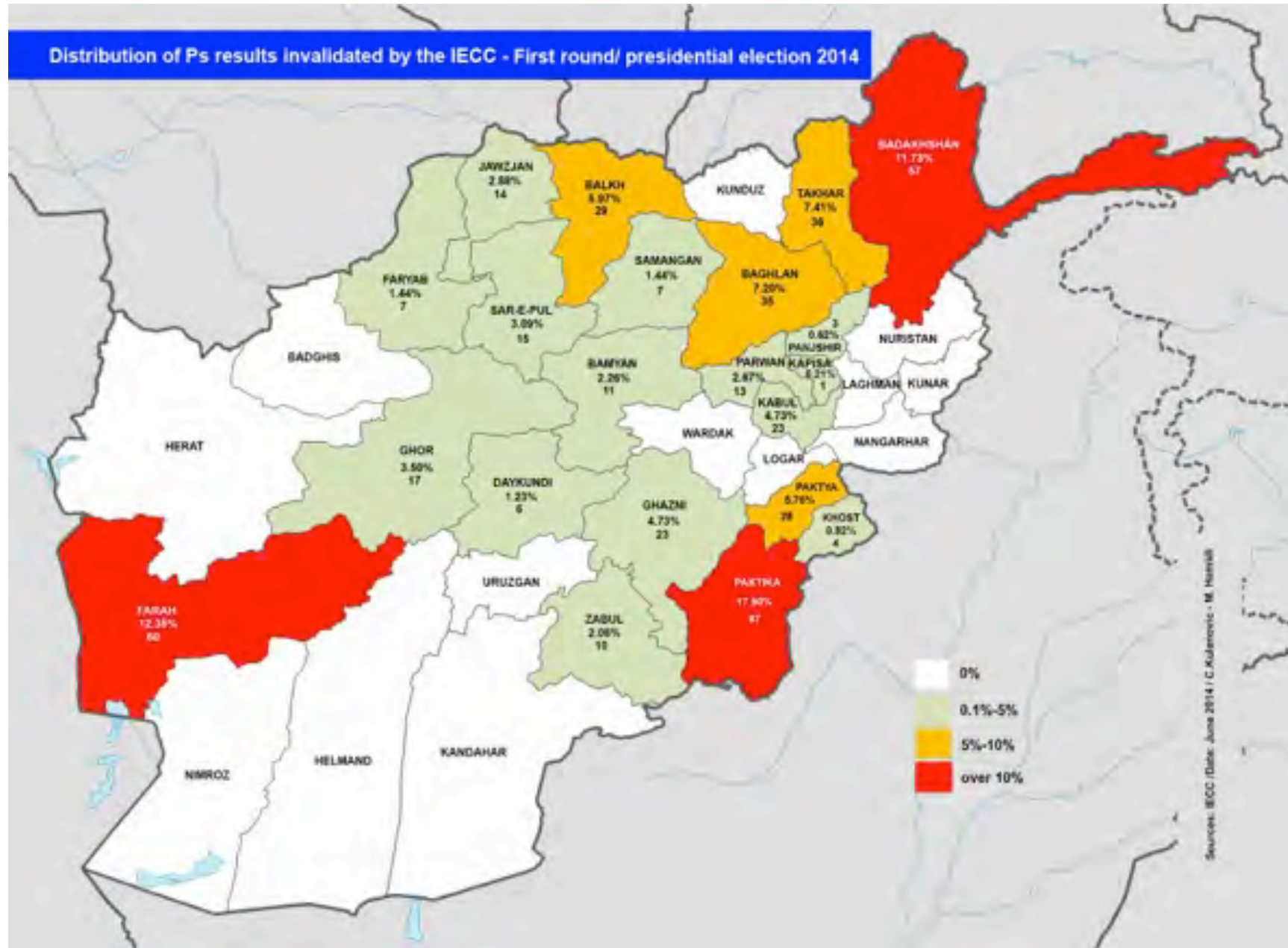
- At least one of the ballot boxes included in the group of PSs (claims from the candidates on similar signatures) has already been previously excluded from the vote count following a decision of the IEC pursuant to the audit process conducted under the above mentioned decisions or,
- At least one third of the ballot boxes included in the group of PSs have been recounted pursuant to the audit process conducted under the above mentioned decisions and where those recounts identified the indicators of serious irregularity or malpractice.
- Audit Committee agreement on 10 August: the PS is a contingency kit and is not present on the list provided to the IEC auditors.
- Audit Committee agreement on 19 August: the PS is not present on the list provided to the IEC auditors.

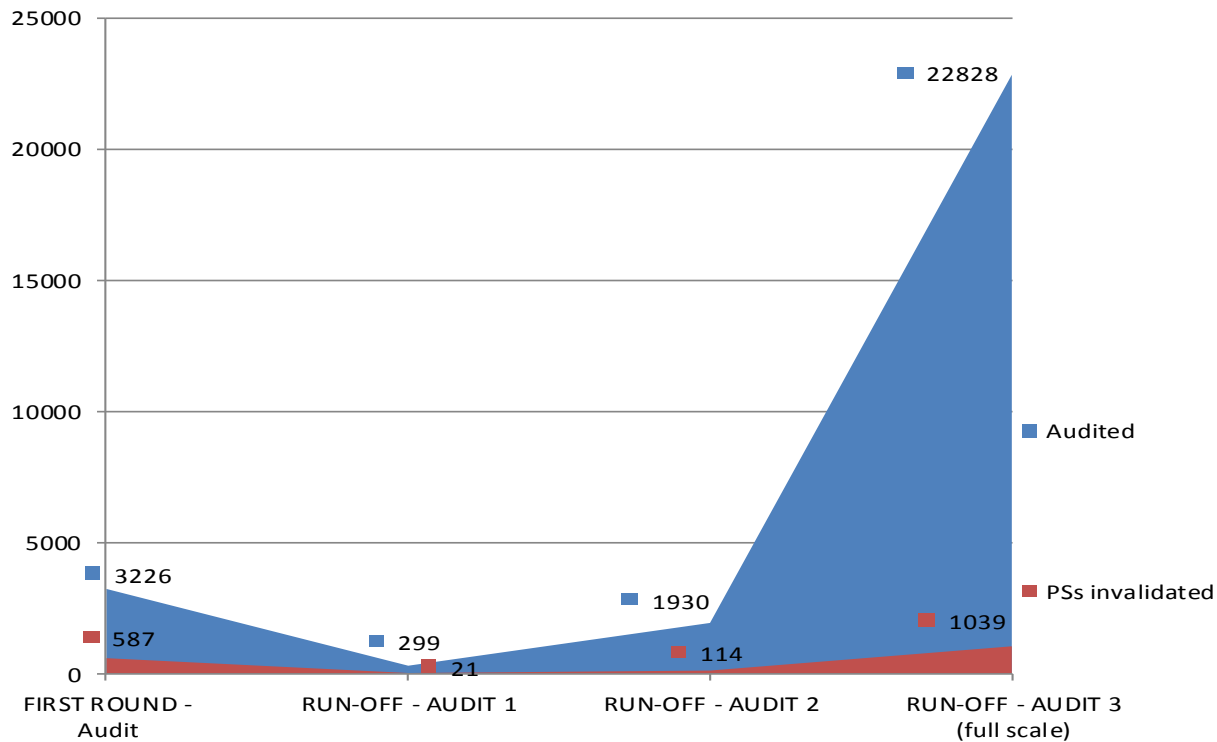
9.1 IEC - Percentage of polling station results invalidated per province – first round (total invalidations of PS results)

ANNEX No 10 – POLITICAL AGREEMENTS

10.1 Political framework agreement reached on 12 July 2014 between the two candidates regarding the conduct of a full scale audit of the results and on a Government of National Unity

“Pursuant to the results of the credible and comprehensive election audit described in Part One, the candidates commit to implement a political agreement whereby the winner of the election will serve as President and will immediately form a government of national unity with the following characteristics:

- 1. The government of national unity will develop and implement a comprehensive program of reform to empower the Afghan people and address the need for peace, stability, security, rule of law, justice, economic growth, and delivery of services.*
- 2. The President will convene a Loya Jirga, and initiate a process of amending the constitution, to establish the position of an Executive Prime Minister within two years.*
- 3. Until such time as the position of Executive Prime Minister is constitutionally established, the functions of an Executive Prime Minister will be performed by a Government Chief Executive Officer. This position of Government CEO will be immediately established by Presidential decree, and will be held by a nominee of the runner-up and mutually agreed by the President.*
- 4. The President will create the position of Leader of the Opposition. The runner-up will select the person of his choice to fill this position.*
- 5. Appointments to the key national security, economic, and independent government agencies will be apportioned according to the principle of achieving parity between the choices of the President and the Leader of the Opposition. Cabinet, judiciary, and key sub-national appointments will be apportioned according to the principle of fair representation, chosen by the President in consultation with the Leader of the Opposition.*
- 6. The President commits to maintain continuity of the leadership in key national security agencies for at least 90 days.*
- 7. The unity government commits to adopt within one year fundamental reforms of the electoral system, developed by a broadly representational process, with a goal of remedying prior electoral shortcomings”*

10.2 Political agreement reached on 21 September 2014 between the two candidates regarding the structure of the Government of National Unity

"This period in Afghanistan's history requires a legitimate and functioning government committed to implementing a comprehensive program of reform to empower the Afghan public, thereby making the values of the Constitution a daily reality for the people of Afghanistan. Stability of the country is strengthened by a genuine political partnership between the President and the CEO, under the authority of the President. Dedicated to political consensus, commitment to reforms, and cooperative decision-making, the national unity government will fulfill the aspirations of the Afghan public for peace, stability, security, rule of law, justice, economic growth, and delivery of services, with particular attention to women, youth, Ulema, and vulnerable persons. Further, this agreement is based on the need for genuine and meaningful partnership and effective cooperation in the affairs of government, including design and implementation of reforms.

The relationship between the President and the CEO cannot be described solely and entirely by this agreement, but must be defined by the commitment of both sides to partnership, collegiality, collaboration, and, most importantly, responsibility to the people of Afghanistan. The President and CEO are honor bound to work together in that spirit of partnership.

Convening of a Loya Jirga to amend the Constitution and considering the proposal to create the post of executive prime minister

• *On the basis of Article 2 of the Joint Statement of 17 Asad 1393 (August 8, 2014) and its attachment ("...convening of a Loya Jirga in two years to consider the post of an executive prime minister"), the President is committed to convoking a Loya Jirga for the purpose of debate on amending the Constitution and creating a post of executive prime minister.*

• *After the inauguration ceremony, the President will appoint in consultation with the CEO by executive order a commission to draft an amendment to the Constitution.*

• *On the basis of Article 140 of the Constitution, the national unity government is committed to holding district council elections as early as possible on the basis of a law in order to create a quorum for the Loya Jirga in accordance with Section 2 of Article 110 of the Constitution.*

• *The national unity government is committed to ratifying and enforcing a law on the organization of the basic organs of the state and determination of the boundaries and limits of local administration by legal means.*

• *The national unity government commits to completing the distribution of electronic/computerized identity cards to all the citizens of the country as quickly as possible.*

• *The above issues and other matters that are agreed to will be implemented on a schedule which is appended to this agreement.*

The position of the Chief Executive Officer

• *Until such time as the Constitution is amended and the position of executive prime minister is created, the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO) will be created by presidential decree on the basis of Article 50 of the Constitution and Article 2 of the attached Joint Declaration and its annex. The CEO and his deputies will be introduced in the presidential inauguration ceremony.*

• *The appointment of the CEO with the functions of an executive prime minister will take place through a proposal by the runner-up and the agreement of the President. The CEO will be answerable to the President.*

• *A special protocol for the CEO will be authorized in a presidential decree.*

• *The President will delegate by a presidential decree specific executive authorities to the CEO with a view to Articles 60, 64, 71, and 77 of the Constitution. Key elements of authorities will include the following:*

1. *Participation of the CEO with the President in bilateral decision-making meetings.*

2. *Carrying out administrative affairs and executive affairs of the government as determined by presidential decree.*

3. *Implementing the reform program of the National Unity Government.*

4. *Proposing reforms in all government agencies and decisively combatting official corruption.*

5. *Exercising specific administrative and financial authorities, which will be determined in a presidential decree.*

6. *Establishing working relationships of the executive branch of the government with the legislative and judicial branches within the framework of defined functions and authorities.*

7. *Implementing, monitoring, and supporting the policies, programs, and budgetary and financial affairs of the government.*

8. *Submitting necessary reports and proposals to the President.*

9. *The President, as the head of state and government, leads the Cabinet (Kabina), which meets at his discretion on government policy, strategy, budgeting, resource allocation, and legislation among its other functions and authorities. The Cabinet consists of the President, Vice-Presidents, CEO, Deputy CEOs, the Chief Advisor, and ministers. The CEO will be responsible for managing the Cabinet's implementation of government policies, and will report on progress to the President directly and in the Cabinet. To that end, the CEO will chair regular weekly meetings of the Council of Ministers (Shura-e-Waziran), consisting of the CEO, Deputy CEOs, and all ministers. The Council of Ministers will implement the executive affairs of the government. The CEO will also chair all the sub-committees of the Council of Ministers. Based on this article of the agreement, a presidential decree will introduce and define the new Council of Ministers as distinct from the Cabinet.*

10. *Providing advice and proposals to the President for appointment and dismissal of senior government officials and other government affairs.*

11. *Special representation of the President at the international level as deemed necessary by the President.*

12. *The CEO is a member of the National Security Council.*

13. *The CEO will have two deputies, who will be members of meetings of the cabinet and meetings of the National Security Council. The functions, authorities, and responsibilities of the CEO's deputies, in line with the CEO's functions and authorities, as well as an appropriate protocol for them, will be proposed by the CEO and approved by the President through presidential decree.*

Appointment of senior officials

On the basis of the principles of national participation, fair representation, merit, honesty, and commitment to the reform programs of the national unity government, the parties are committed to the following:

• *Parity in the selection of personnel between the President and the CEO at the level of head of key security and economic institutions, and independent directorates. As a consequence of this parity, and the provisions of Sections B(12) and (13) above, the two teams will be equally represented in the National Security Council at the leadership level, and equitably (Barabarguna) represented at the membership level.*

• *The President and the CEO will agree upon a specific merit-based mechanism for the appointment of senior officials. The mechanism will provide for the full participation of the CEO in proposing nominees for all applicable positions and for full consideration of all nominations. In conformity with the intent of the Joint Declaration and its annex (Article 5), the President and the CEO will consult intensively on the selection of senior appointees not covered by the Civil Service Commission through the above mechanism, which can lead to equitable (Barabarguna) representation from both parties, and with attention to inclusivity and the political and societal composition of the country, with particular attention to women and youth, and persons with disabilities, for state institutions and agencies, including key judiciary and local administrative posts. The two parties are committed to early reform of the Civil Service Commission.*

• *Enabling broad participation of meritorious personalities and personnel of the country at various levels of the system, using these opportunities for securing enduring peace and stability and building a healthy administration.*

Creation of the position of leader of the runner-up team

In line with the Joint Declaration of 17 Asad 1393 (August 8, 2014) and its annex, and with the goal of strengthening and expanding democracy, the position of the leader of the runner-up team, referred to in the mentioned document as the opposition leader, will be created and officially recognized within the framework of the government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan on the basis of a presidential decree. The responsibilities, authorities, and honors of this position will be spelled out in the decree. After the formation of the national unity government with the presence of the runner-up team on the basis of this agreement, this position will act as an ally of the national unity government.

Electoral reform

To ensure that future elections are fully credible, the electoral system (laws and institutions) requires fundamental changes. Immediately after the establishment of the government of national unity, the President will issue a decree to form a special commission for the reform of the electoral system in accordance with Article 7 of the Political Framework. Members of the special commission will be agreed between the President and the CEO. The special commission will report to the CEO on its progress and the Cabinet will review its recommendations and take the necessary steps for their implementation. The objective is to implement electoral reform before the 2015 parliamentary elections.

Implementation

Any divergence in views or dispute regarding the interpretation or application of this agreement shall be resolved through consultation between the parties.

The parties express appreciation for the role played by the international community in facilitating the political and technical agreements, and welcome the assurances the parties have received of its support for the implementation of this agreement and its engagement with the government of national unity.

Entry-into-force

Honoring their commitments to the Technical and Political Frameworks of July 12, 2014, and the Joint Declaration of August 8, 2014, as reflected throughout this agreement, the parties reaffirm their commitment regarding the outcome of the election and implementation of this agreement to establish the national unity government, which will enter into force upon signing by the two candidates in the presence of Afghan and international witnesses."

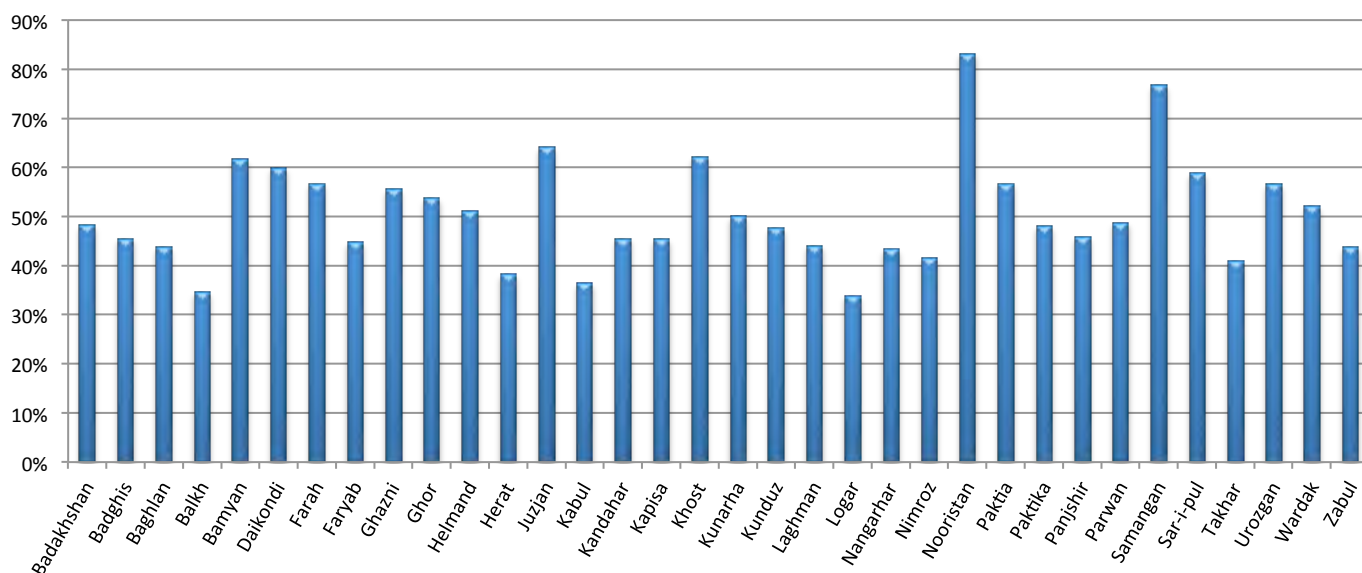

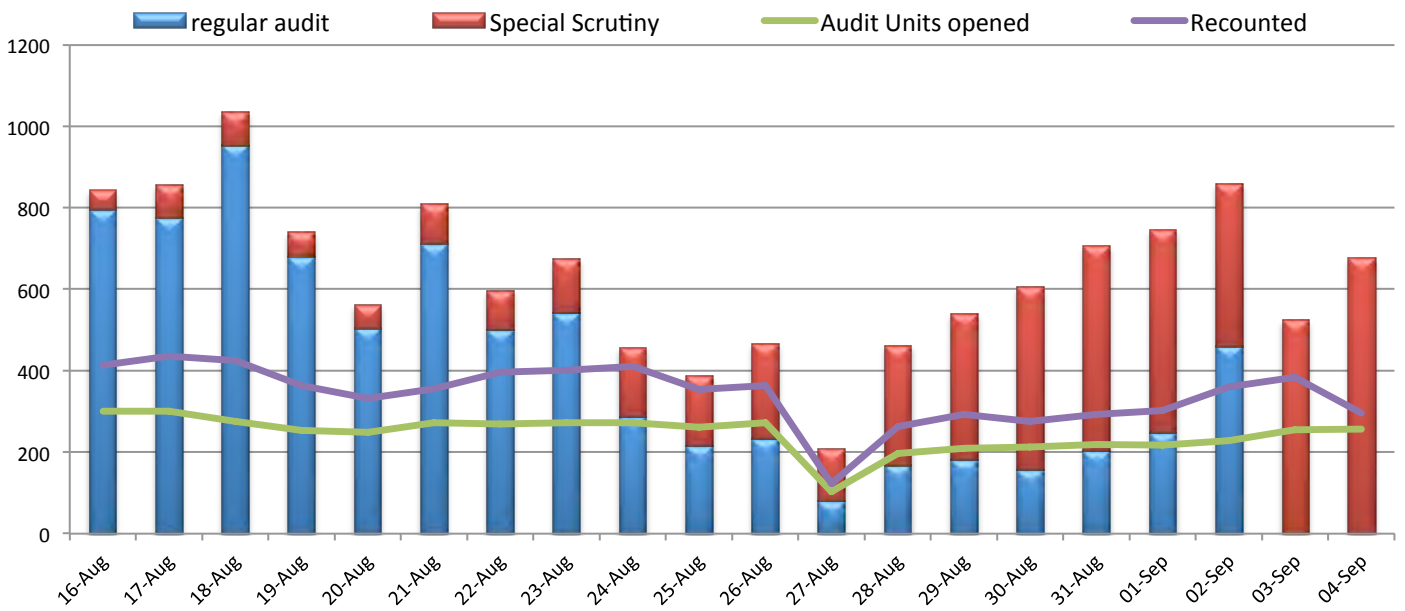

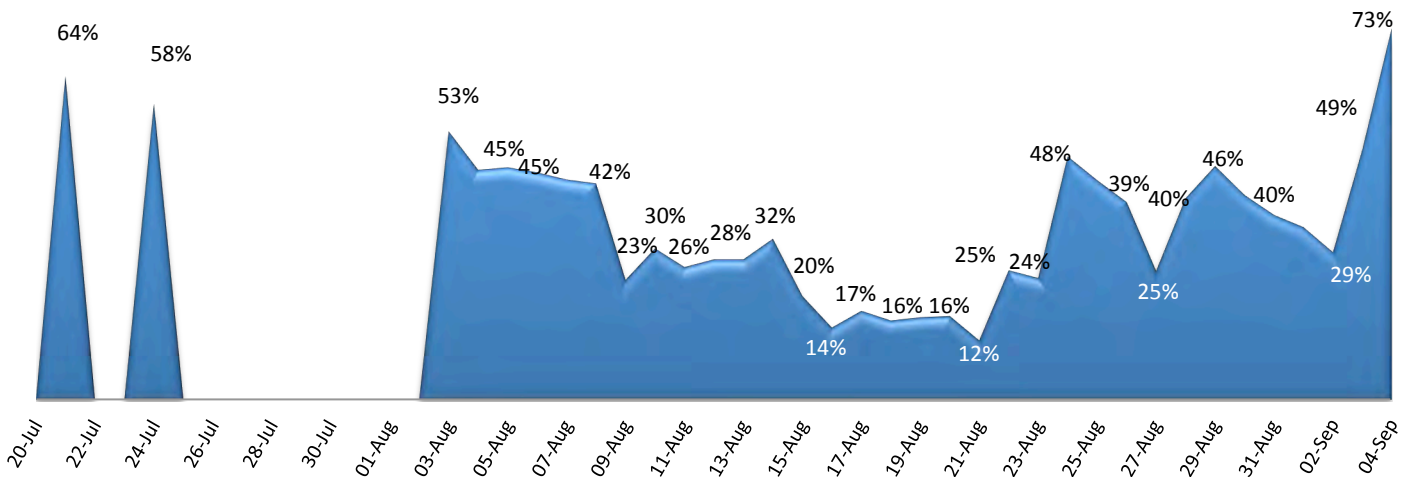

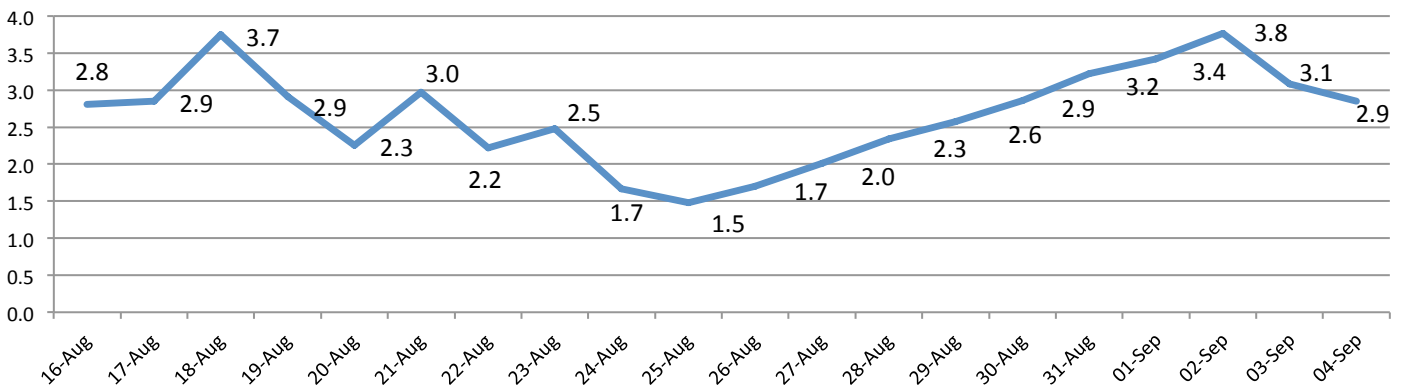
Number of audits per day, distributed by i) regular audits, ii) Special scrutiny, iii) units opened, and iv) recounts (Source: IEC)



Percentage of recounts conducted out the total number of PSs audited per day (Source: IEC)



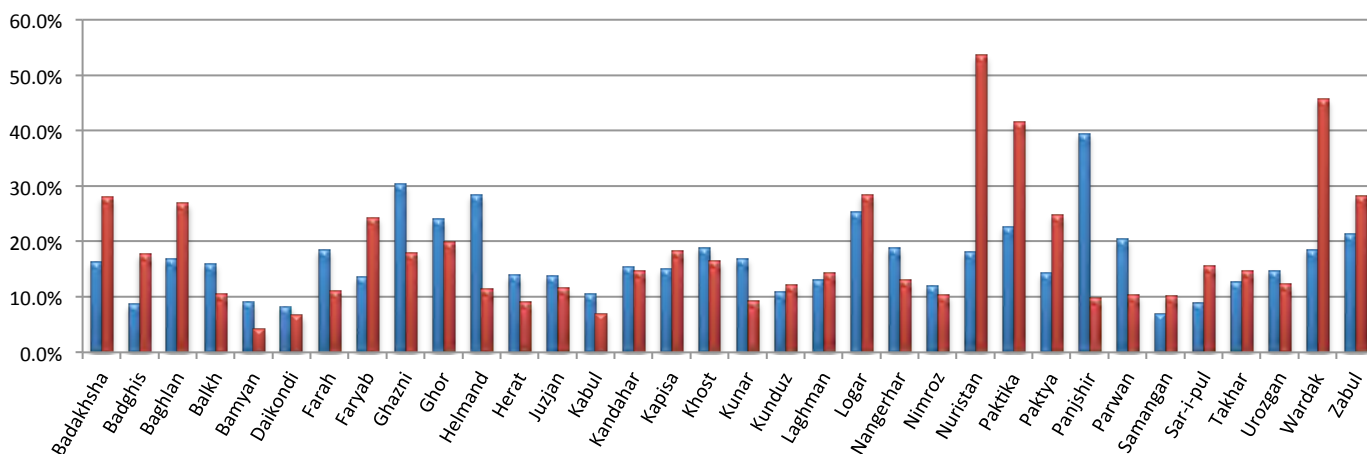
Average of PS ballot boxes audited per day from 16 August to 4 September 2014 (Source: IEC)

% of audits in which discrepancies were reported between the seals serial numbers and the serial numbers lodged in the Seal Serial Number Form found in the box.

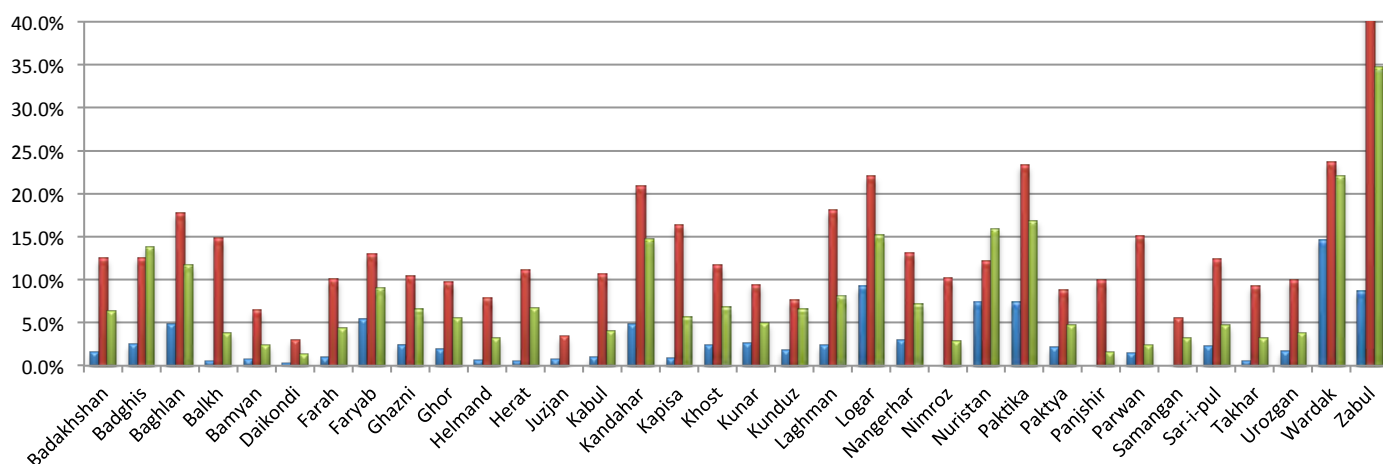

% of copies of the result form not matching with the reconciliation of the ballot papers found in the box

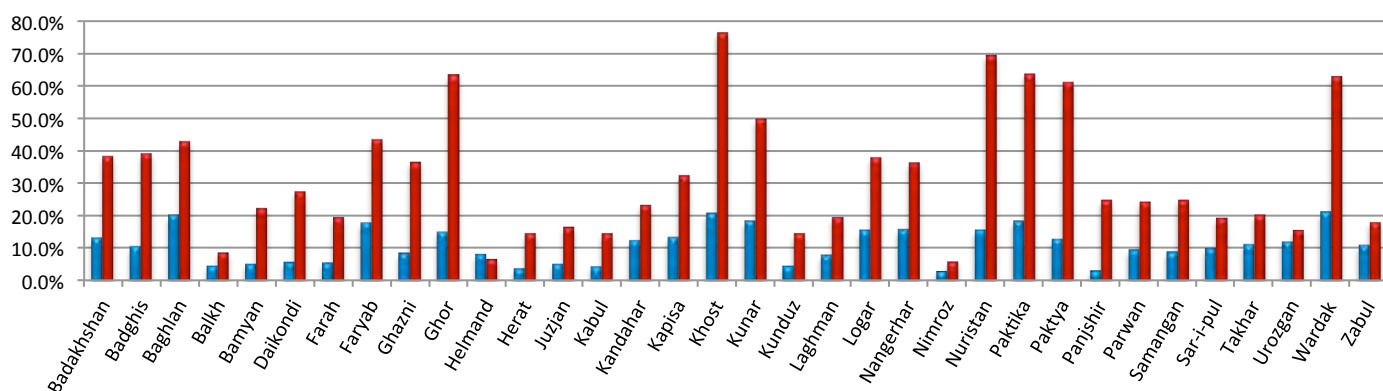
% of copies of the result form not matching with the original result form available at the IEC

% of audits observed where ballot papers were reported without verification stamps on the backside

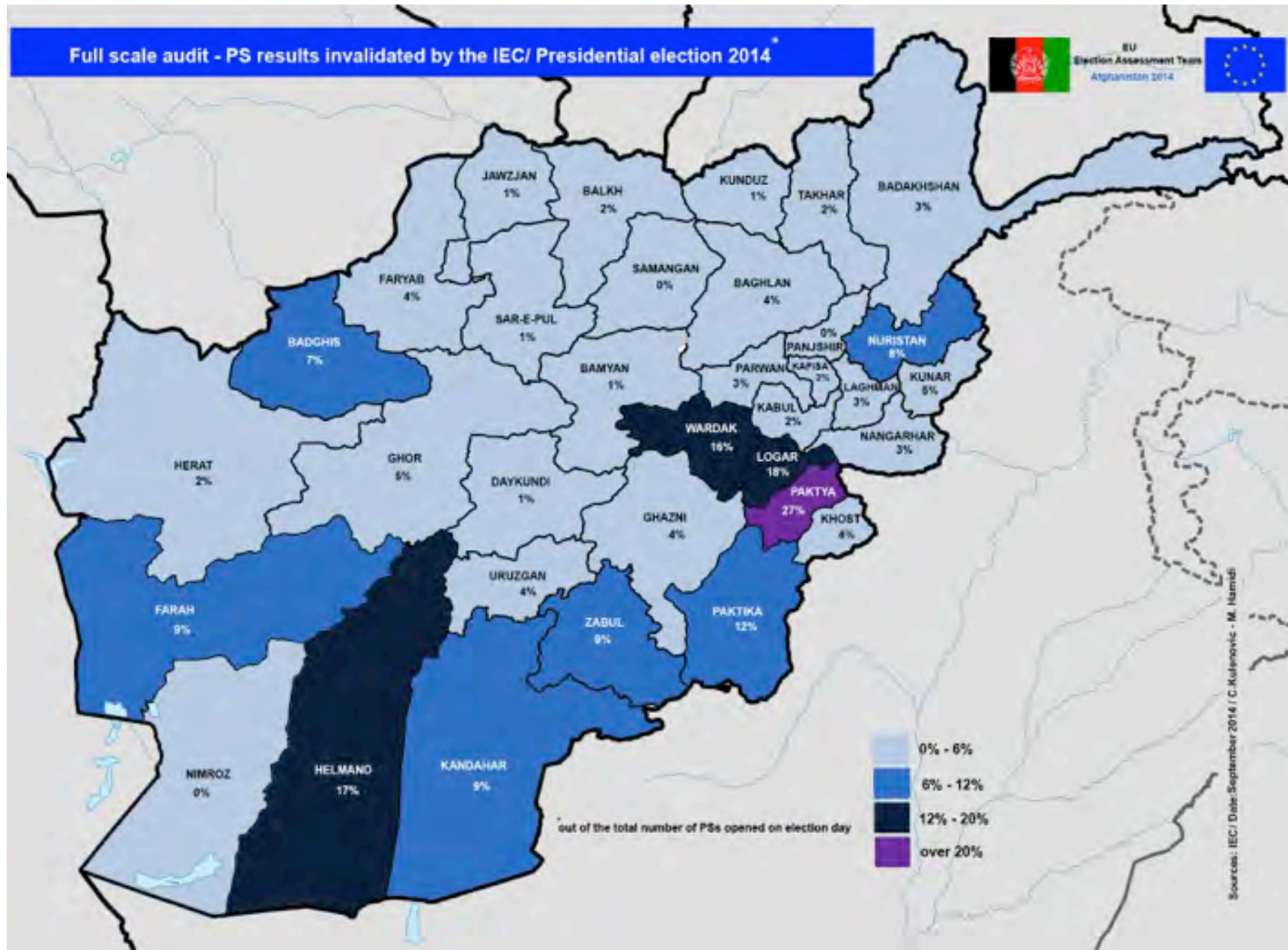

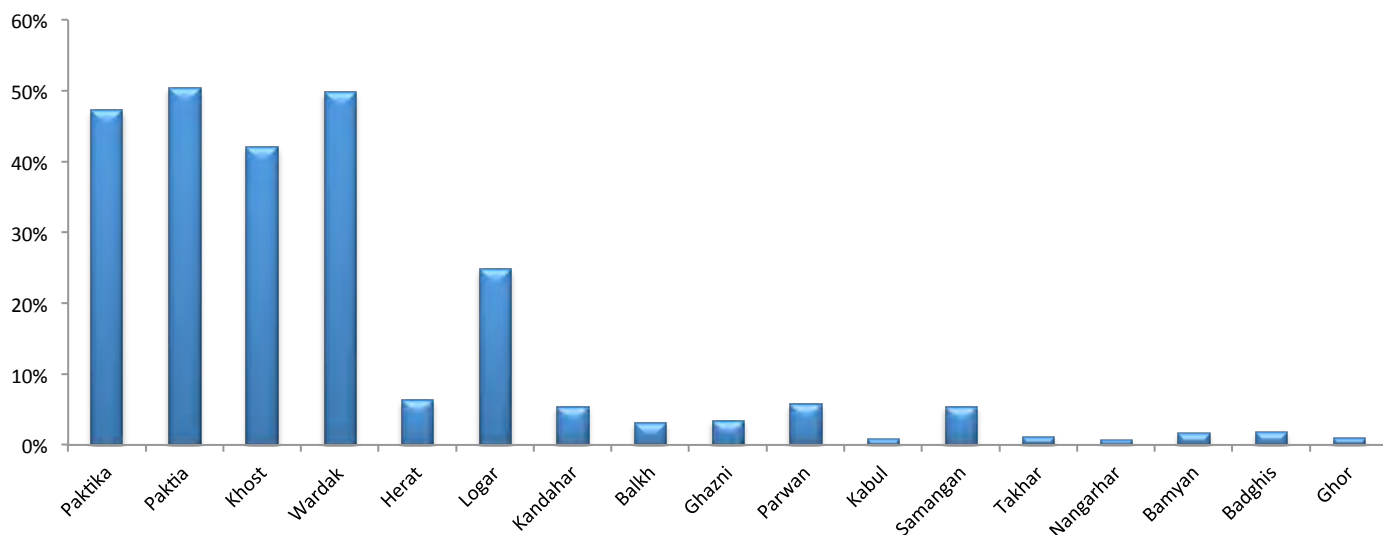
Percentage of invalidations of PS results pronounced by the IEC out of the total number of PSs opened on E day



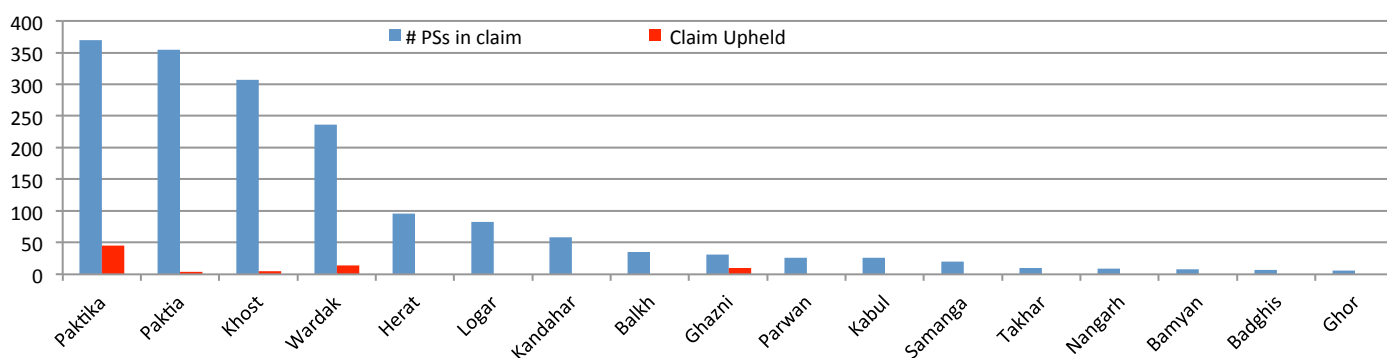

Percentage of claims by the candidates out of the total number of PSs in the concerned provinces

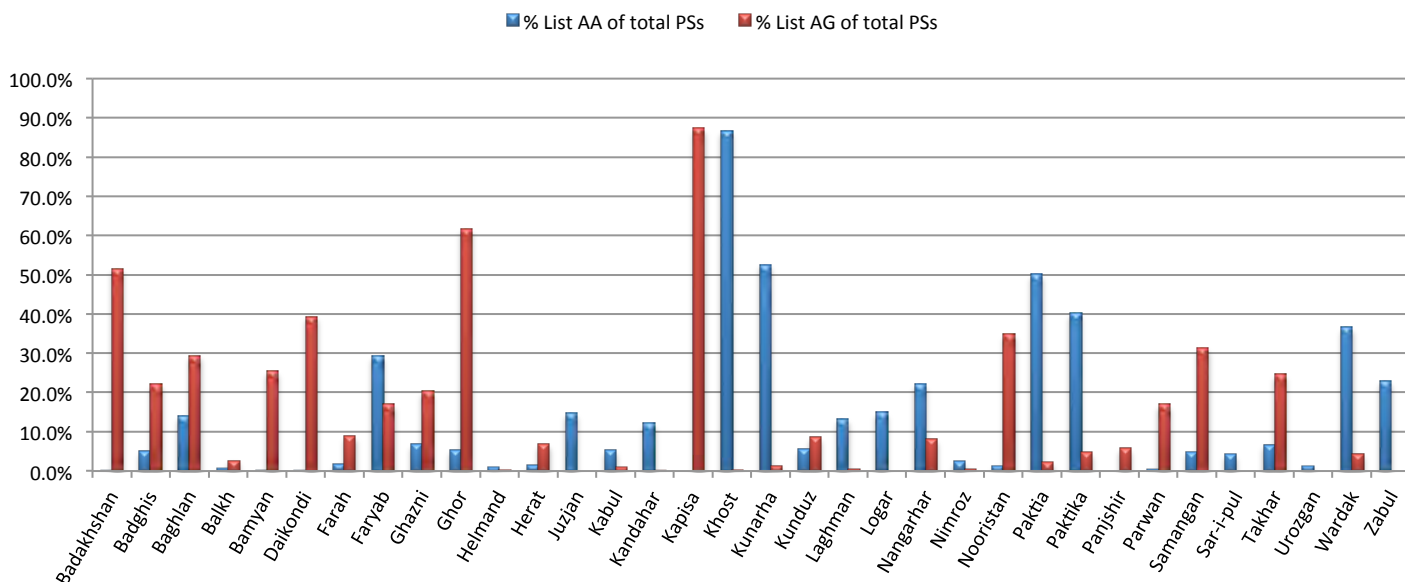


Comparison between the number of claims presented and the number of claims upheld, per province

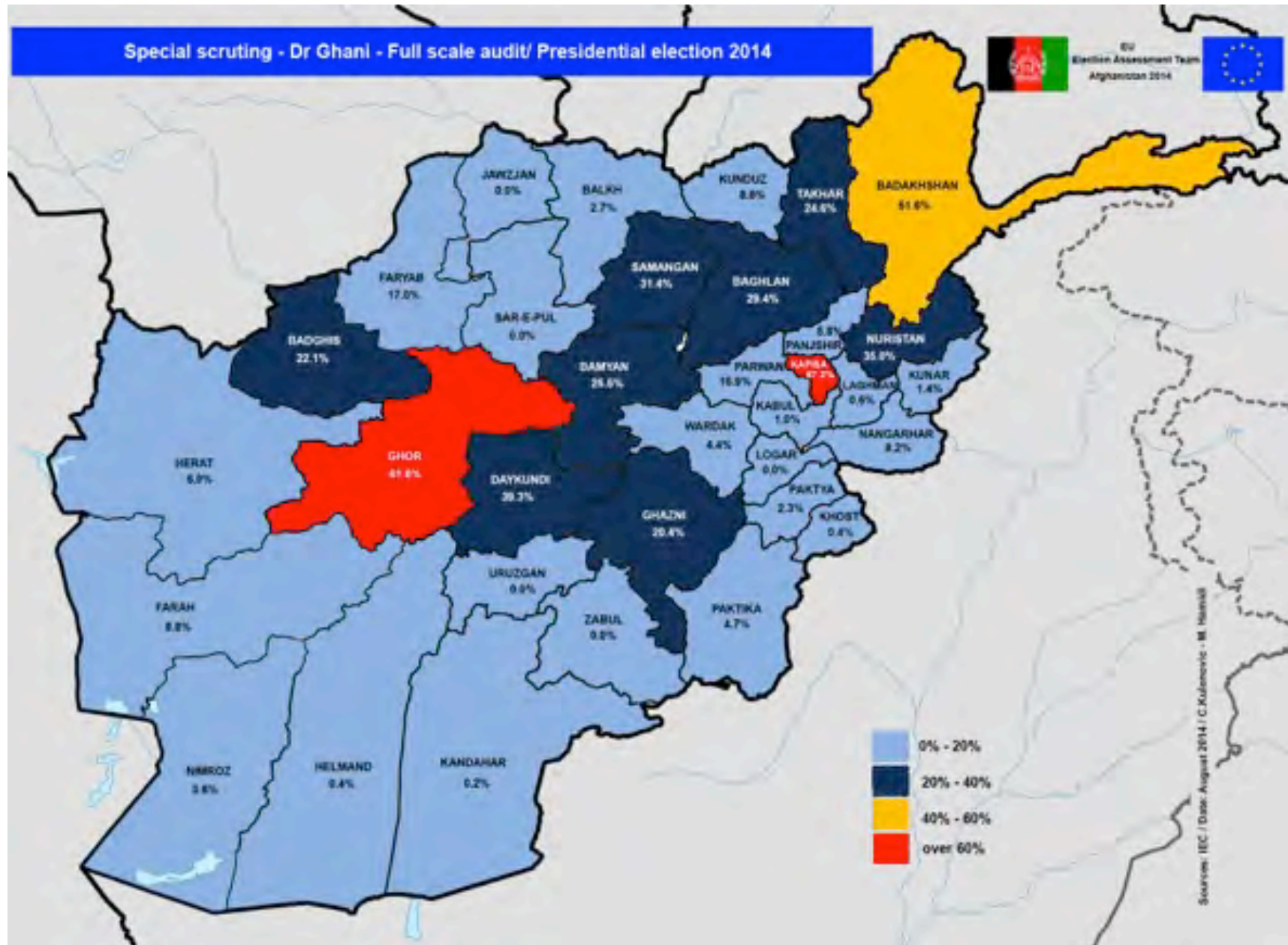

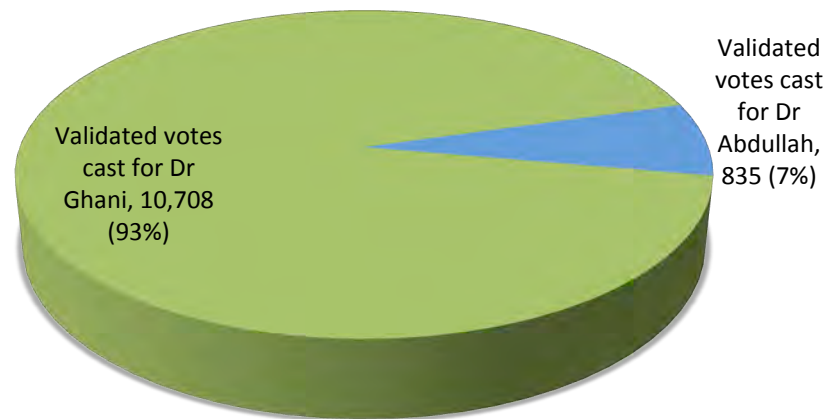

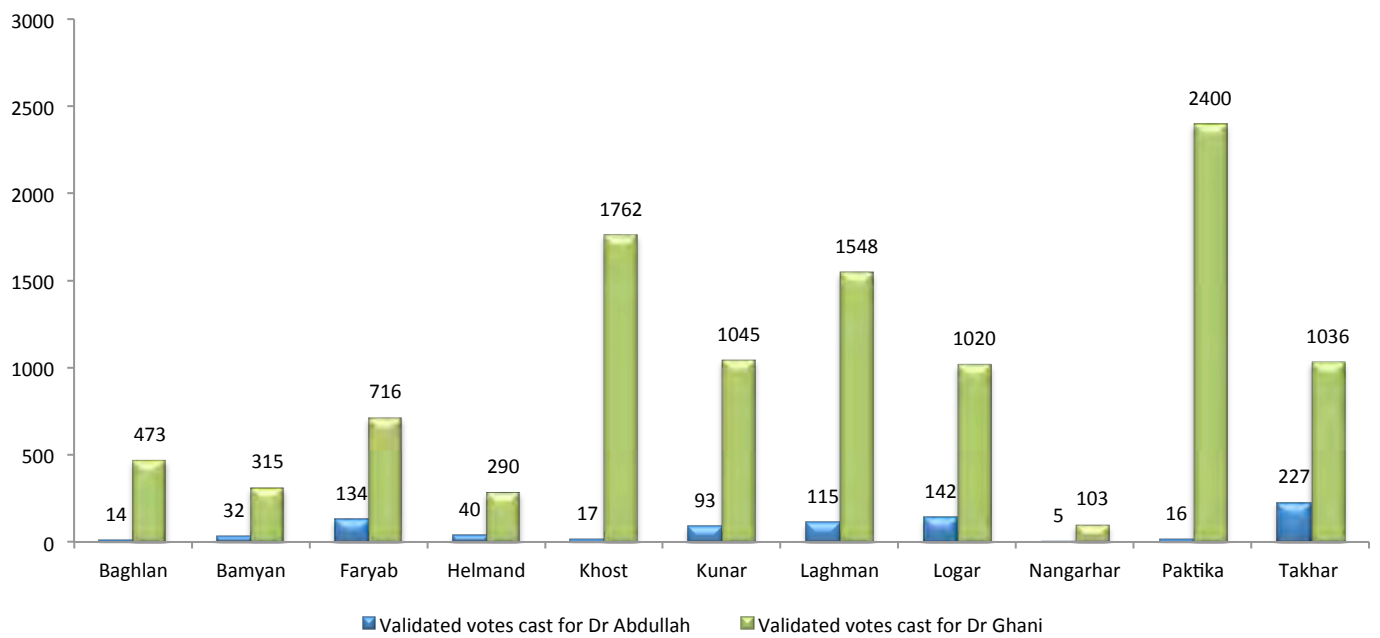


11.11 IECC decisions on votes reintegrated following IEC exclusions of results

Total number of votes per candidate re-included by the IECC

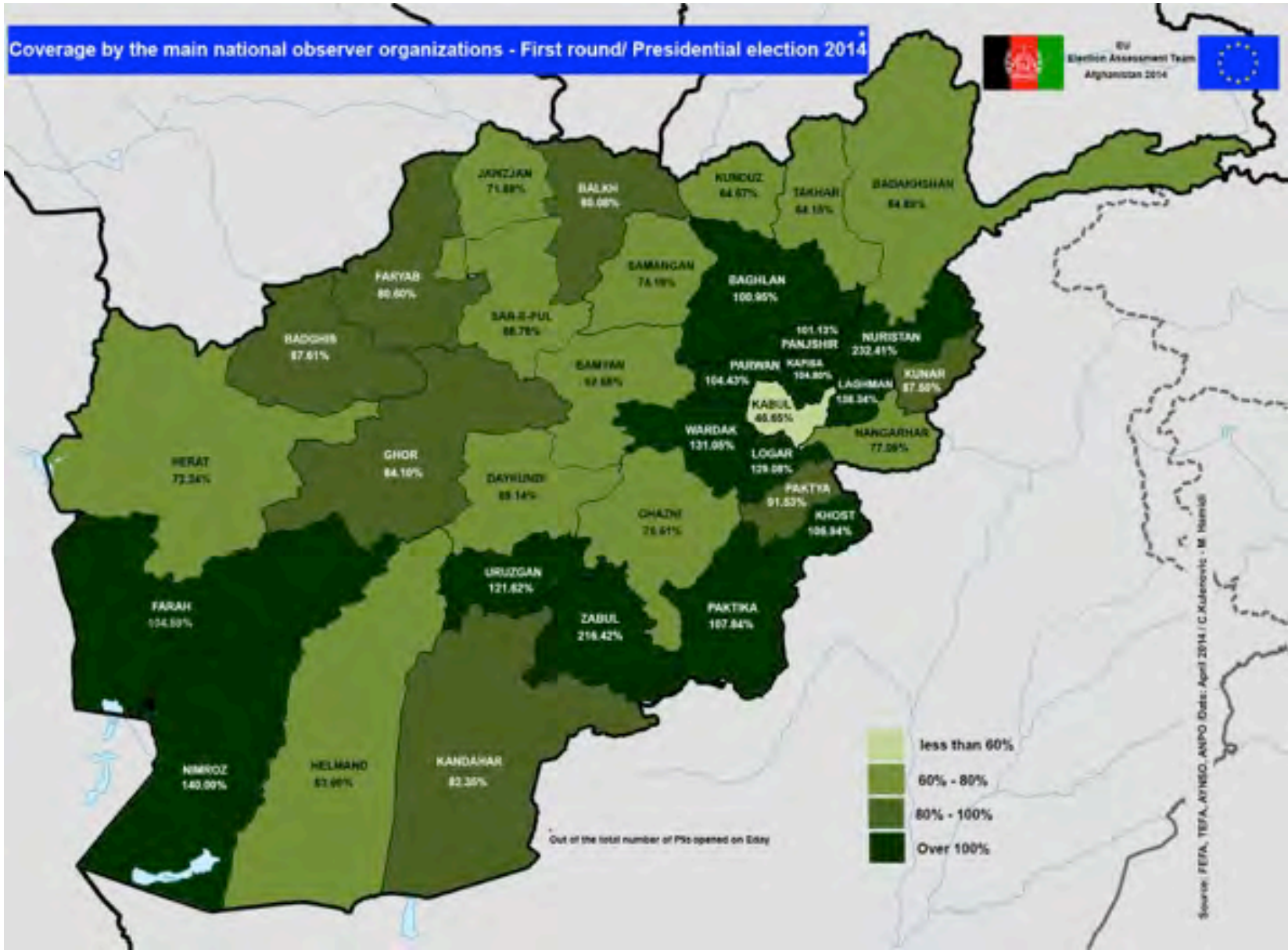


Number of votes validated by the IECC per province

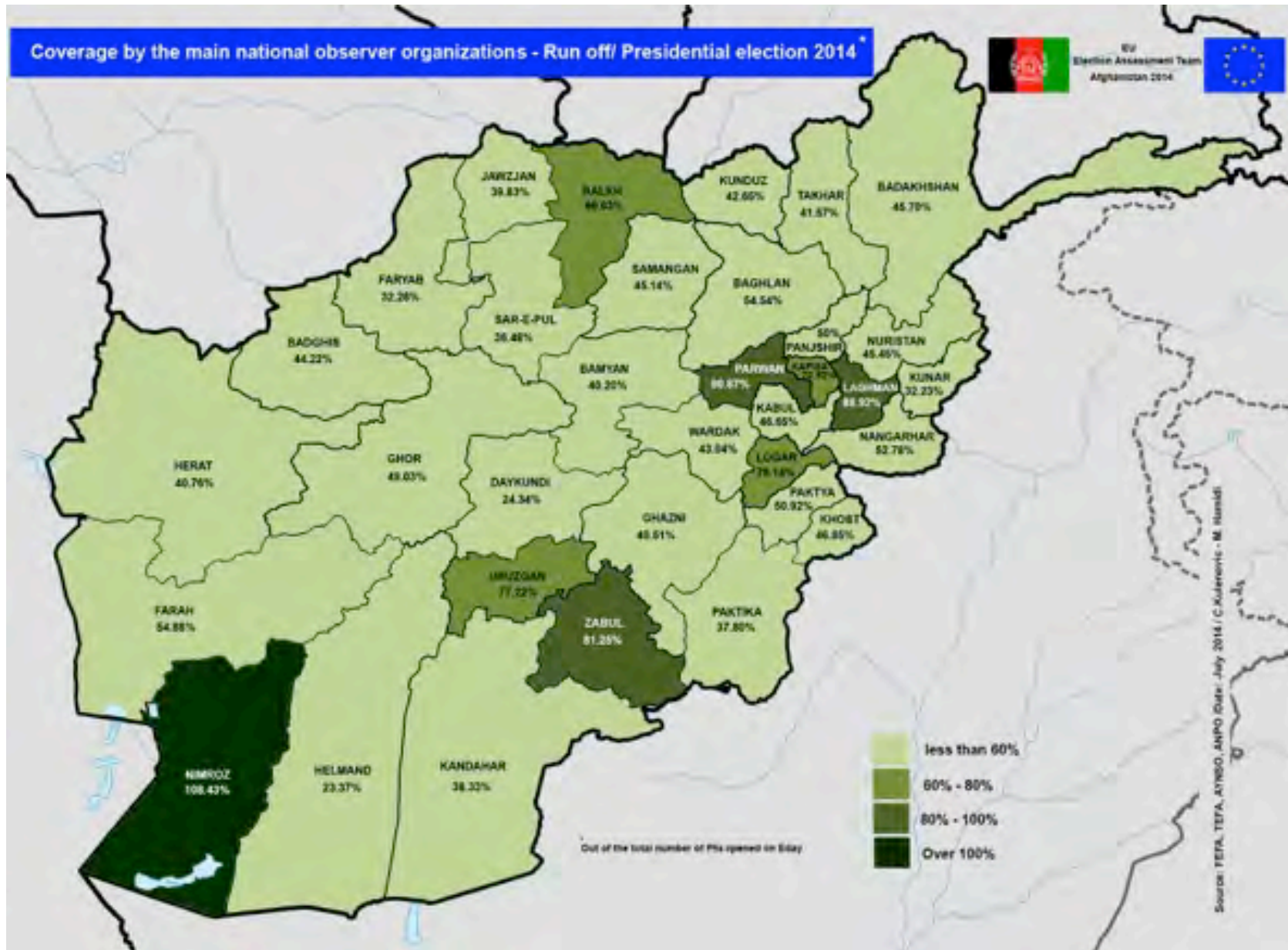

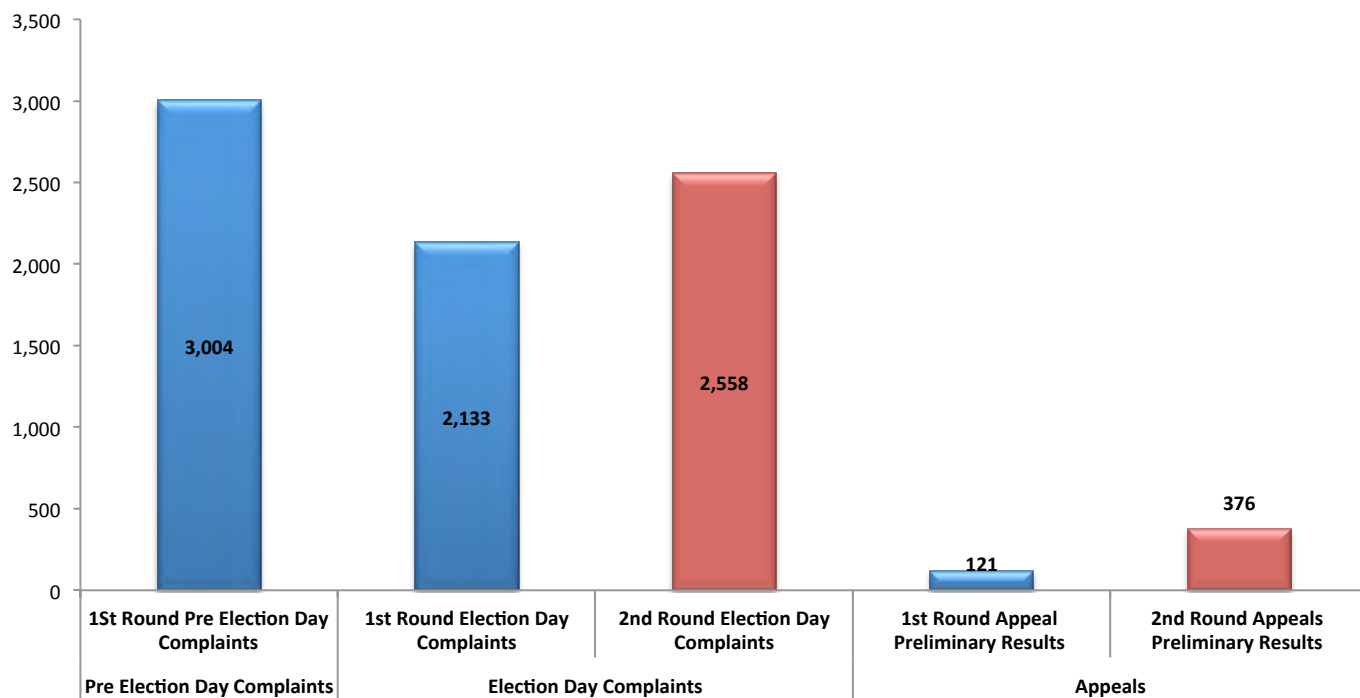


12.2 National observer groups – coverage – run-off

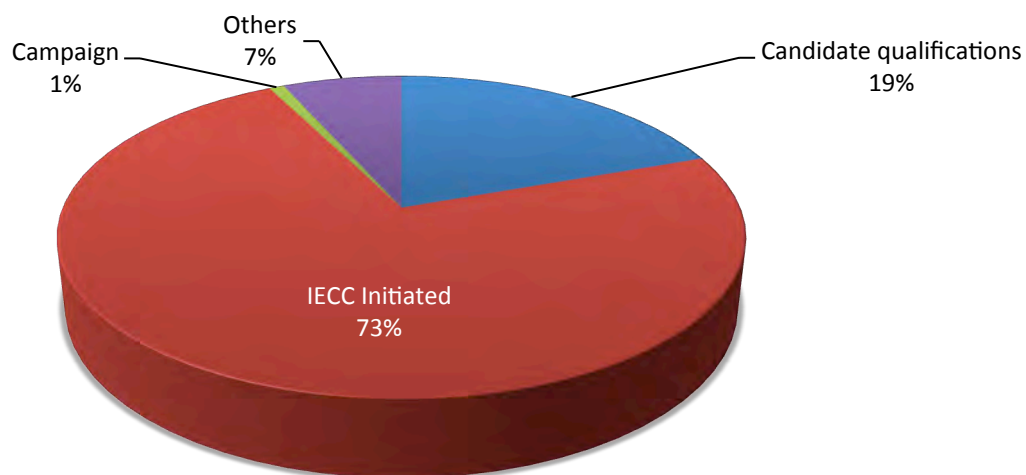

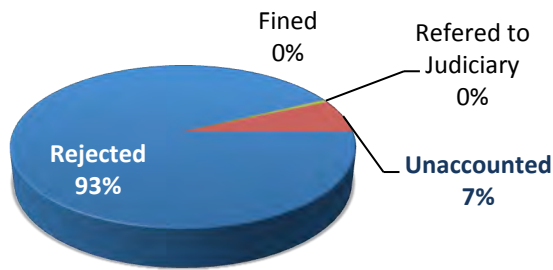


13.2 First Round Presidential-Provincial Council Election Afghanistan: Pre-election Day Complaints Statistics

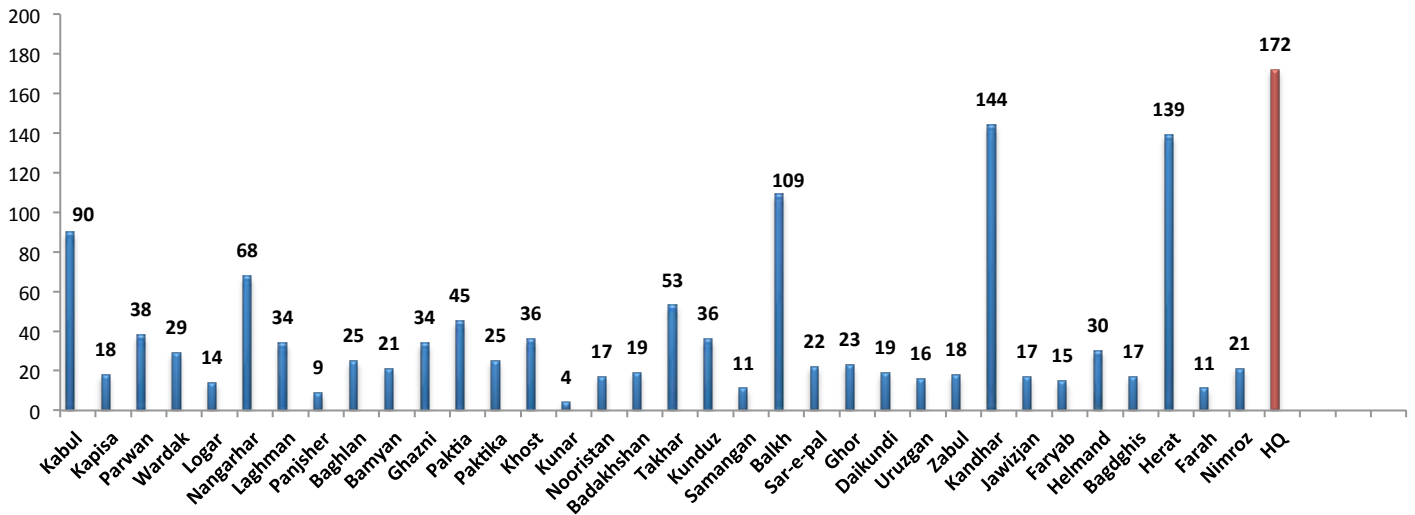

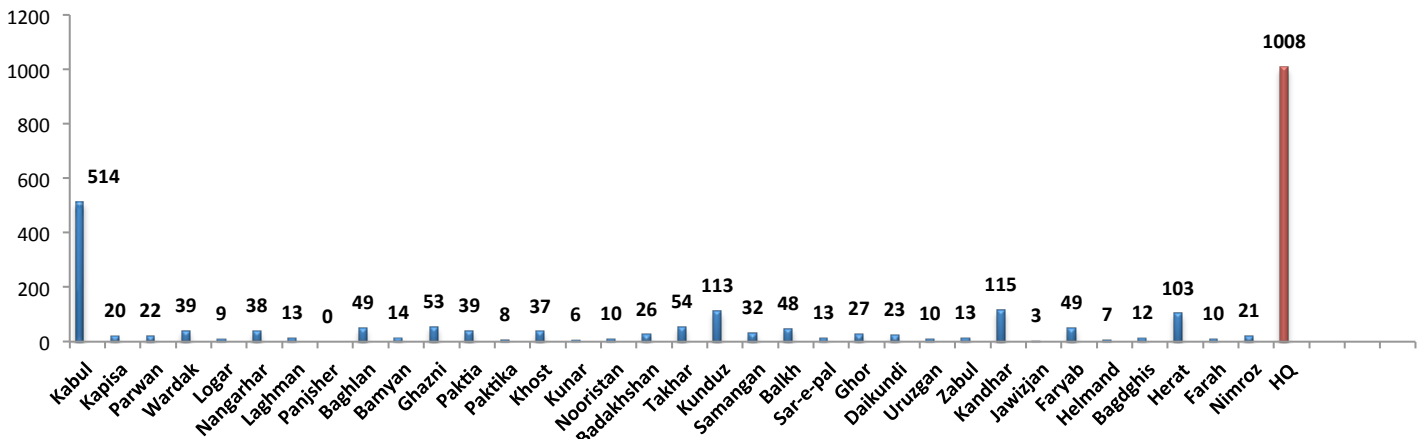

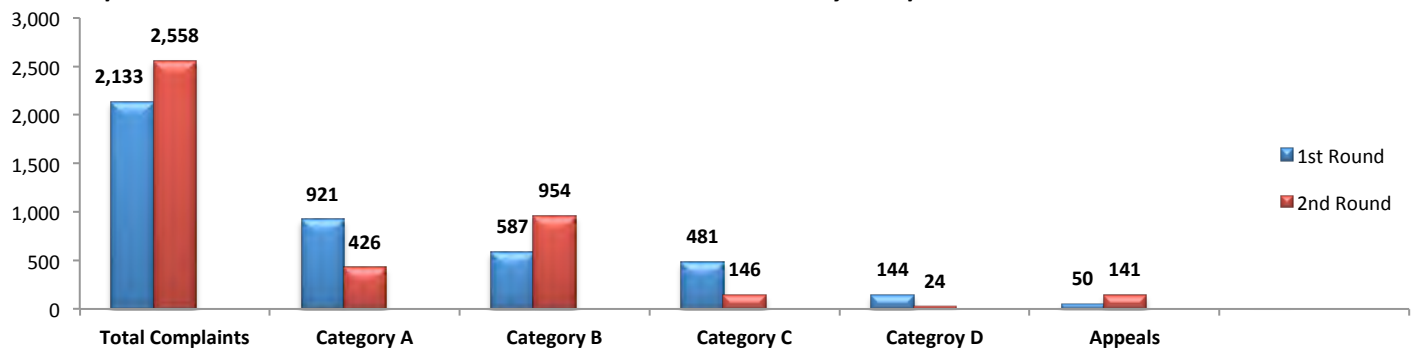
13.4 Presidential Election day Complaint by Province 1st Round



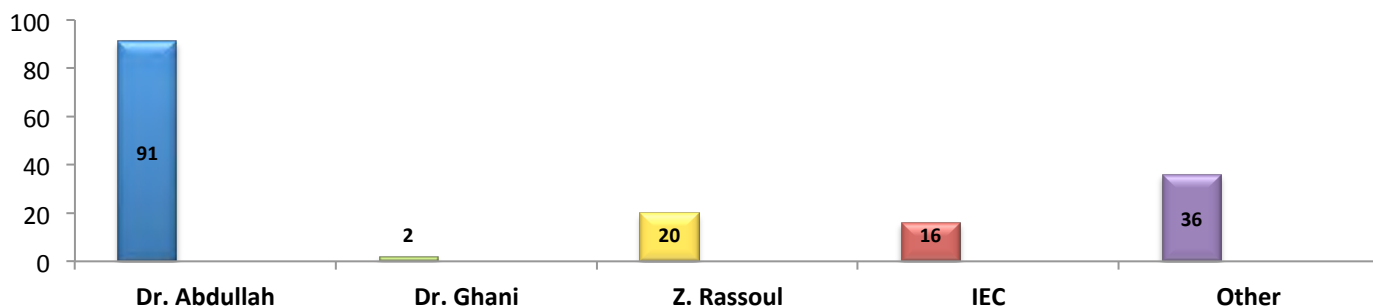
13.5 Presidential Election day Complaint by Province 2nd Round

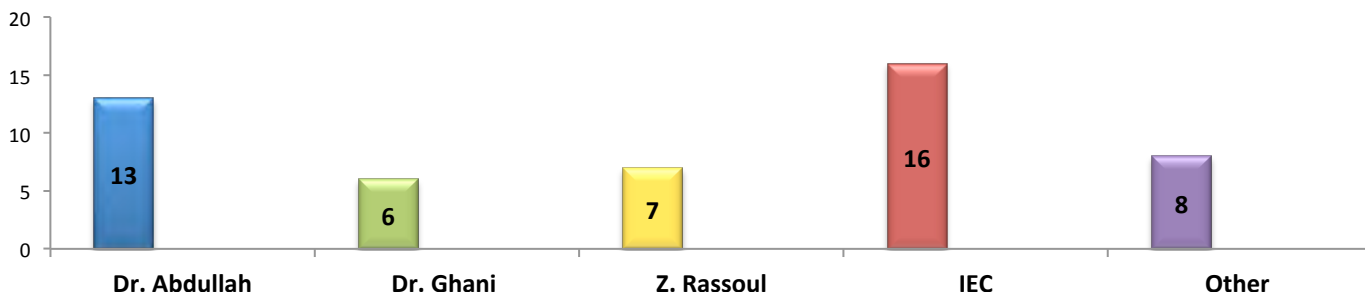

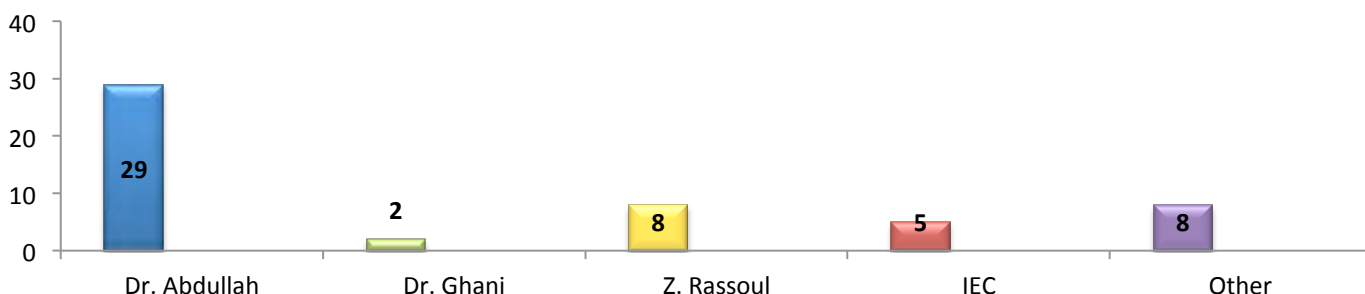


Quarantine orders originated from complaints directed against candidates, the IEC and general comments

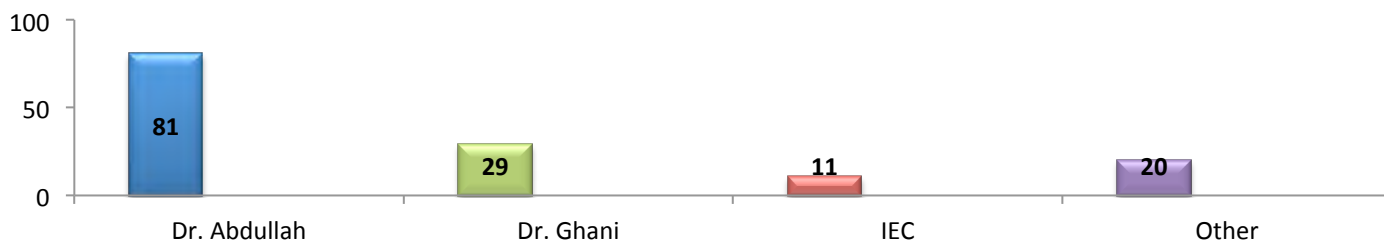

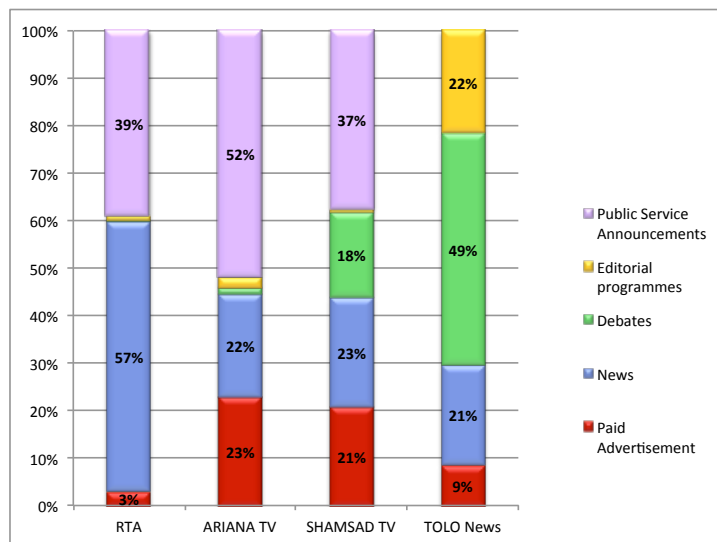

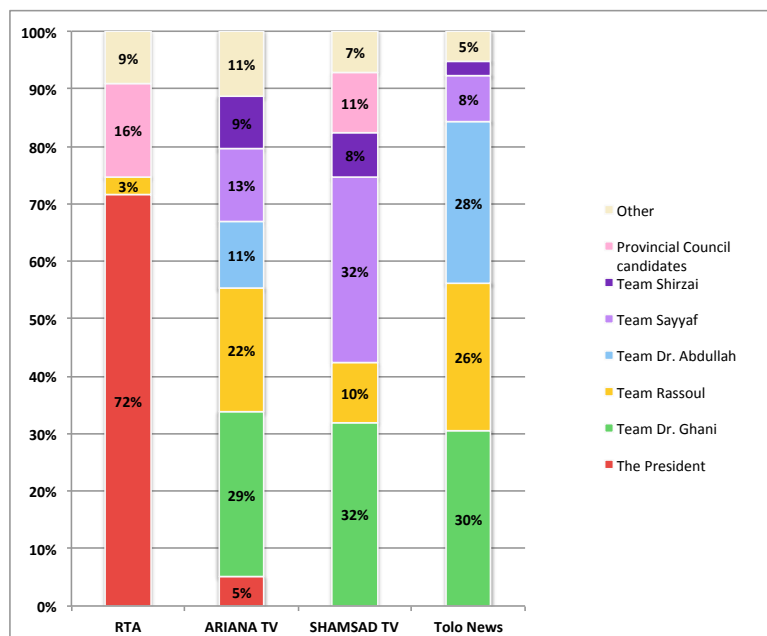

Breakdown of types of political communication in the TV channels’ prime time programming



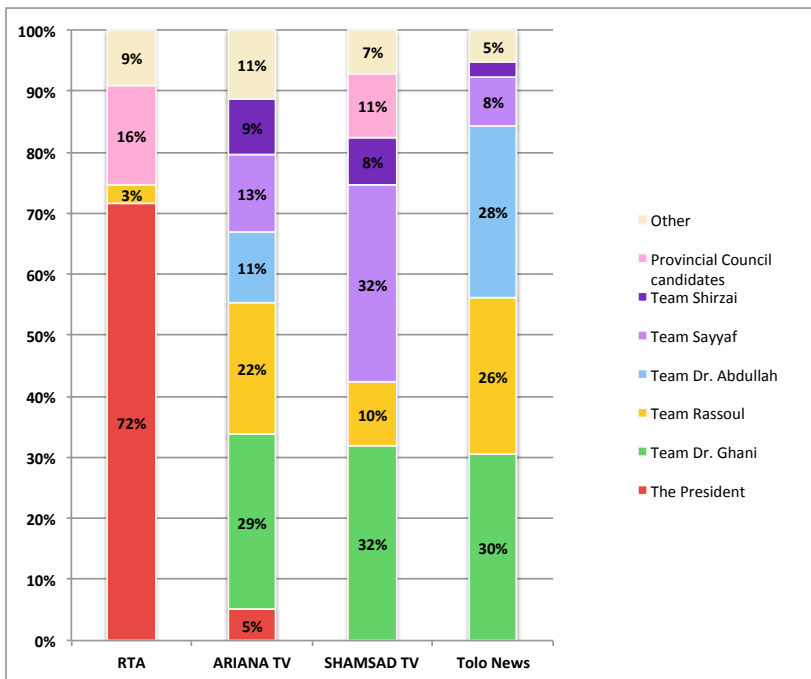

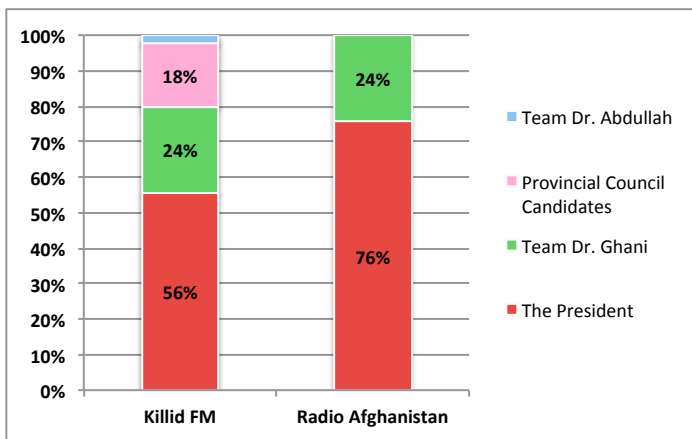
Breakdown of types of political communication in radio stations’ prime time programming

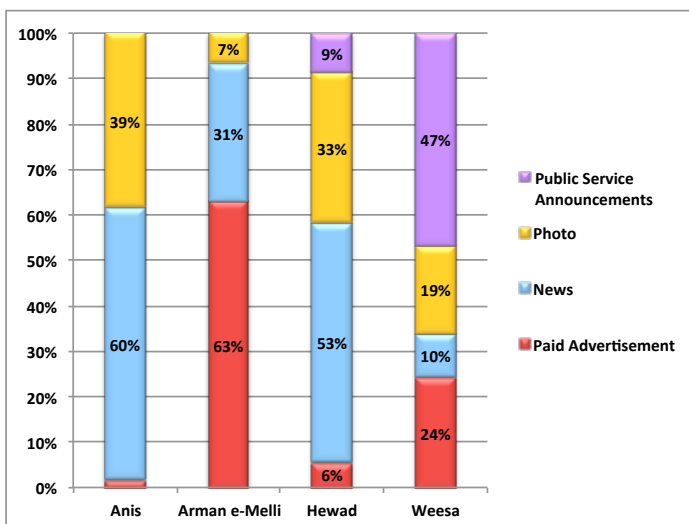

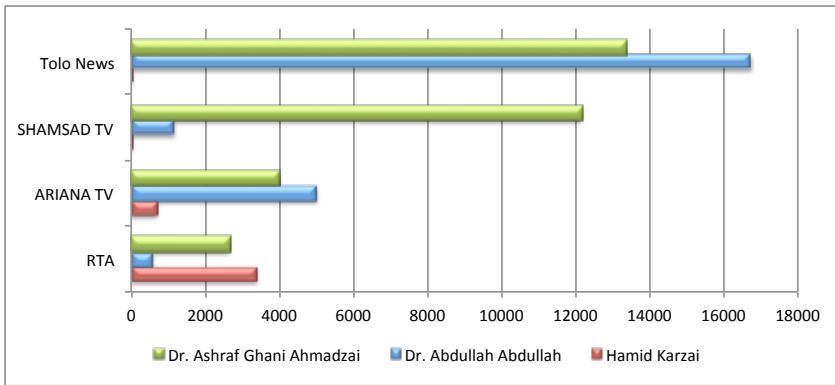
Breakdown of types of political communication in the TV channels' prime time programming

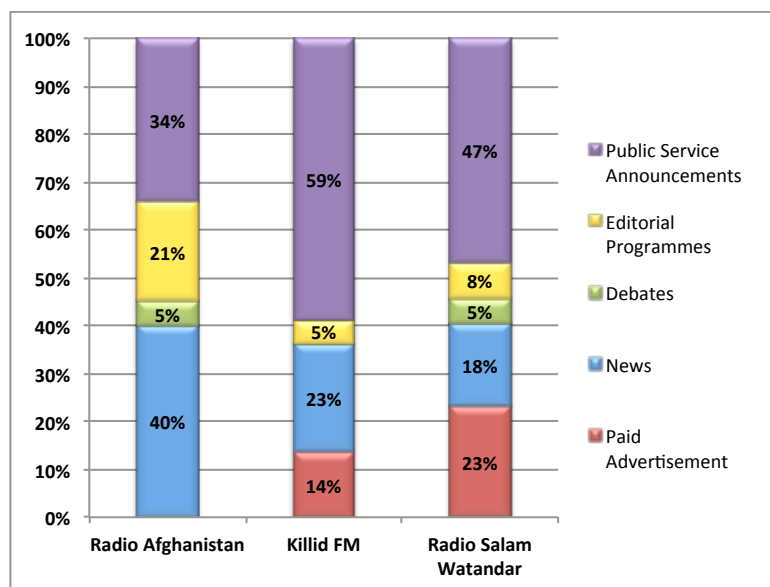

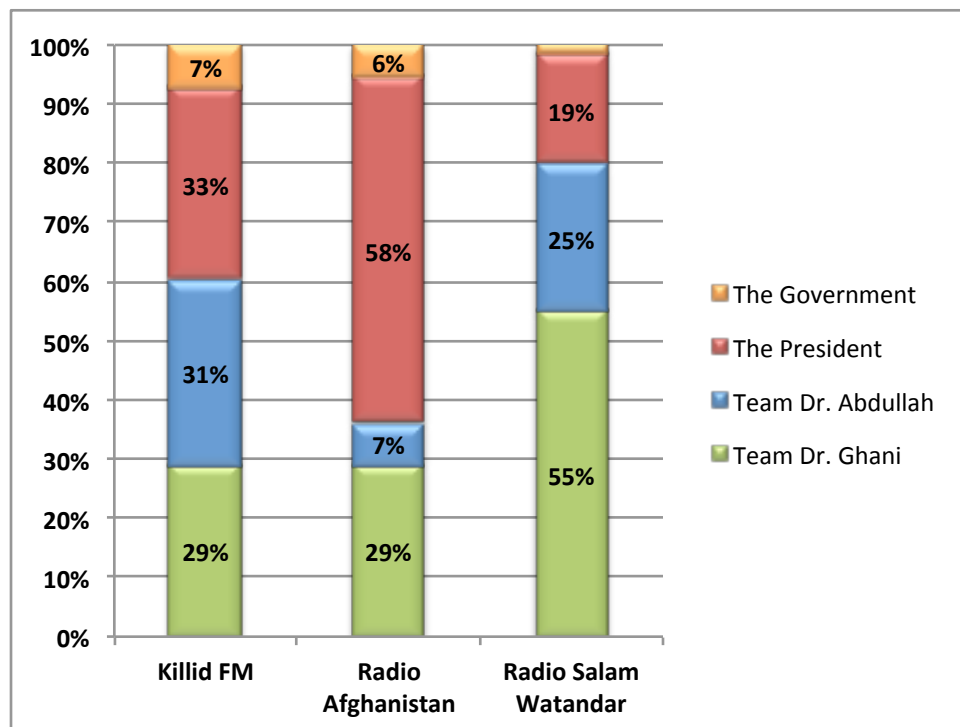

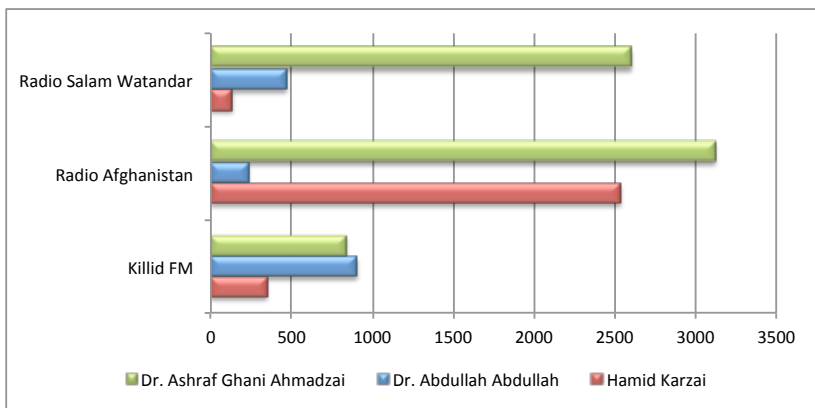
Breakdown of types of political communication in radio stations' prime time programming



Total time allocated to political actors during prime time programming (without political advertisement)

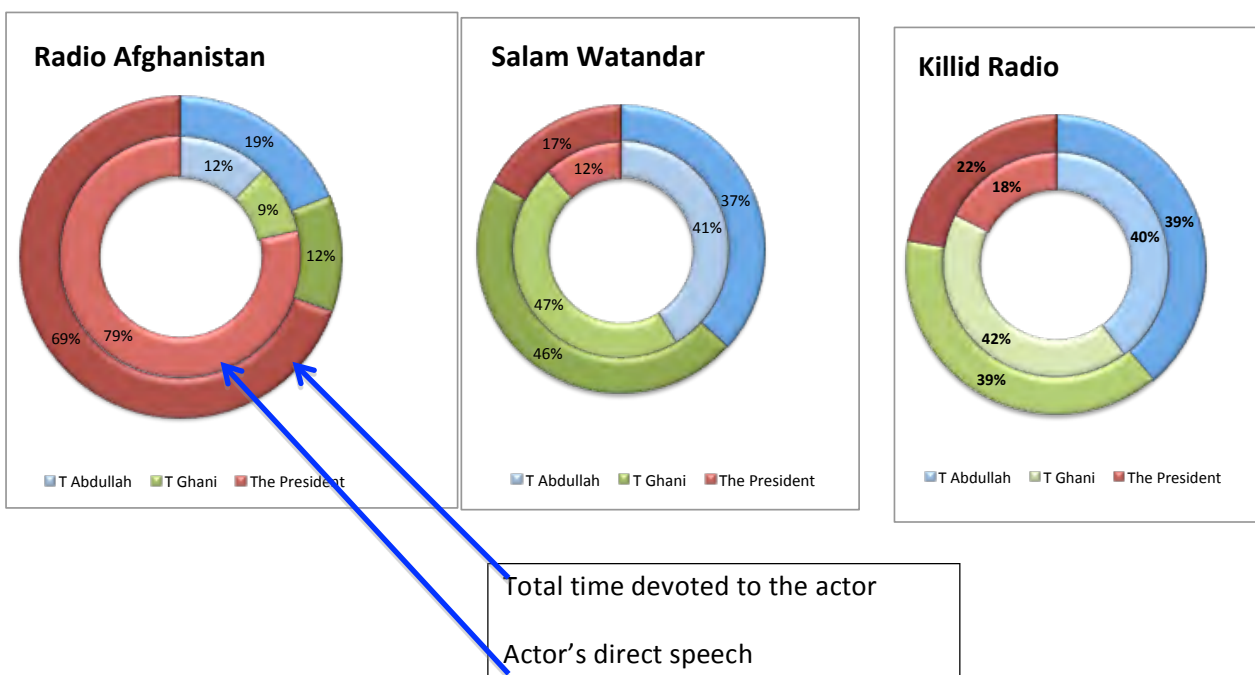


Direct speech during prime time programming – time allotted to the quotes from particular political actors

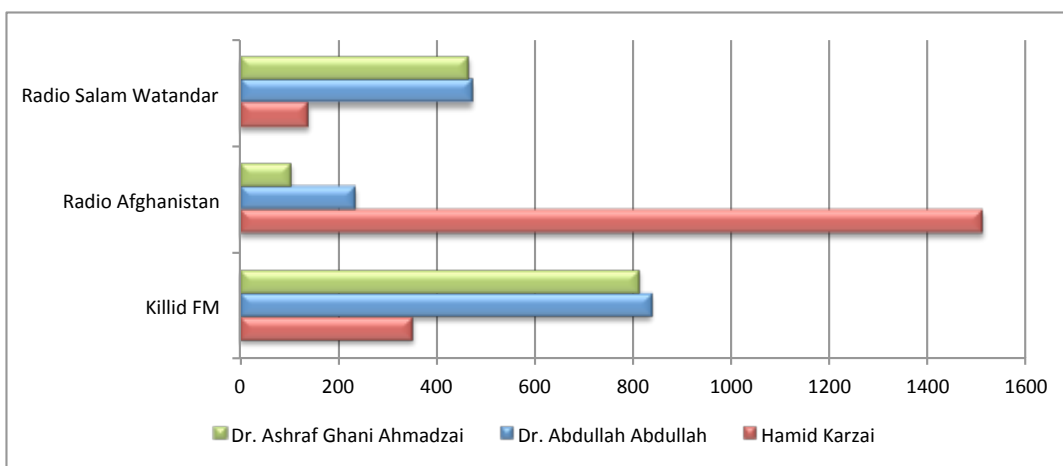

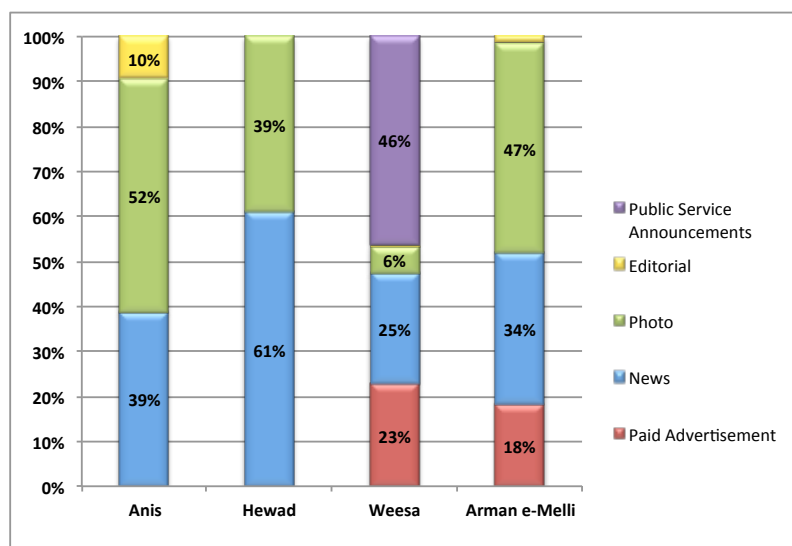

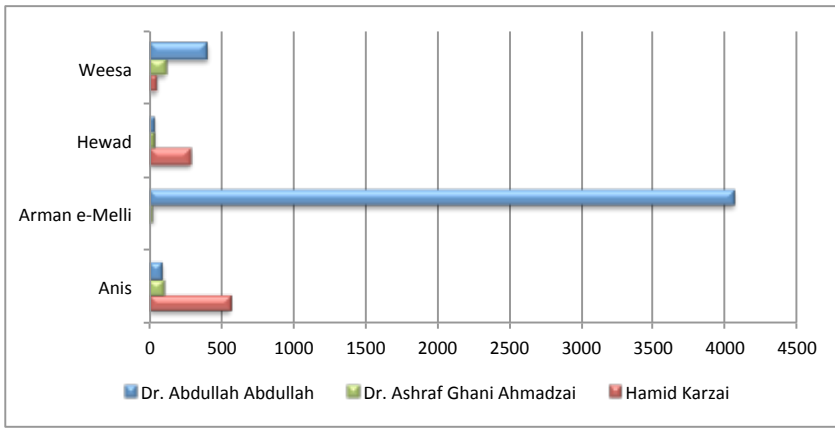
Breakdown of types of political communication in the newspapers

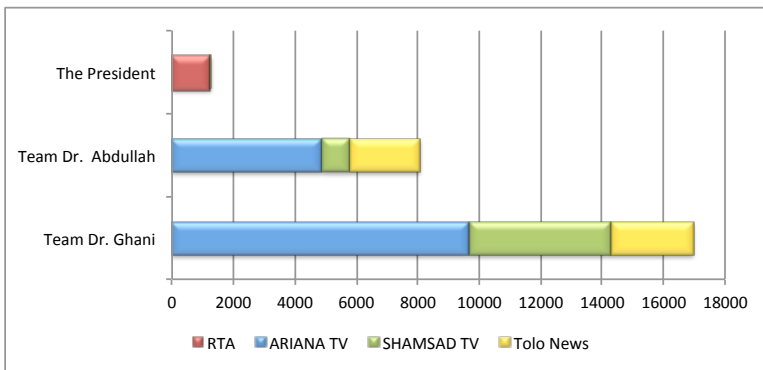
Political actors' exposure in images

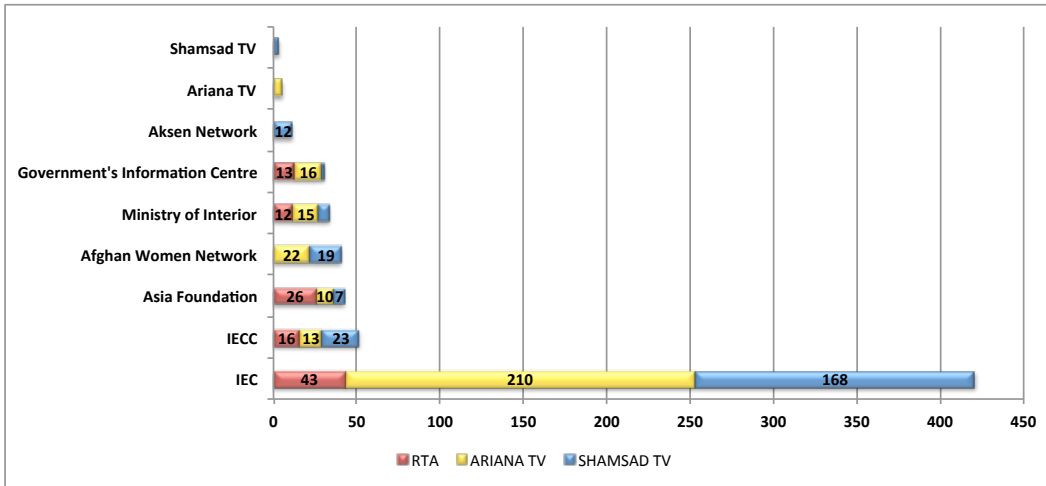

Number of the events per day



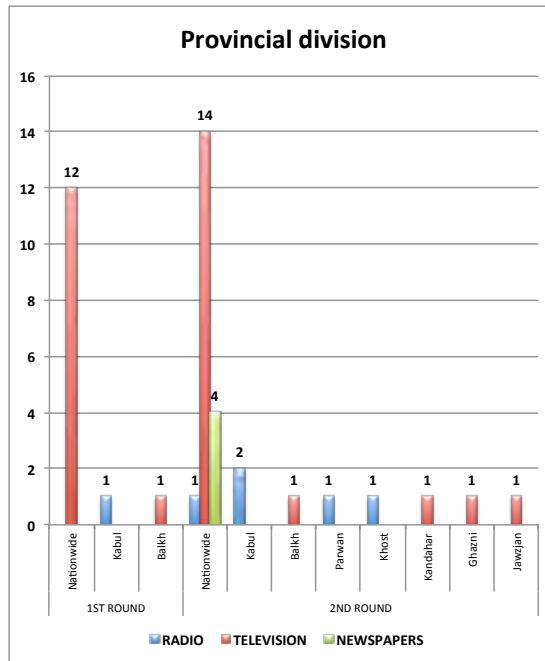
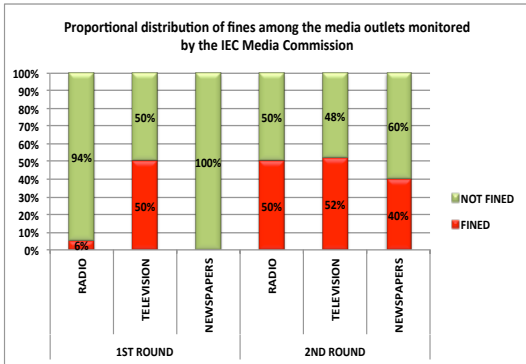
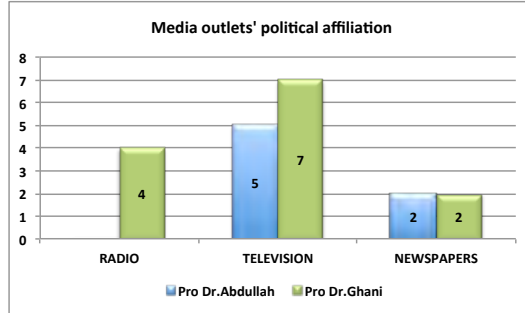
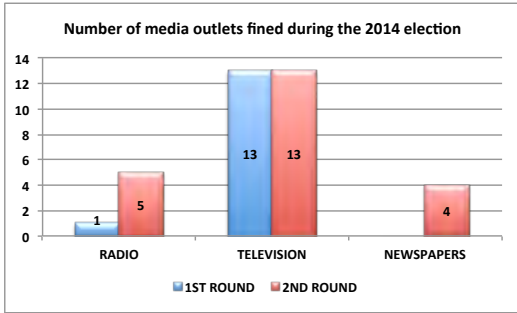
