
# Timor-Leste Population Displacements as of 14 August 2007

Announcement of new government

- ·Civil Unrest in Baucau, Dili, Lautem, Viqueque •Humanitarian assistance hampered by tense security situation
- Reports of internal displacements in Baucau and Vigueque
- Access to existing IDP camps in Dili and Baucau affected

### 9 Aug 2007

- Viqueque, over 100 houses reported burnt
  Reports of IDP gatherings with host families in public buildings and mountains in Watulari
- •Water trucking and sanitation services to existing IDP camps back to normal in Dili and Baucau

## 11 Aug 2007

- •Situation tense in Baucau, Viqueque
  •Incidents reported in Oecusse, Manufahi and Dili.
  •Reports of burnt houses increase to 270 in
- Access to displaced populations limited

### 12 Aug 2007

•Government delivers 2.7MT of rice to Viqueque and Uatucarbau by UN helicopter

- 13 August
  •Total of 323 houses reported burnt in Viqueque and Baucau
- •At least 4000 people reported displaced in Viqueque and Baucau Districts

### 14 August 2007

- •Government assessment team delivers relief items to Baucau and Viqueque Security situation limits access to
- displaced populations
