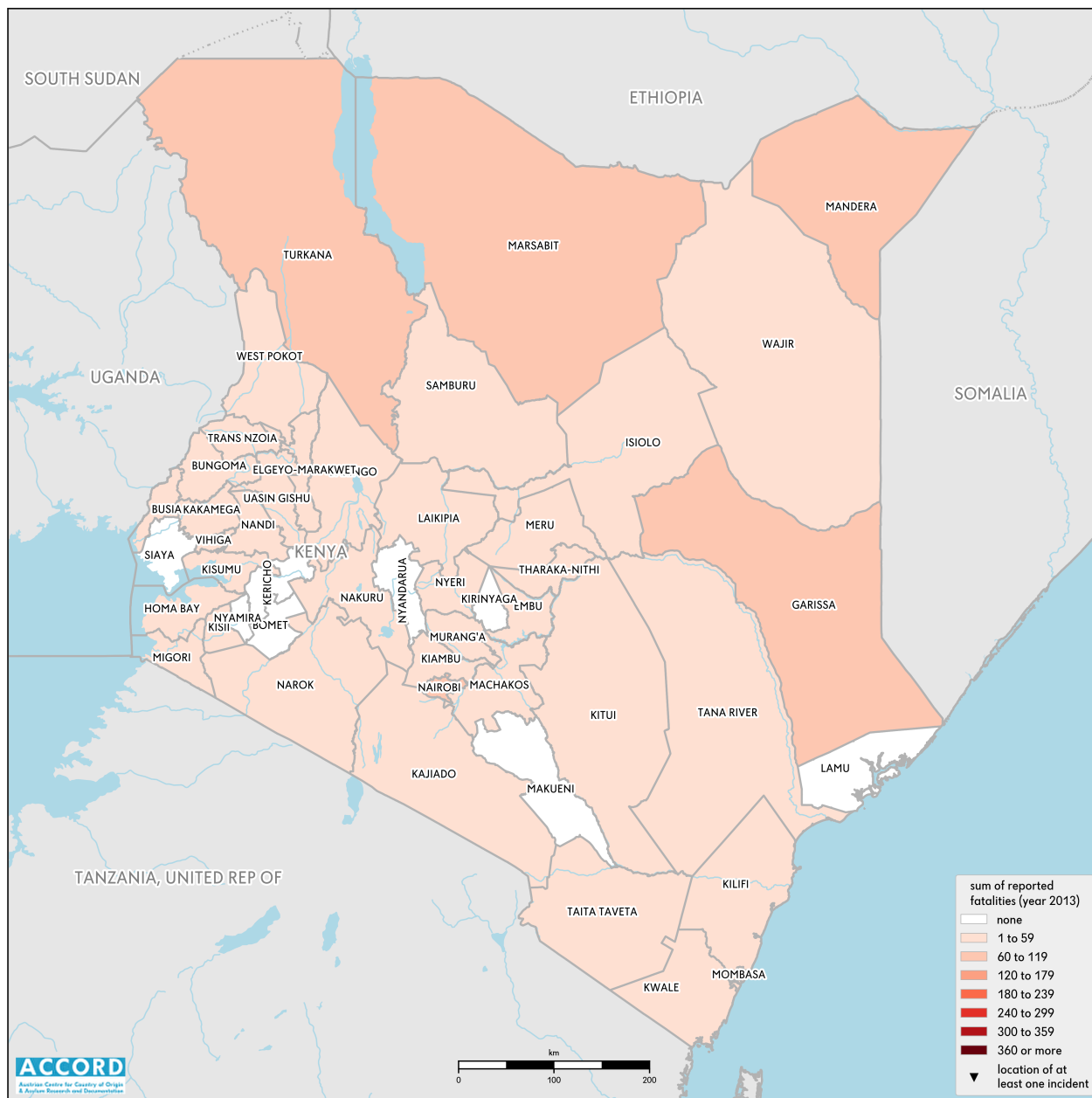

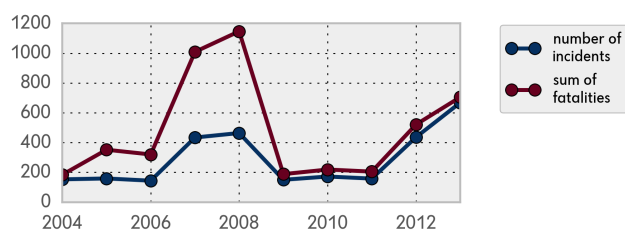

LOCALIZATION OF CONFLICT INCIDENTS

Note: The following list is an overview of the incident data included in the ACLED dataset. More details are available in the actual dataset (date, location data, event type, involved actors, information sources, etc.). In the following list, the names of event locations are taken from ACLED, while the administrative region names are taken from GADM data which serves as the basis for the map above.

In **Baringo**, 11 incidents killing 26 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Bartabwa, Kabarnet, Marigat**.

In **Bomet**, 4 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Bomet, Kaplong, Mulot**.

In **Bungoma**, 11 incidents killing 8 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Bungoma, Kanduyi, Kibabii, Kituni, Turbo**.

In **Busia**, 15 incidents killing 7 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Amagoro, Amukura, Bukhayo, Bumala, Busia, Butula, Igara, Malaba Hills, Nambale, Sirisia, Teso North, Teso South**.

In **Elgeyo-Marakwet**, 5 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: **Embobut, Iten**.

In **Embu**, 14 incidents killing 6 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Embu, Kiamuringa, Kirigi, Kiritiri, Mbeere, Mwea, Runyenjes**.

In **Garissa**, 39 incidents killing 85 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Dadaab Refugee Camp, Dagahaley Refugee Camp, Garissa, Hagadera Refugee Camp, Hulugho, Ifo Refugee Camp, Liboi**.

In **Homa Bay**, 7 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Homa Bay, Magena, Nyakweri, Oyugis**.

In **Isiolo**, 5 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Isiolo, Shimba Hills**.

In **Kajiado**, 6 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Emotoroki Borehole Number Two, Kiserian, Kitengela, Ngong, Olkaria**.

In **Kakamega**, 15 incidents killing 3 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kakamega, Liyavo, Malaha, Mumias, Shianda**.

In **Kericho**, 1 incident killing 0 people was reported. The following location was affected: **Kabirer**.

In **Kiambu**, 29 incidents killing 10 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Gathugu, Gatundu, Githurai, Gituamba, Kagaa, Kiambu, Kieni, Kikuyu Township, Kinare, Kiriko, Limuru, Ndumberi, Rironi, Ruiru**.

In **Kilifi**, 34 incidents killing 24 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Chonyi, Ganze, Kaloleni, Kilifi, Lango Baya, Malindi, Mikuyuni, Mtwapa, Mulutu, Palakumi, Shariani, Vitengeni, Watamu**.

In **Kirinyaga**, 1 incident killing 0 people was reported. The following location was affected: **Kerugoya**.

In **Kisii**, 4 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: **Keroka, Kisii, Mokubo**.

In **Kisumu**, 17 incidents killing 9 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Chemelil, Kisumu, Muhoroni, Nyakach**.

In **Kitui**, 10 incidents killing 5 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kitui, Malalani, Mugui, Mwingi**.

In **Kwale**, 19 incidents killing 9 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Diani, Kwale, Lunga-Lunga, Mariakani, Miritini, Mwaembe, Tanganyika, Tiribe, Ukunda**.

In **Laikipia**, 14 incidents killing 7 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Laikipia, Mukogodo, Mutaro, Nanyuki, Ngarua, Nyahururu, Oldoinyo Loloip, Tandar**.

In **Machakos**, 5 incidents killing 15 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Donyo Sabuk, Machakos, Nyaanyaa**.

In **Mandera**, 33 incidents killing 66 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Banissa, Bur Mayo, Fino, Karo, Lulis, Malka Mari, Mandera, Rhamu**.

In **Marsabit**, 21 incidents killing 79 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Guba, Moyale, Oda**.

In **Meru**, 4 incidents killing 3 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Meru, Tigania**.

In **Migori**, 23 incidents killing 8 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Awendo, Bondo Nyironge, Kuria, Kuria East, Macalder, Matare, Migori, Oruba, Rongo**.

In **Mombasa**, 48 incidents killing 37 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Changamwe, Kisauni, Likoni, Majengo, Mombasa, Nyali, Tononoka**.

In **Murang'a**, 13 incidents killing 8 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Gatanga, Kangare, Kangema, Karuri, Kigumo, Kiriaini, Mathioya, Muranga, Nyangiti, Wempa**.

In **Nairobi**, 101 incidents killing 116 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Dagoretti, Dandora, Eastleigh, Kahawa, Kamiti, Kangemi, Karen, Kariobangi, Kawangware, Kayole, Kibera, Korogocho, Langata, Lavington, Mathare, Mbagathi, Nairobi, Parklands, Pumwani, Uhuru Park, Umoja Inner Core, Westgate**.

In **Nakuru**, 17 incidents killing 8 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Lanet, Naivasha, Naivete, Nakuru, Rongai, Subukia**.

In **Nandi**, 3 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kapsabet, Kobujoi**.

In **Narok**, 19 incidents killing 17 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kilgoris, Melili, Naikara, Narasha, Narok, Ntulelei, Olololunga, Olpusimoru, Trans Mara**.

In **Nyandarua**, 3 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kipipiri, Ol Kalou, Shamata**.

In **Nyeri**, 16 incidents killing 2 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Gitathi-ini, Kagere, Karatina, Nyeri, Othaya, Ragati, Tambaya, Thunguma.**

In **Samburu**, 5 incidents killing 5 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Baragoi, Kiamumbi, Maralal, Nachola, Wamba.**

In **Siaya**, 3 incidents killing 0 people were reported. The following location was affected: **Siaya.**

In **Taita Taveta**, 6 incidents killing 1 person were reported. The following locations were affected: **Mwatate, Voi, Wundanyi.**

In **Tana River**, 11 incidents killing 20 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kibusu, Kipini, Nduru, Oda, Sala, Teso.**

In **Tharaka-Nithi**, 3 incidents killing 9 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kamwimbi, Kanjuki, Mutino.**

In **Trans Nzoia**, 7 incidents killing 3 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kiminini, Kitale.**

In **Turkana**, 25 incidents killing 62 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kakuma, Kalabata, Lake Turkana, Loarengak, Lodwar, Lokichoggio, Lokori, Lorumor, Nadapal, Nakwamoru, Turkwel.**

In **Uasin Gishu**, 13 incidents killing 3 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Eldoret, Karuna, Kiambaa.**

In **Vihiga**, 3 incidents killing 4 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Chavakali, Maseno, Viyalo.**

In **Wajir**, 13 incidents killing 21 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Bagala, Wajir.**

In **West Pokot**, 12 incidents killing 10 people were reported. The following locations were affected: **Kacheliba, Kapenguria, Kases, Orwa, Runo.**

METHODOLOGY

The data used in this report was collected by the Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project (ACLED). ACLED collects data on reported conflict events in selected African and Asian countries, Kenya being among them. ACLED researchers collect event data from a variety of sources and code them by date, location, agent, and event type. Based on these data, the Austrian Centre for Country of Origin & Asylum Research and Documentation (ACCORD) compiles updates on conflict incidents.

Incidents comprise the following categories: battle, headquarters or base established, non-violent strategic activities, riots/protests, violence against civilians, non-violent transfer of territory, remote violence. For details on these categories, please see

Fatality data particularly is vulnerable to bias and inaccurate reporting, and ACLED uses the most conservative estimate available.
