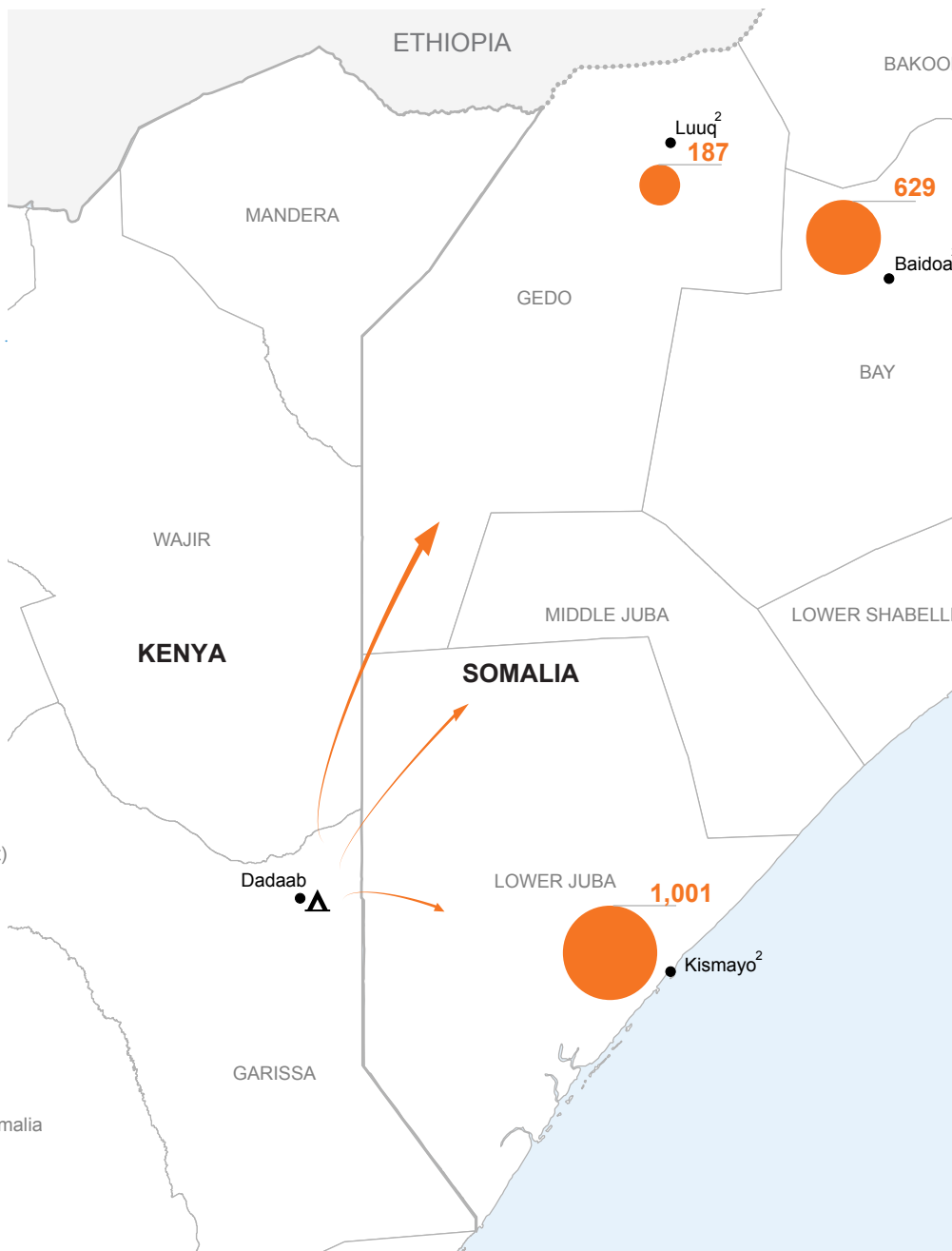


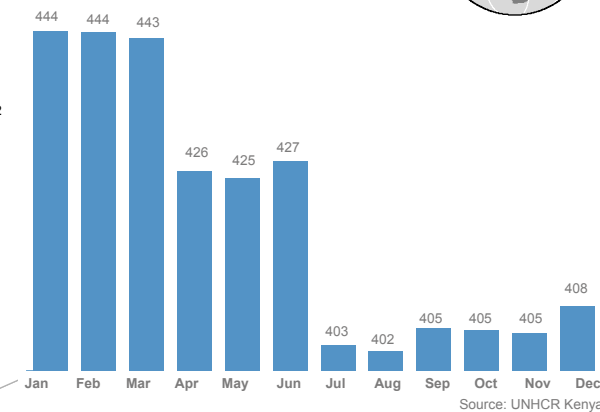

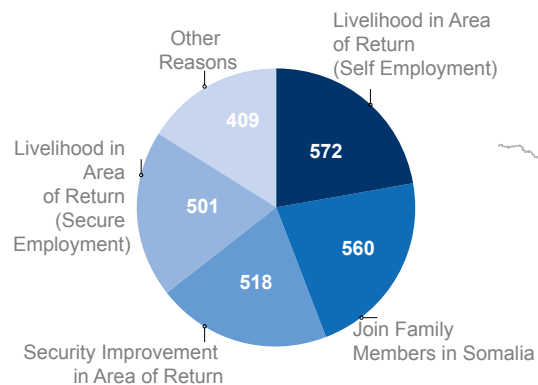
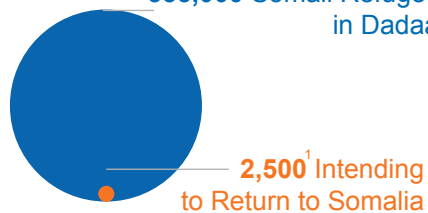

Dadaab Refugee Population³ in '000 (Jan - Dec 2013)

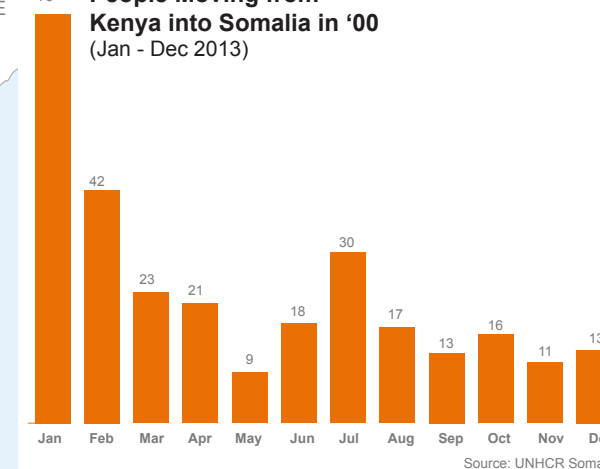

² UNHCR has identified three priority areas to which it will help Somali refugees return home from Kenya i.e. Kismayo, Luuq and Baidoa considered relatively safe for return
