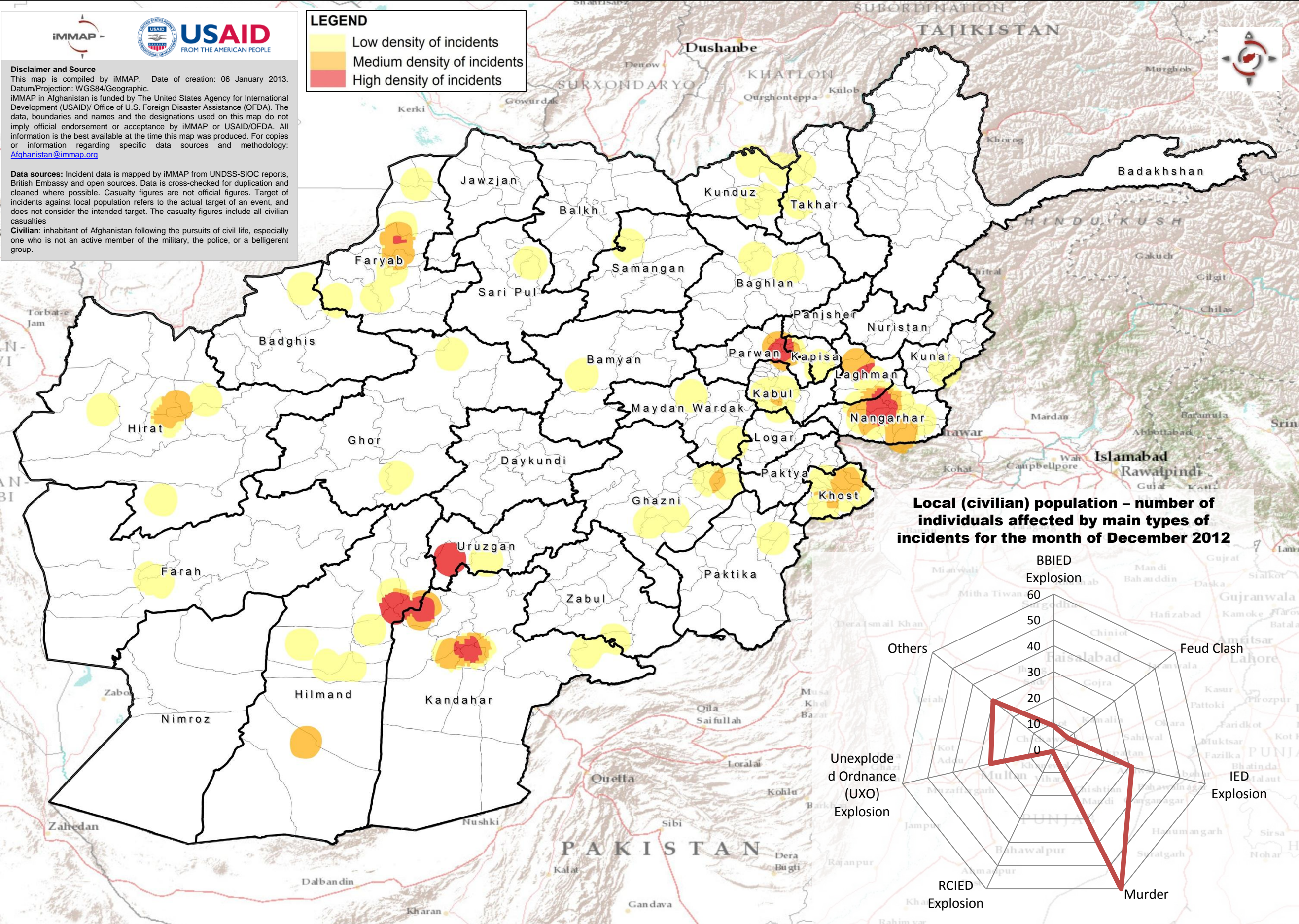

The casualty figures include all civilian casualties
