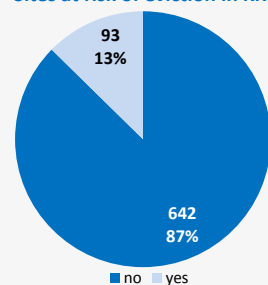

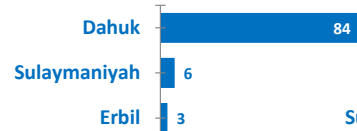

Sites at risk of eviction in KR-I

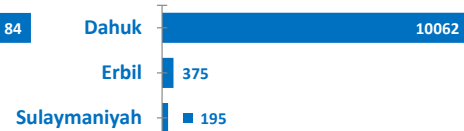


Population in informal settlements in KR-I :

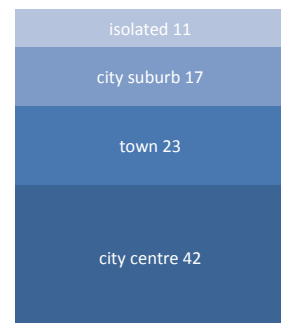
number of sites by Governorate



number of IDP individuals by Governorate



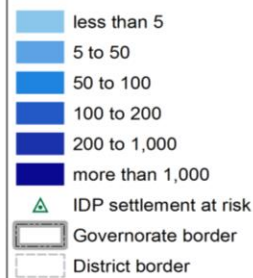
Environment of sites:



Main triggers of eviction threats:

- Absence of tenancy agreements
- Lack of money to pay rent
- Building claimed by owner for construction
- Hospitality fatigue
- Inter-community tensions

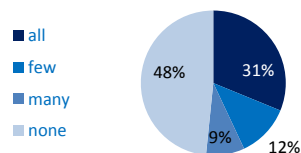
IDP population at risk of eviction
By families in district



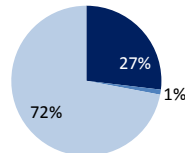

Intention of the IDPs in informal settlements at risk of eviction:

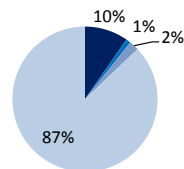
Remain at site



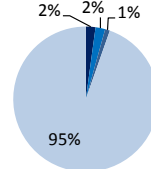
Return to area of origin

The information on KRI informal settlements was provided by IDPs only. Most of the informal settlement at risk are sites under construction, and owned by private owners.

In Kerbala, the IDPs at risk live in hotels. Their eviction was temporarily suspended until June 2015.
