
# Afghanistan Weekly Field Report



## Week of 02 to 08 April 2017



## **Countrywide Conflict Displacement**

**2016:** The total number of individuals displaced by conflict in 2016 increased to 660,672, as joint assessment teams finalise assessments of those displaced last year. This remains the highest number on record, and a 40 per cent increase on the 470,000 displaced in 2015.

**2017:** 54,455 individuals have been verified as displaced, with 25 provinces recording some level of forced displacement.

**Northern/North Eastern**: Increasing tensions between two rival parties in Faryab have prompted some families to relocate to neighbouring provinces due to fears of new clashes. In Darae-Suf-e-Bala, Samangan, 1,050 people were reportedly displaced following an NSAG attack, while in Badakhshan, 16,905 individuals are estimated to have been displaced due to fighting in Jurm, Yamgan, Warduj, Raghistan, Yawan, Argo Fayzabad and Baharak. Assessments are planned for both provinces. In 2017 so far, 12,468 verified IDPs have been displaced from the region; approximately 23 per cent of the country total.

**Southern**: During the past week, clashes continued across the region causing displacements in Kandahar, Uruzgan and Hilmand, with over 7,000 individuals reportedly displaced in Hilmand alone. With the start of the poppy harvest, however, levels of fighting have dropped slightly in recent weeks. In 2017 so far, 25,146 verified IDPs have been displaced from the region; approximately 46 per cent of the country total.

**Western**: Consistent with previous weeks a number of high profile clashes were recorded between NSAGs and government forces in Farah, Badghis and Hirat provinces with tensions escalating between rival groups in Shindand district. No displacements have been reported to date.

**Eastern**: During the past week, ANSF operations supported by international military airstrikes took place in Nangarhar, Laghman and Kunar. Cross border shelling and artillery fire also continued in Khas Kunar and Lal Pur districts of Kunar and Nangarhar. No reports of civilian casualties or displacement have been received to date.

**Central**: Fighting intensified in several provinces across the region, including Logar, Paktya, Parwan and Kapisa, and reportedly displacing 1,400 individuals in Logar and 2,800 in Paktya. In Kabul 1,085 individuals were verified as conflict IDPs from Parwan, and 700 from Baghlan. In 2017 so far, 3,797 verified

IDPs have been displaced from the region; approximately 7 per cent of the country total.

#### **Refugees and Returnees**

A total of 6,628 undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through Torkham and Spin Boldak border crossings from 2-8 April, an increase of 14 per cent from the previous week, and bringing the year total to 24,598. Since 1 January, 74,992 undocumented Afghans have also returned from Iran bringing the total returnee population in 2017 to 99,590.

UNHCR's repatriation programme resumed on 3 April. As of 6 April, 886 Afghans returned through Torkham and Spin Boldak passes. UNHCR anticipates that numbers will increase further as the weather improves in May and June.

#### Ongoing Response Activities\* (please see page 2)

**Central**: In Paktya, IRC and OHD (WFP) provided cash and food for 1,127 undocumented returnees. In Khost, ANDMA and UNICEF provided food, NFIs and hygiene kits to 294 flood affected individuals.

**North/North Eastern**: In Takhar and Badakhshan, WFP distributed a second food ration to 945 conflict IDPs. In Jawzjan, PIN and SCI distributed cash for 245 conflict IDPs and in Faryab, NRC provided assistance to 714 individuals.

**Western**: In Hirat, NRC, DRC and DACAAR provided cash and wash supplies to 217 conflict IDPs; while in Badghis, IRC and NRC provided food, NFIs and WASH supplies to 489 conflict IDPs. In Farah city, DRC and WFP supported 252 conflict IDPs with NFI kits and food assistance.

**Eastern**: The following organisations – NCRO, IRC, SCI WFP, DRA/SCI, WFP WHO, UNICEF, UNFPA, IOM, PU-AMI, UNHCR, AADA, HN-TPO, CWS and ARCS – have provided cash, NFIs, food and medical supplies to undocumented returns as well as responses to measles outbreaks and the provision of a range of health services in Laghman, Kunar, Nuristan and Nangarhar.

### **Access Constraints and Security Incidents**

**North/Northeastern:** Access to Ghormach district in Faryab province is limited due to ongoing conflict and the presence of NSAGs.

**Southern:** WFP food distributions are on hold in Uruzgan following the looting by unknown gunmen of their partner warehouse where food items for 8,232 conflict IDPs were being stored.

**Western:** On 2 April in Badghis, unknown assailants threw a hand grenade into the compound of NGO Voice of Women Organization (VWO); no casualties were reported.

**Eastern**: On 03 April, in Dehbala, Nangarhar NSAGs attacked a secondary school destroying the building. The school had been closed prior to the attack.
