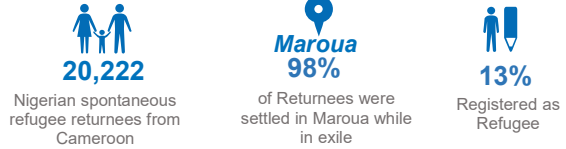


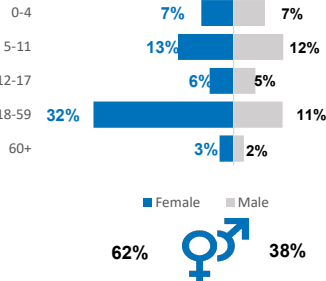
This document provides overall information on Nigerian Spontaneous Refugee Returnees from Cameroon for advocacy, operational planning and targeted assistance. The registration procedure is being conducted by the Nigeria Immigration Service (NIS) with the support of UNHCR at the main entry points.

From January 2019 to 30 April 2020, **8,589** Households of **20,222** of Nigerian spontaneous refugees returnees were registered and the majority were returning from **Maroua Region**.

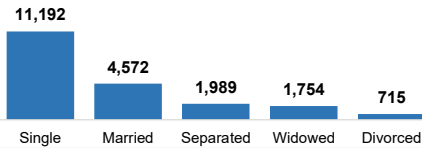

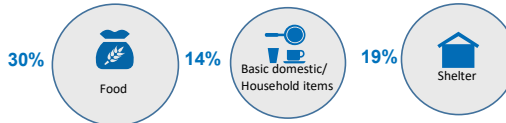

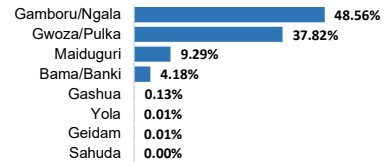

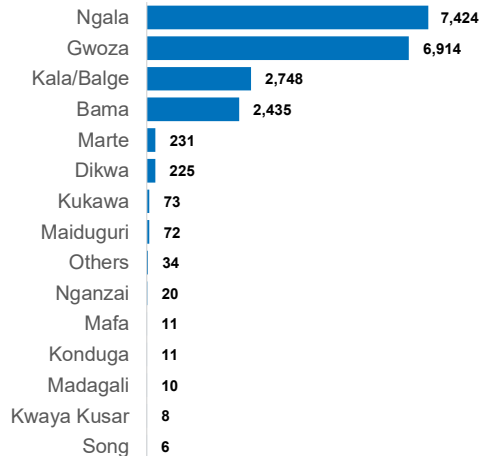

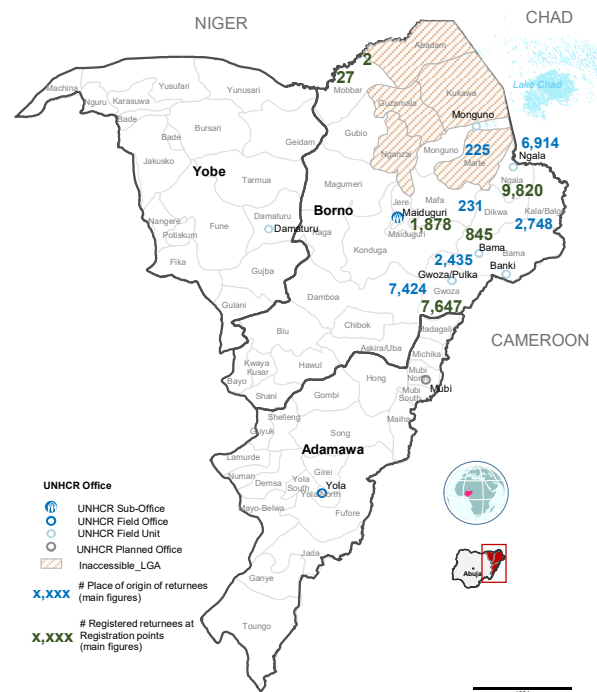
REGISTRATION PLACE/RETURN



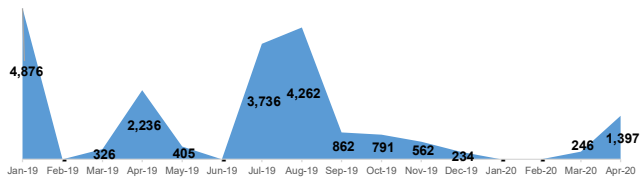
PLACE OF ORIGIN

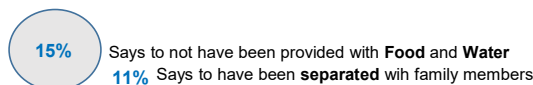

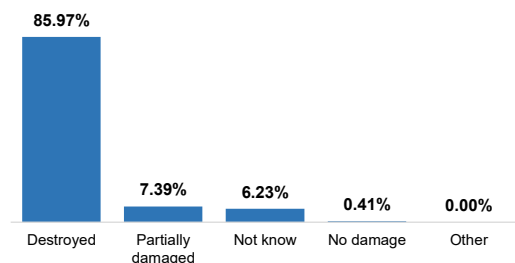
