Child protection (CP) actors in Afghanistan provided 357,376 children (girls:178,598 & boys:178,778) and 249,437 adults (women 128,049 & men 121,338) with CP services during the period of lan to Nov, 2020. This included 182,821 children and care givers who received psychosocial and mental health support services; 3,974 unaccompanied, separated and children facing other protection risks who received integrated case management services; 569 child beneficiaries of community reintegration services and 395,581 children & adults benefitted from awareness raising on protection of children, child rights, stress management, positive parenting and positive coping mechanism




Response Progress/Coverage Map
