





Number of persons brought into formal contact with the police and/or criminal justice system because they have been suspected of, arrested for or cautioned for trafficking in persons, 2014 – 2018





Number of persons prosecuted for trafficking in persons, 2014 – 2018





Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, 2014 – 2018












Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, 2017 – 2018




Number of victims of trafficking in persons detected, by age and sex**, 2014 – 2018

Number of victims of trafficking in persons detected, by form of exploitation**, 2014 – 2018







Number of persons persecuted for trafficking in persons, by sex, 2017 - 2018







Number of victims of trafficking in persons detected, by age and sex, 2014 – 2018





Citizenships of persons identified as victims of trafficking in persons by state authorities, 2017 – 2018 (Tot=134)









Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, by sex, 2014 – 2018








Citizenships of persons identified as victims of trafficking in persons by state authorities, 2014 – September 2017








Number of cases of trafficking in persons recorded, 2014 – 2018






Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, by sex, 2017 – 2018







– Hungary –

The current legislation on trafficking in persons in Hungary covers all forms of trafficking indicated in the UN Trafficking in Persons Protocol. Section 192 of the Criminal Code, amended as of July 2020, specifically criminalises trafficking offences.

The Office of the Prosecutor General issued a new position paper in relation to human trafficking in 2018. In accordance with the paper, considering that a victim in a vulnerable position cannot give a valid consent to a crime violating their human dignity, personal freedom, the proceedings initiated for pandering should be reviewed and, if necessary, prosecuted for the crime of human trafficking. Proceedings already underway for pandering were reviewed by prosecutors with the option to issue related (investigative) instructions to authorities to examine the possibility of prosecution for trafficking instead of pandering.

The Criminal Code was amended in March 2020 (together with the Child Protection Act, the Organized Crime Act, and the Act on Minor Offences). Under the new legislation, the violation of prohibition of offering sexual services is not punishable if the offender has not reached the age of 18 at the time of the commission of the act, and therefore no infringement proceedings can be initiated against them. A child who violates the prohibition to offer sexual services is considered a suspected victim of human trafficking and is provided with special placement in a child protection institution. The Penal Code merged the facts of trafficking in human beings and forced labor, increased the penalties and made using a service provided by a victim of trafficking in human beings and forced labor punishable.

















Number of victims of trafficking in persons detected, by form of exploitation, 2014 – 2018











Number of pretrial investigations initiated, 2017 - 2018






Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, by sex, 2014 – 2018






Citizenships of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, 2017 – 2018 (Tot=70)



















Number of persons prosecuted for trafficking in persons and related offences, by sex, 2014 - 2018





Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons and related of fences, by sex, 2014 - 2017






Citizenships of persons convicted of trafficking in persons and related offences, 2018 (Tot=47)










Number of persons prosecuted for trafficking in persons, by sex, 2014 – 2018















Identified victims of trafficking, by type of trafficking, 2017–2018









Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, by sex, 2014 – July 2017
















Number of persons convicted of trafficking in persons, by form of exploitation, 2017 - 2018



Number of victims of trafficking in persons detected, by age and sex, 2014 – 2018




