

# Aegean Islands Weekly Snapshot

#### **Arrivals**


This week, 46 people arrived on the Aegean islands, an increase from last week's 5 arrivals but a decrease from last year's 51 arrivals, during the same period.

The average daily arrivals on all islands this week equaled 7, compared to 1 in the previous week.

### **Entry Points by Sea**

Lesvos received the highest number of arrivals (36), followed by the Dodecanese islands (10). Samos and Chios received no arrivals.



This week, 239 refugees and asylum-seekers, once authorized by the authorities, departed from the Aegean islands to the mainland.


## Present Population on the Islands

Some 13,000 refugees and asylumseekers reside on the Aegean islands. Of those, 10,000 (77%) reside in the permanent and temporary Reception and Identification Centers (RICs).

The majority of the population on the Aegean islands are from Afghanistan (50%), Syria (15%) and Somalia (8%).

Women account for 21% of the population, and children for 26% of whom nearly 7 out of 10 are younger than 12 years old.

Approximately 7% of the children are unaccompanied or separated, mainly from Afghanistan.
