

Community engagement

One of the central aims of CCCM is to enable affected populations to play an active role in the decision-making processes that affect them. CCCM activities will ensure populations have the space to voice their opinions, participate in service delivery and get direct feedback from service providers.

- CCCM partners meet regularly with community representatives in sites to gain feedback on services and insights on the well being of the site residents.
- Awareness raising activities are organized on a daily basis across displacement sites key messages pertaining to service accessibility and operations in sites.
- Last month, 78 cases were registered in the complaint and feedback mechanism. 73 per cent were closed.
- CCCM participated in community engagement with the host community neighbouring the Nicavaco relocation site prior to the movement of people to the new site.
- Focus Group Discussions were held with populations to understand their opinions about participation prior to the set up of women's and disability inclusion committees up in the relocation sites of Nglane(1 group) and Ntocota (2 groups)

Site development

CCCM partners provide site planning, development and upgrades to sites to ensure they are safe and meet the needs of site residents.

- The improvement works of the 4 community alpendres built in March in Mapupulo (one per each area of the sites: Piloto, Ntele, Expansao, Namputo) were finalized. The alpendre should work as a gathering point for the committees and a safe space where to discuss issues pertaining the life of the site and common challenges.
- CCCM supported the relocation of 500 households in Metuge, from Nangua temporary site to Nicavaco relocation site
- CCCM supported the relocation of 279 households in Ancuabe, from host communities to the relocation site Nanjua A
- Site clearance, plot demarcation and allocation was conducted in Montepuez, in the sites of Ntele, Ujama, Mararanje, and Mirate
- Site clearance, plot demarcation and allocation continued in Ancuabe, in the sites of Natove, Cujupane, and Nanjua A

Coordination and Information management

CCCM partners provide site level coordination and information so that service providers responding in sites and settlements can ensure sustained emergency responses for affected populations that meet minimum standards without duplication of activities.

- The CCCM cluster keeps an updated Master Site list with names and locations of known IDP sites across the region.
- A Service mapping of partners at site level is available for 14 sites. The service mapping shows which partners are providing services in which sites.
- Coordination meetings with service providers working in displacement sites is held every Tuesday
- Site monitoring is being conducted by CCCM teams across sites in Cabo Delgado (Metuge, Montepuez, Chiure, Ancuabe, Balama) as well as particular sites in Nampula province.
- Partners coordination meetings are taking place twice per month with all implementing partners in 25 de Junho

Disability Inclusion

CCCM is working closely with the disability working group to ensure operations include a lens of inclusivity. This includes developing guidelines to engage with persons with disabilities through community governance structures as well as monitoring activities against the Camp Management Standards Disability Inclusion Checklist.
