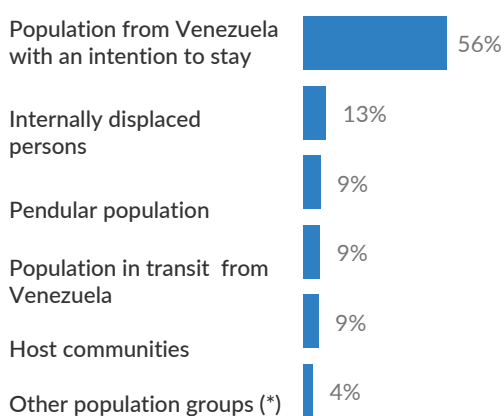

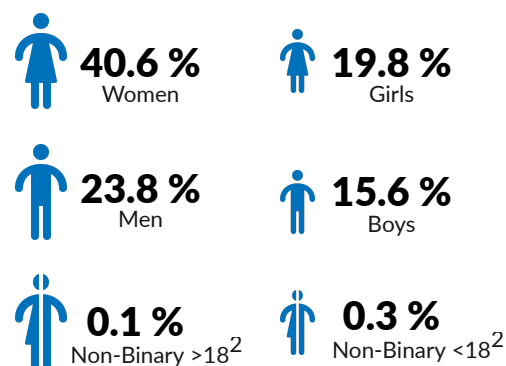

Efforts were also made to empower communities, and strengthen the capacity of local and national institutions to provide protection and assistance.

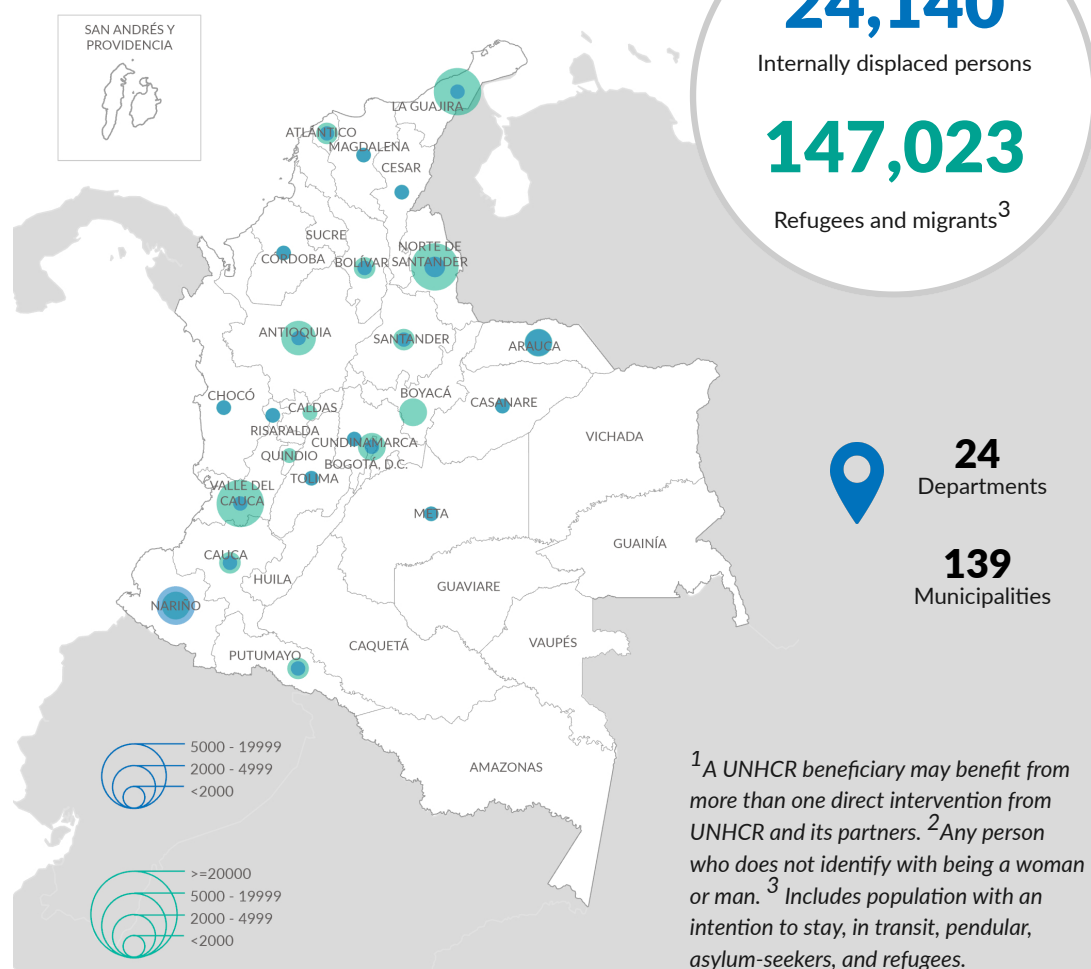
UNHCR Beneficiaries

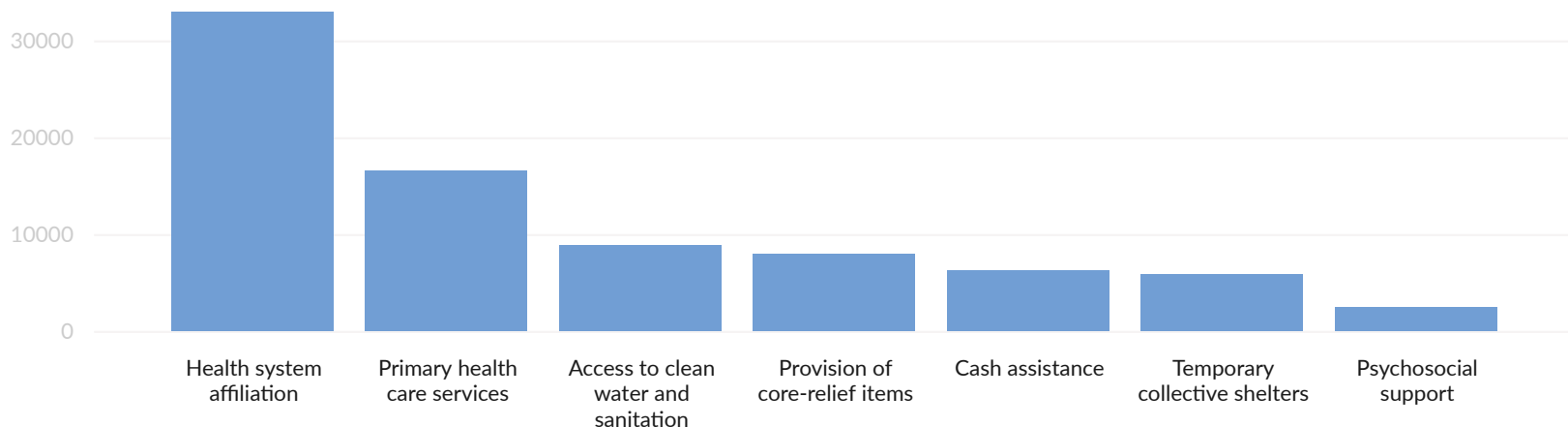

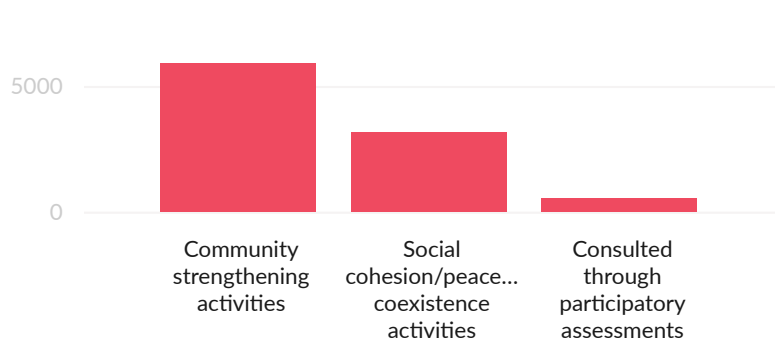

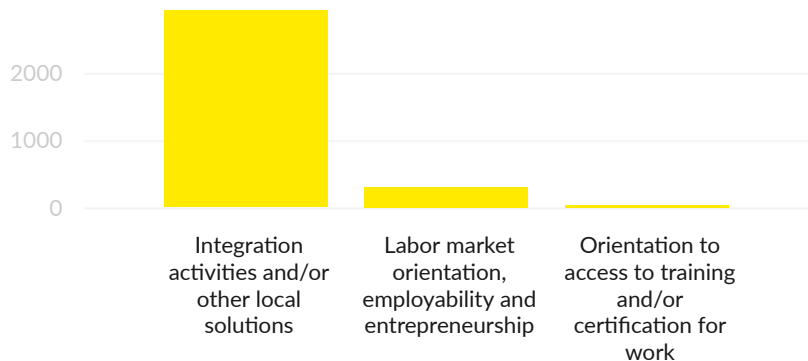
