

## Community engagement

During the month of April, CCCM partners facilitated committees meetings at site level across all sites in Ancuabe, Chiure, Metuge and Montepuez. IOM CCCM created a site management committee in Massasse site (Montepuez). Moreover, training on PSEA has been delivered to women and disability inclusion committees in 5 sites in Metuge.

The AVSI CCCM team facilitated CM coordination meetings in Campona, Marcuni, Massingiri, Ntele and Nicuapa sites in Montepuez. The CM agency conducted door to door GBV sensitization campaign in 4 sites, reaching 1,675 individuals.

Following the election of a new leadership in Nandimba (Mueda) in April, the SI CCCM team created a Site Management Committee. This committee was trained on 18/05. Terms of Reference of the committee and the Code of Conduct were discussed and finalized with committee members.

UNHCR presented the Site Management Committee Training package to the Site Management team in Mueda with the aim of facilitating capacity development for the community structures.

During the month of May, 345 CFM cases were filed, for a total of 2,540 cases. Out of the 345 cases received, 64% were request for assistance, 31% complaints, 2% feedbacks, 2% request for information and 1% reported rumors. A total of 70 per cent of the cases received in April were closed within the same month. Of this 93 per cent were closed after referral and 7 per cent were closed at site. Most of the cases were related to the NFI sector (30%) and FLS (20%) followed by WASH (12%).

### Coordination and Information management

The CCCM cluster keeps an updated Master Site list with names and locations of known IDP sites across the region.

Coordination meetings with service providers working in displacement sites have been held on a bi-weekly basis in Metuge, Montepuez, Mueda and Nampula (Corrane site).

The AVSI CCCM Team conducted and completed a Household level survey in Campona, Marcune, Massingiri, Nicuapa and Ntele sites in Montepuez, assessing the needs of 1,522 families across the sites. The CM agency will produce and share a report with the key findings of the assessment.

IOM CCCM carried out a shelter assessment with Ayuda en Accion in all sites managed by the CM agency in Metuge. The aim of the assessment was to identify shelters with damaged tarps to enhance the coordination of response of shelter partners at site level. The team also participated in a meeting organized by district authorities in Metuge. The meeting was focused on how to support IDPs that have returned to their areas of origin.

During the month of May, the Solidarites International CCCM team organized a coordination meeting with Education and Child Protection actors in Mueda and SDPI. In the meeting, it was discussed how to avoid duplication of activities in sites as overlaps were identified. Moreover, SI CCCM continues to coordinate with SDPI in allocating plots in Nandimba and Lianda.

All Camp Management agencies supported service providers in the coordination of distributions in sites with CCCM presence.

### Site development

During the reporting period, SI CCCM coordinated the distribution (completed) of NFI and Shelter kits in Nandimba in order to support the construction/reinforcement of 1000 shelters in the site. The distribution of kits was combined with daily mobilization by the CCCM team to give advice to households on the process of making the roof with the tarpaulin and building mud wall and a family latrine on each plot. In subsequent monitoring, nearly all households were able to complete the construction of their shelter. The second water point was connected to the FIPAG network throughout the month of May. Through the two water points, the supply of water is abiding by minimum standards in Nandimba.

In the month of May, IOM CCCM completed the installation of 20 solar street-light in Naminawe.

AVSI CCCM completed the mapping of available spaces for construction of children's playground, landfill and public toilets for porch in Campona, Marcune, Massingiri, Nicapa and Ntele (Montepuez). In Nacopo, a new access road to the site has been cleaned.

As requested by the local government in Mueda, UNHCR supported a review of the site plans and site designs for the 4 sites of Lyanda, Nadimba, E. Mondlane, and Mpeme. The new site plans have been shared with the respective CCCM partners in the district.

### Relocation activities

Linked to site development activities, CCCM supports local authorities and partners to safely relocate IDPs from congested host communities and flood prone areas.

The CCCM Cluster supports the Government of Mozambique (GoM) in ensuring standards are respected before, during and after relocation. Cluster partners contribute to these operations through the provision of logistics support and guidance. Moreover, community engagement and sensitization is implemented alongside the relocation activities in each phase of the IDP movement.

No relocation has been supported by the CCCM Cluster partners in the month of May.
