

About the child protection response

The CP AoR members work to prevent and respond to abuse, neglect, exploitation and violence against children affected by conflict and natural hazards induced displacement as well as children in host communities, through strengthening of child protection systems including the social service workforce; provision of child protection individual services such as case management, family tracing and reunification, alternative care, and individual mental health and psychosocial support; strengthening family and caregiving environments through structured parenting programs; and strengthening community-based child protection structures to empower communities to participate in and take greater ownership of child protection and to promote community-based and sustainable solutions.

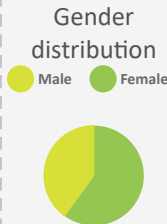
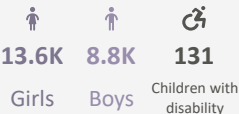

Case management

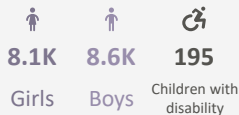
CASE MANAGEMENT (EXCLUDING FTR)

In 2021, 22 400 vulnerable and at-risk children were reached across 29 woredas in 9 regions through case management services, including identification, documentation and referral to specialised services such as medical support, interim care, mental health and psychosocial support, etc.

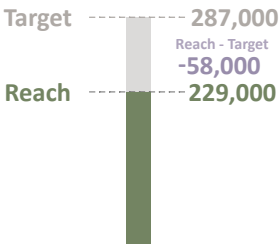
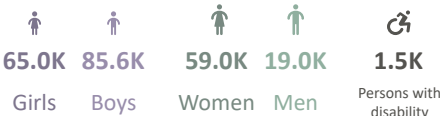
A total of 16 700 unaccompanied and separated girls (8100) and boys (8600) were identified and documented in 2021. Over 3000 children were reunified with their caregivers or placed in alternative care arrangements. The low reunification rate, especially in the Northern regions, results from intensified conflict in the second half of the year, as well as challenges with access to cash, fuel and communication in Tigray particularly.

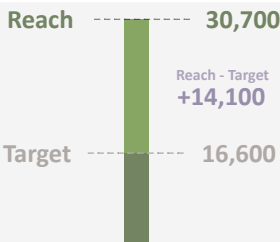
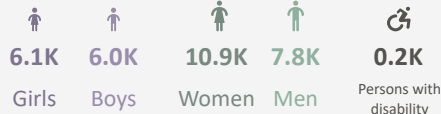
CHILD PROTECTION MENTAL HEALTH AND PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT (MHPSS)

MHPSS services were provided to 229 000 children and caregivers across the targeted woredas. MHPSS activities mainly include level 2 community and family support to recovery, well-being and resilience, and referral to level 3 and level 4 focused and specialised services.



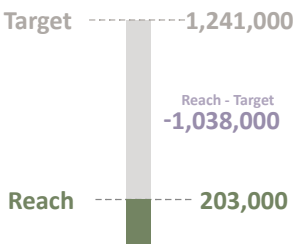
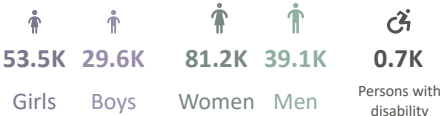
CAPACITY BUILDING

Child protection partners provided capacity building to 30,700 community members (55 % female; 45 % male), including to child protection case workers, frontline service providers as well on child protection risks, as well as identification and prevention of the risks and referral of girls' and boys' survivors to specialised services. Child protection case workers were specifically trained on the national case management framework, as well as Family tracing and reunification and alternative care provision.

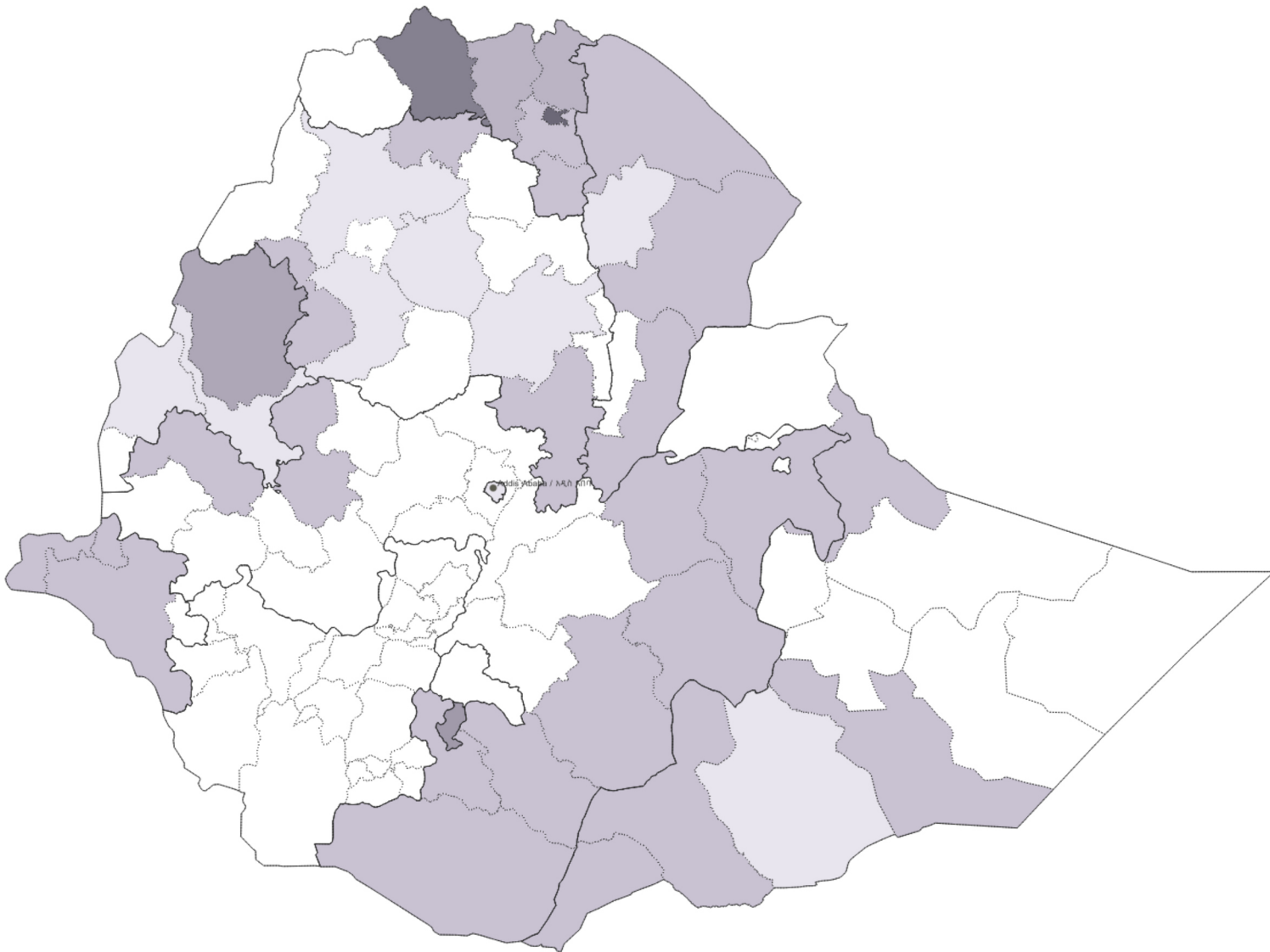


AWARENESS RAISING FOR PREVENTION AND RISK MITIGATION

In 2021, 203,000 individuals were reached across eight regions with sensitisation messages and communication on Child Protection issues including risk education, prevention of separation, prevention of violence.

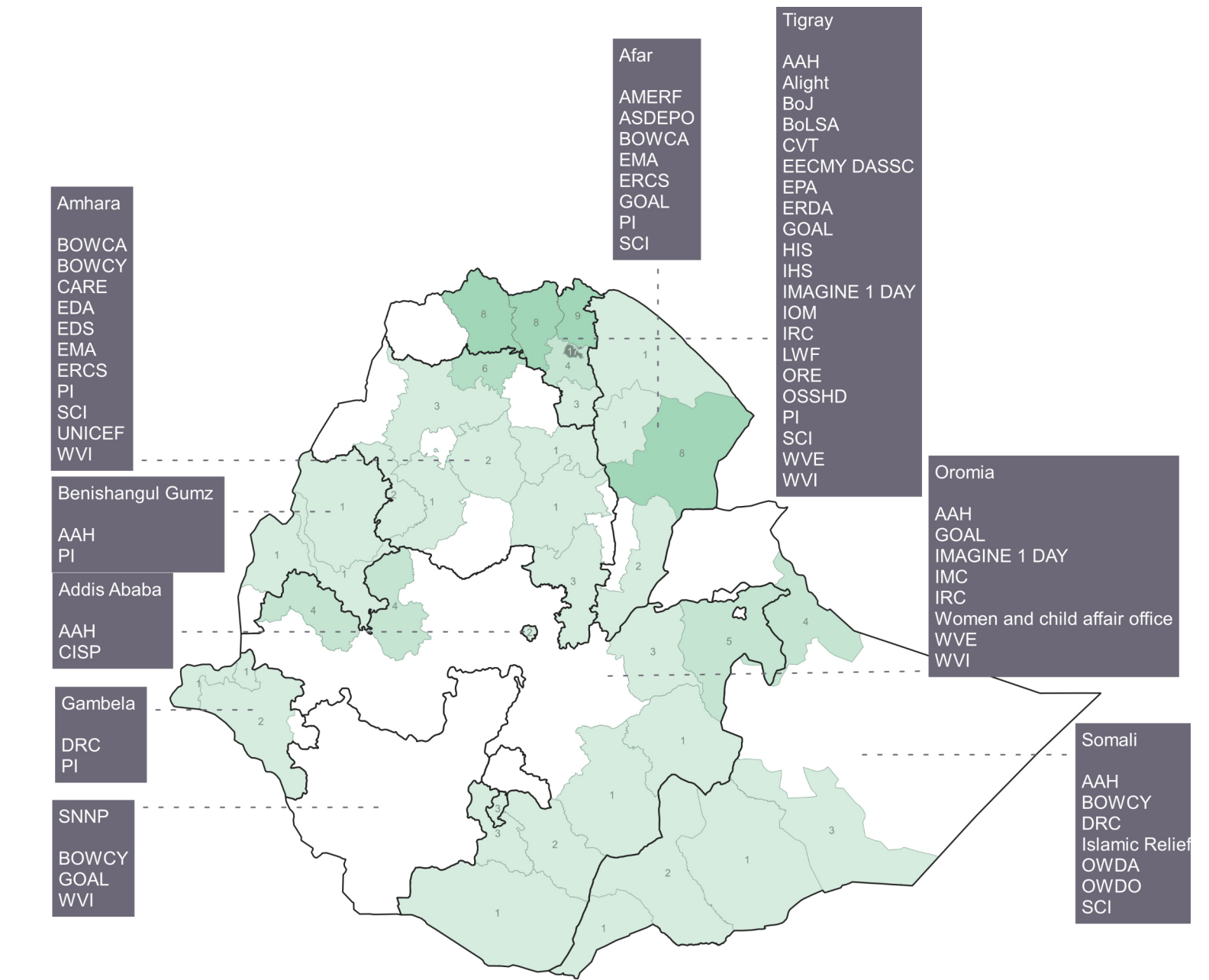

Implementing partners per region and # of partners per zone



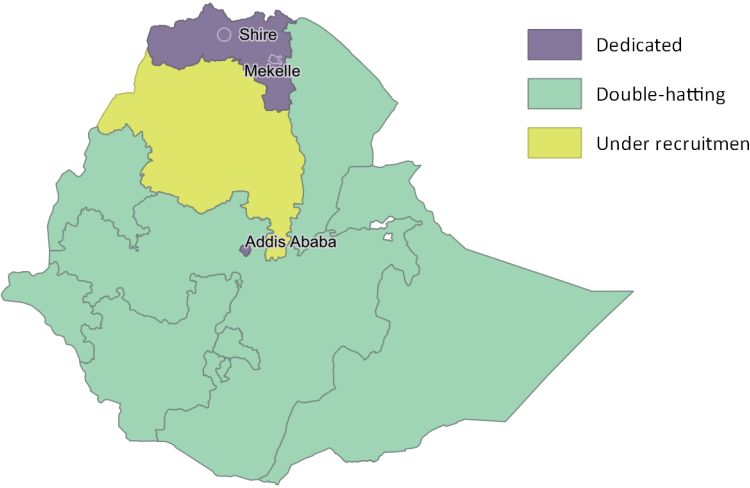

Coordination

The Child Protection Area of Responsibility (CP AoR) in Ethiopia is comprised of approximately 25 organisations including, UN, INGO, NNGO, Donors, and Government entities. The AoR is activated in eight regions in Ethiopia , in addition to the national coordination in Addis Ababa.

Challenges in 2021

- Intensified conflict in the second half of the year in the northern regions hampered the provision of CP services due to lack of access.
- Operation constraints in Tigray, including lack of cash, means of communication and fuel, led partners to discontinue the provision of some CP services.
- Limited funding for the sector: Only 24 per cent of the 2021 HRP financial requirement was met.
- Limited presence of child protection actors with capacity in child protection in emergencies and a weak coordination capacity on the sub-national level
