

Refugee Returnees (2014 - 2022)


Since December 2014, 92,957 Somali refugees have voluntarily returned to Somalia with UNHCR assistance from different countries of asylum including Kenya, Yemen, Djibouti, Libya, Sudan and Eritrea. In addition, some 42,677 Somalis were monitored as arriving from Yemen since March 2015











July 2022 displacement reasons Drought **84,**000








