- USAID/BHA Assistant to the Administrator Sarah Charles announced nearly \$376 million in additional USG humanitarian funding for the Venezuela Regional Crisis on September 22 on the margins of UNGA.
- The UN released the 2022 HRP for Venezuela on August 15, requesting \$795 million in 2022 funding to reach 5.2 million of the people in need with humanitarian assistance.
- Migrants continue to attempt crossing the Darién Gap despite extensive protection risks and natural hazards.

KEY DEVELOPMENTS

USG Announces More Than \$376 Million for Venezuela Regional Crisis

USAID/BHA Assistant to the Administrator Sarah Charles announced nearly \$376 million in additional U.S. government (USG) humanitarian funding for the Venezuela regional crisis, including more than \$194 million from USAID/BHA and more than \$181 million from State/PRM on September 22. The additional humanitarian funding will enable USG partners to provide critical aid, such as food assistance, health services, nutrition support, and protection to vulnerable Venezuelans inside Venezuela, as well as migrants, refugees, and host community members across 17 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC). The contribution brings total USG funding for the humanitarian response to the Venezuela regional crisis to more than \$2.3 billion since 2017.

UN Releases 2022 Venezuela HRP, Requesting \$795 Million

The UN released the 2022 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) for Venezuela on August 15, following significant delays reaching consensus with the regime of Nicolás Maduro. The 2022 HRP requests \$795 million in funding to provide humanitarian assistance to 5.2 million of the 7.7 million people in need, an increase of nearly 700,000 people compared with the 4.5 million people targeted for assistance in the 2021 HRP. The response plan prioritizes Venezuela's Amazonas, Apure, Bolívar, Delta Amacuro, Falcón, Miranda, Sucre, and Zulia states for assistance due to the elevated emergency food, health, and nutrition needs of the states' populations. Prior to the release of the HRP, the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) Under-Secretary-General and Emergency Relief Coordinator Martin Griffiths visited Venezuela from July 29 to August 1 to meet with Maduro regime representatives, national and international non-governmental organizations (NGOs), UN agencies, and the Unitary Platform—a Venezuelan opposition political alliance—to discuss humanitarian assistance in the country and advocate for the release of the HRP.

Venezuelan Migration Through the Darién Gap Increases During 2022

The Government of Panama's National Migration Service has reported an increase in the number of migrants transiting through the Darién Gap—a dangerous corridor connecting Colombia's Chocó Department and Panama's Darién Province—in 2022. The Office of the UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) reports more than 133,700 migrants transited the Darién Gap in 2021. Comparably, as of August of this year, more than 102,000 had already transited through the Darién Gap with an estimated 200,000 migrants expected to cross by the end of the year, according to the UN agency. Migrants continue to cross despite serious dangers along the route, including a lack of food and supplies, natural hazards, and significant protection risks. Residents in the surrounding area estimate that as many as one-third of migrants who attempt to cross the Darién Gap do not survive the journey.

Government of Ecuador Launches Migrant Regularization Process

The Government of Ecuador (GoE) launched the first phase of its new migrant regularization process. The process aims to expand the protection of Venezuelan migrants and refugees in Ecuador, where more than 500,000 Venezuelans were residing as of August, according to the Regional Coordination Platform for Refugees and Migrants for Venezuela (R4V). On September I, the GoE opened online registration to an estimated I20,000 Venezuelans who entered Ecuador through formal entry points, as well as unaccompanied minors regardless of their migration status, enabling individuals to qualify for an initial I80-day residency permit, apply for a two-year temporary residency visa, and receive protection from deportation, State/PRM reports. The GoE plans for this regularization process to follow a similar process conducted between 2019 and 2020, when the GoE issued more than 56,000 temporary residency visas to Venezuelans. State/PRM partners—International Organization for Migration (IOM) and

the UNHCR—are providing ongoing support to the GoE throughout this process.

Quito Process Member States Sign Joint Declaration Reaffirming Commitment to Migrants and Refugees

On July I, the I3 member states of the Quito Process—the platform through which countries across the LAC region coordinate the response to the Venezuela regional migration crisis—unanimously signed the eighth Joint Declaration of the Brasilia Chapter, which reaffirms the commitment to migrants and refugees outlined in the previous Quito Process Joint Declarations. The member states also committed to exchange best practices to address the needs of approximately 5. I million Venezuelan migrants and refugees, as well as vulnerable households in host communities, across LAC countries. Further, the joint declaration defines member states' commitments to improve support for host communities and Venezuelan migrants, including through access to asylum, family reunification, human trafficking prevention, migratory regularization, orientation programs, temporary reception centers, protection of adolescents and children, and socioeconomic integration.

USAID/BHA Partners Provide Food Aid to Vulnerable Venezuelans

USAID/BHA implementing partners continued to provide food assistance to vulnerable individuals across the region and in Venezuela during the month of July. In Colombia, USAID/BHA partner the UN World Food Program (WFP) assisted more than 317,000 vulnerable Colombians and Venezuelan migrants with food assistance and socioeconomic integration during the month. WFP also provided livelihood support to 1,500 small producers during the month to advance the Government of Colombia's efforts to strengthen food security. In Ecuador, WFP provided food vouchers to more than 57,300 migrants, refugees, and host community members in July. Additionally, WFP distributed hot meals to approximately 5,600 migrants, refugees, and host community members in 16 Ecuadorian provinces and provided more than 4,600 migrants in transit with a one-time voucher to buy food at local supermarkets in July.

In Venezuela, USAID/BHA implementing partners provided food assistance to 203,000 people in 1,700 schools across Venezuela's Anzoátegui, Barinas, Falcón, Monagas, Sucre, Trujillo, and Yaracuy states during July. Of those who received assistance, 155,200 were children younger than six years of age, 9,800 were students with disabilities, and 38,000 were school personnel.

FOOD SECURITY

USAID/BHA assistance aims to address acute food insecurity among vulnerable Venezuelans inside Venezuela, as well as migrants, refugees, and host community members in Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru. Inside Venezuela, USAID/BHA is funding NGO and UN partners to provide cooked meals and in-kind food assistance. Across the region, USAID/BHA-funded emergency food assistance includes cash transfers for food, cooked meals, food kits, food vouchers, and complementary nutrition and water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) support. In total, these programs aim to reach approximately 1.5 million people in Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru and more than 100,000 people in Venezuela. USAID/BHA also contributes to coordination and capacity-building activities for food security actors to improve the quality of humanitarian programming for the

Venezuela regional crisis.

HEALTH

USAID/BHA has provided approximately \$24 million to NGO and UN partners in Venezuela to provide life-saving health care services to vulnerable Venezuelans in FY 2022. With USAID/BHA support, partners continue to distribute medical supplies, provide services at health facilities, and train community health workers to address urgent health needs. With FY 2022 funding, USAID/BHA partners will provide over 764,500 people with improved access to health care services. Additionally, State/PRM partners—including IOM, Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) and UNHCR—continue to support essential health interventions for Venezuelans residing in 17 LAC countries, including Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru.

WASH

USAID/BHA and State/PRM continue to support WASH programming to address the needs of vulnerable Venezuelans and to prevent the spread of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and other communicable diseases. With support from State/PRM, R4V partners aim to reach nearly 1.1 million people with WASH assistance across the region in 2022. In addition, USAID/BHA has provided more than \$31.5 million in FY 2022 funding to several relief agencies to implement critical WASH activities inside Venezuela; activities include distributing personal protective equipment and training local health care workers to respond to cases of COVID-19, conducting hygiene awareness sessions, rehabilitating WASH infrastructure in schools, and installing handwashing stations at community kitchens.

ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND MARKET SYSTEMS

With approximately \$13.5 million in FY 2022 funding for economic recovery and market systems programming, USAID/BHA partners in Colombia are providing household financial instruction and literacy training for Venezuelan migrants and refugees, with an emphasis on improving food security outcomes. Partners are also offering assistance on small-scale business management and market analysis trainings, financial services, job search support, saving groups, and skills building.

State/PRM partners in Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru support economic recovery by strengthening livelihood opportunities and socioeconomic integration among vulnerable Venezuelans, providing training and resources to enable the adoption of sustainable entrepreneurship and employment strategies. State/PRM partners provide Venezuelans across the region with business development training; employment and vocational training; language training; registration and technical assistance for work permits; technical skills certifications; business development training; and the provision of seed capital and cash assistance via bank transfers, prepaid cards, and mobile money platforms.

PROTECTION

State/PRM and USAID/BHA support 30 partners to address protection concerns among nearly 1.3 million vulnerable Venezuelans in Venezuela and across the region, particularly along the Colombia-Venezuela border and in the Caribbean where protection services are especially limited. State/PRM-supported protection activities aim to increase access to and support the provision of protection services, including, child-friendly spaces, community-based mental health and psychosocial support, gender-based violence prevention and case management, and legal assistance. State/PRM partners also work with the broader humanitarian community across the region to support advocacy efforts with local and national authorities and promote the delivery of protection services in areas with significant humanitarian access constraints.

CONTEXT IN BRIEF

- Deteriorating economic and political conditions in Venezuela have decreased households' access to food, health care, and livelihoods; contributed to increasing humanitarian needs; and triggered an outflow of Venezuelans into countries across LAC, primarily to Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru. By August 2022, more than 6.8 million Venezuelans were living outside of Venezuela, according to R4V.
- The influx of Venezuelans continues to strain services, especially in border areas of Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru. Assessments indicate that food, health care, protection, and WASH support are among the most urgent humanitarian needs among vulnerable populations, including Venezuelans, Colombian returnees from Venezuela, and host communities.
- On April 16, 2018, USAID activated the Venezuela Regional Crisis Response Management Team (RMT) in Washington, D.C., to coordinate USG regional humanitarian efforts. On June 7, 2018, USAID activated the Venezuela Regional Crisis Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) to support delivery of life-saving assistance across the region.
- In addition to providing support for ongoing response activities, USAID/BHA and State/PRM staff throughout the region and in Washington, D.C. monitor the humanitarian situation in close coordination with relevant donor governments, host governments, NGOs, and UN counterparts.
