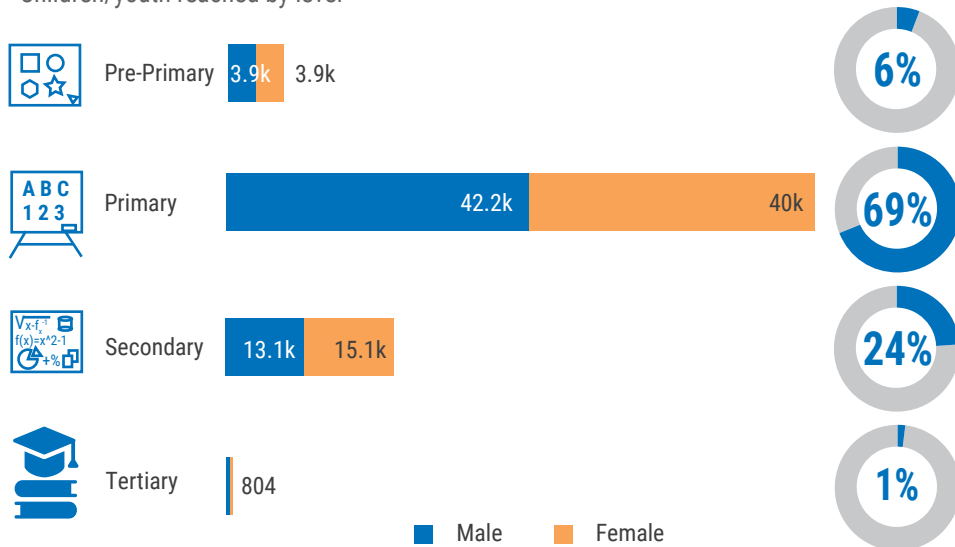

UNHCR'S EDUCATION RESPONSE AND ASSISTANCE

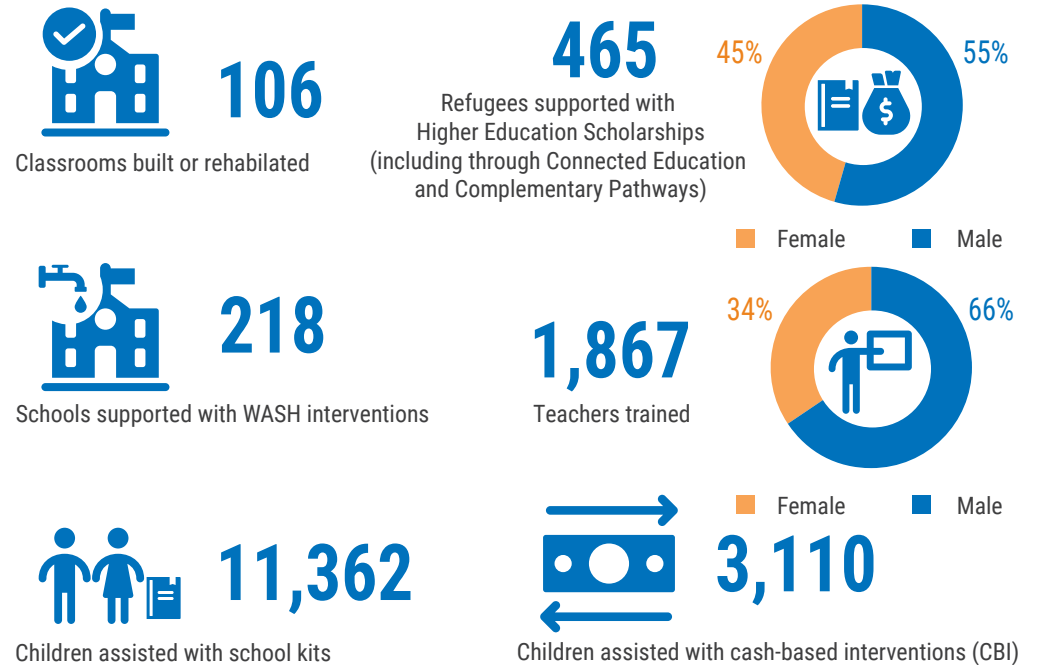
Children/youth reached by level

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Thanks to support from Education Cannot Wait, Educate a Child, and CERF, remedial classes were organized for over 5,000 refugee and host-community children across all intervention zones in Chad, including newly arrived Central African, Sudanese, and Cameroonian refugees, to help improve students' level and support their integration into the Chadian education system.
- A total of 2,465 refugees in urban areas, including 1,323 primary students, 868 secondary students, and 274 tertiary students received cash-based interventions to enroll in public and private universities of their choice across Chad.
- During the national secondary examinations at the end of the 2021/2022 school year, 1,657 refugees (60% girls) passed the Brevet exam to validate their lower-secondary education and 733 refugees (58% women) obtained the Baccalaureate certificate to validate their upper-secondary education, rendering them eligible for tertiary studies in Chad. This represents 118 more Brevet students and 117 more Baccalaureate students than the 2020/2021 school year.
