

Response to displacement linked to AA-Tatmadaw conflict (Jan - Dec 2022)

In Rakhine State, 77,501 people are displaced in 11 townships and 9,059 people are displaced in Paletwa township in Chin State, total is 86,560 people, due to the AA-Tatmadaw conflict, including 15,543 individuals that are newly displaced in Mrauk-U, Kyautaw, Sittwe, Myebon, Minbya, Maungdaw, Rathedaung, Buthidaung, Ponnagyun, Pauktaw and Paletwa townships as of 5 January 2023.

In collaboration with partners and other UN agencies, UNHCR is responding to the humanitarian needs and continues to provide assistance to affected communities.

From January to December 2022, UNHCR provided core relief items, emergency shelter support, dignity kits and cloth masks to some 33,124 individuals in Mrauk-U, Myebon, Kyauktaw, Minbya, Ponnagyun, Sittwe, Ann, Pauktaw, Buthidaung and Rathedaung townships.


105 field visits have been conducted, access to some sites remains limited, particularly in more rural areas, a situation which has been further exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

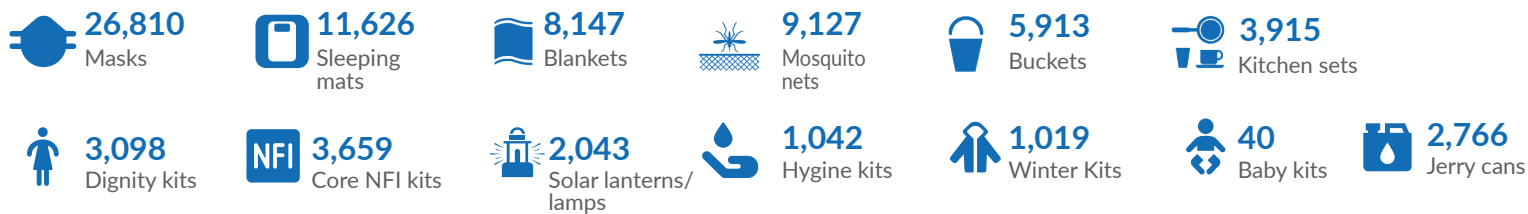

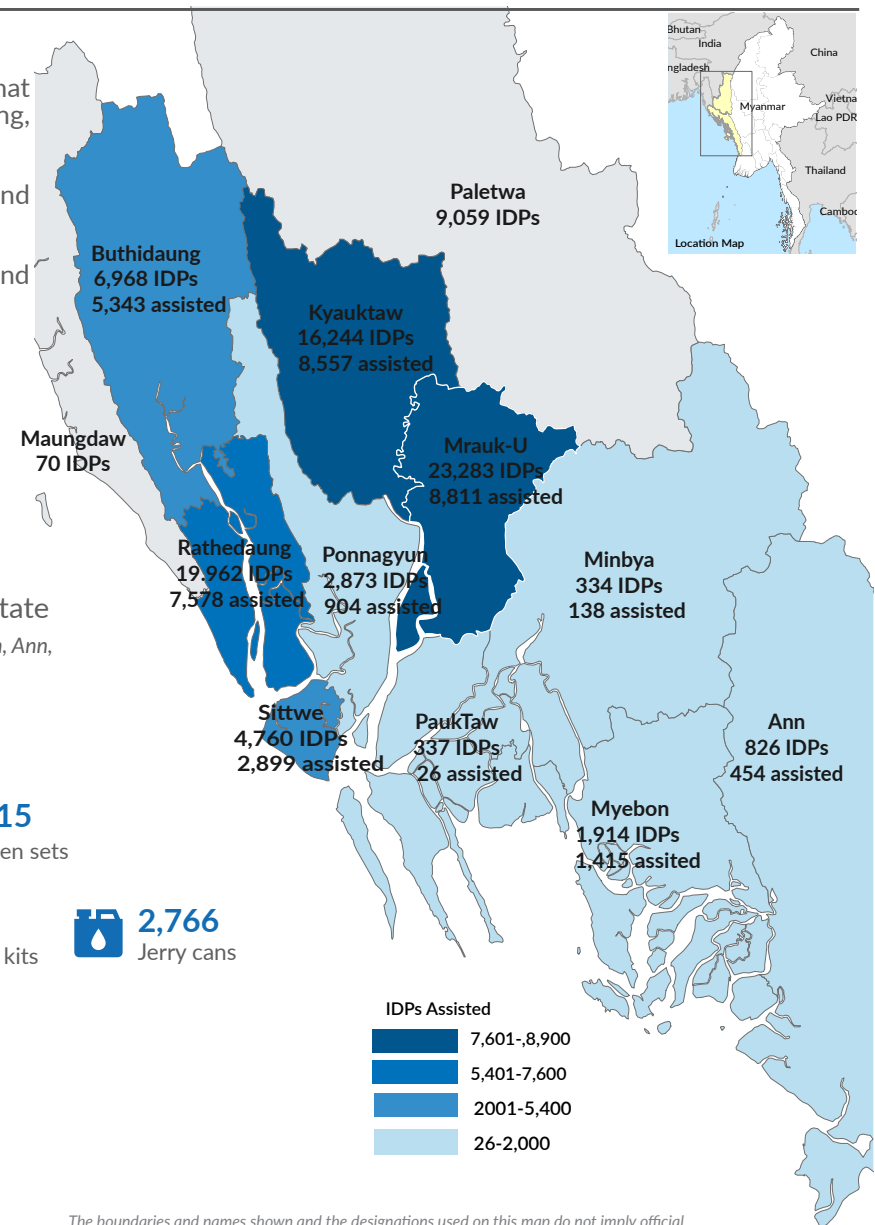
