


13.4 MILLION FORCIBLY DISPLACED POPULATION

The total forcibly displaced and stateless population to UNHCR in West and Central Africa (WCA) relates to the people UNHCR is mandated to protect and assist. It includes those who have been forcibly displaced; those who have returned home within recent years: those who are stateless or at risk of statelessness; and other groups to whom UNHCR has extended its protection or assisted on a humanitarian basis.



The total of 2.2 million refugees represents an 34% increase from September 2022. Chad hosts the largest number of refugees in the region with 48%. Cameroon is the second largest refugee-hosting country in the region with 22%. Sudan, CAR, and Nigeria are the main countries of origin (together 80%) of the region's refugees with a contribution of 40%, 23%, and 17% respectively.


The registration exercise is still on going. Around a number of 593,854 are unregistered population. There are mainly in Benin (10,808), CAR (34,461), Chad (388,365), Cameroon (5,000), Guinea (63), Cote d'Ivoire (7,135), Ghana (11,676), Mali (27,464), Niger (90,435) and Nigeria (18,447).

The Lake Chad Basin hosts 31% of forcibly displaced population in West and Central Africa. Central Sahel hosts the second largest number (31%) with the majority being Internally Displaced Persons in Burkina Faso (64%).











MAIN COUNTRIES OF ASYLUM


