


64 victims of gender-based violence (GBV) were medically and psychosocially assisted in Mopti, Koro, and Ménaka.



MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION

Legal protection

- In July, 02 refugees and 04 asylum seekers were received by the UNHCR office, advised and guided on issues related to food assistance, housing, professional training, documentation, income-generating activities, and the procedure for determining refugee status in Mali.

Registration

- During reporting period, a total of 6,183 individuals from 2,091 households were registered. 434 households of 1,515 individuals in the Douentza region, 806 households of 2,251 individuals in Benena, 68 households of 183 individuals in Tominian, and 783 households of 2,240 individuals in San City.

Education

- Among the 310 refugee students who took the basic studies diploma (DEF) exam, 211 passed this exam with a success rate of 72.64%, which is higher than the national success rate of 44.46%.

Gender-based violence

- During the period under review, in the localities of Mopti, Koro, and Ménaka, 64 cases of victims of gender-based violence (GBV) were treated medically and psychosocially.
- In addition, awareness-raising and capacity-building activities were organized, including: -Information and awareness raising of 540 people on gender-based violence including 371 women, 106 men, 6 boys, and 57 girls.
- Organization of 4 workshops to assess and strengthen the capacities of local protection mechanisms in Koro with the participation of 210 people including 119 men and 91 women.
- Organization of workshops for updating and setting up maps and a reference circuit for GBV support services in the localities of Koro, Gao and Menaka with the participation of 119 people including 43 women and 76 men.

Mixed Movements

- In order to inform and raise awareness among partners involved in the management of mixed movements, in July there were:
 - Training in Kayes on the UNHCR mandate and mixed movements for the defense and security forces (FDS) and administrative authorities.
 - Distribution of 170 copies of the map of protection services in Kayes during the forum on migration issues held in Kayes.
 - It should be noted that in the period under review 2024, mixed movement monitoring activities recorded 1,031 (669 men, 244 women, 61 boys, and 57 girls). During the this period, 111 awareness sessions were conducted in the regions of Gao and Kidal, Ménaka, Mopti, Bandiagara, Douentza, San, Ségou, Tombouctou, Kayes, Nioro, Koulikoro, Sikasso and Koutiala. These sessions focused on the themes of refugee status, irregular migration, civil status, education, prevention of GBV, asylum in Mali, etc. A total of 2,831 persons participated, including forcibly displaced persons, representatives of technical services, the Malian Armed Forces, and municipal structures.

Statelessness

- 238 refugees (from Mauritania), including 122 women and 116 men who were regularized and reached the age of majority as of December 31, 2023, have all opted for Malian nationality. These intentions were collected by the mobilizers who were responsible for submitting the consent notice to them. In July, naturalization files for 37 applicants, including 20 adults and 17 minors, were prepared with legal assistance.

Durables solutions:

Voluntary repatriation

- In July 2024, 349 retournees were registered, including 304 (94.70%) from Mauritania who returned to Timbuktu/Goundam and 44 persons who returned from Burkina Faso to the regions of Segou, Mopti and Gao.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD-ITEMS (NFIs) & WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH)

During the period under review, UNHCR provided shelter and NFIs assistance through:


- Installation of 14 solar street lights on IDP sites in Mopti to ensure access to energy, protection of displaced persons against threats, development of economic activities, and strengthening of education for young people.
- Construction of 58 emergency shelters for 58 families of internally displaced persons of 232 individuals in Niafounke in the Timbuktu region.
- Assistance in non-food items to 226 families benefiting from the shelter program of the city of Hope (Naata) in Gao.
- Construction of 20 transitional shelters for 20 families of internally displaced persons of 121 individuals at the Cité Al AMAL in the commune of Tombouctou in the Tombouctou region.
- Construction of 100 transitional shelters for 100 families of internally displaced persons in the commune of Macina, in the Ségou region.
- Development of a temporary site for the registration of Burkinabe refugees in the commune of Koro, Bandiagara region, as well as assistance in cash transfers to facilitate access to flexible shelter solutions for 888 refugee households in the same locality.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION
