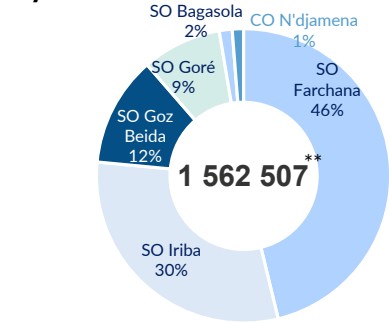
Age Cohort



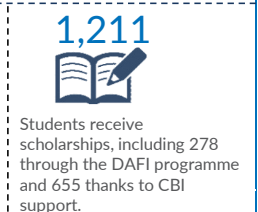
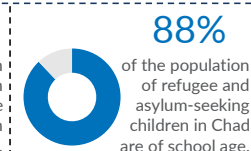
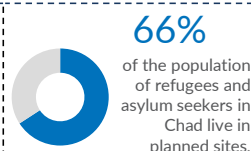
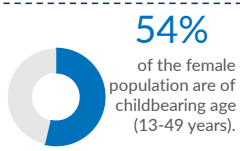
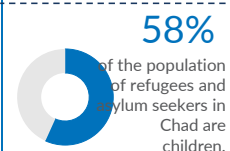
By Country of Origin

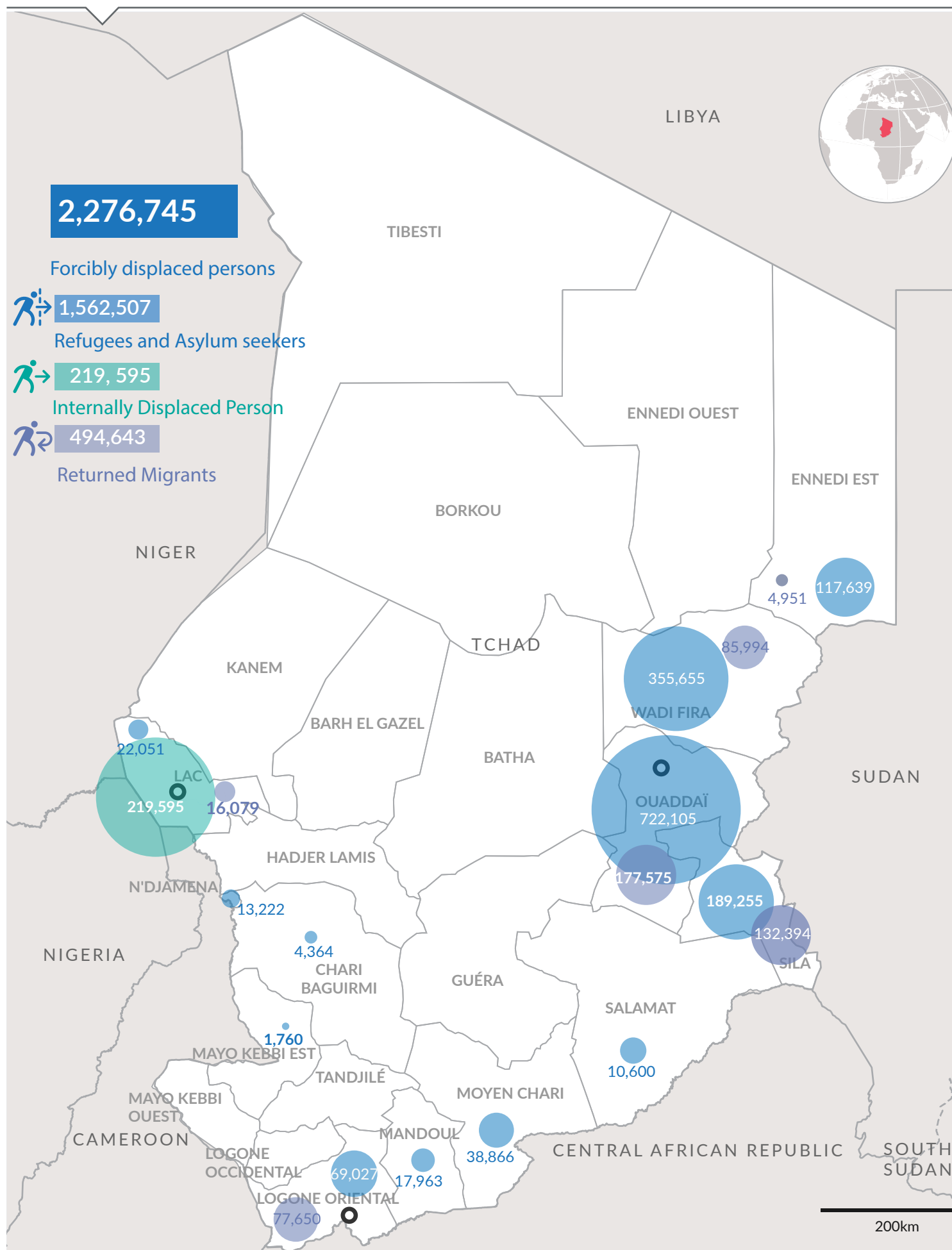

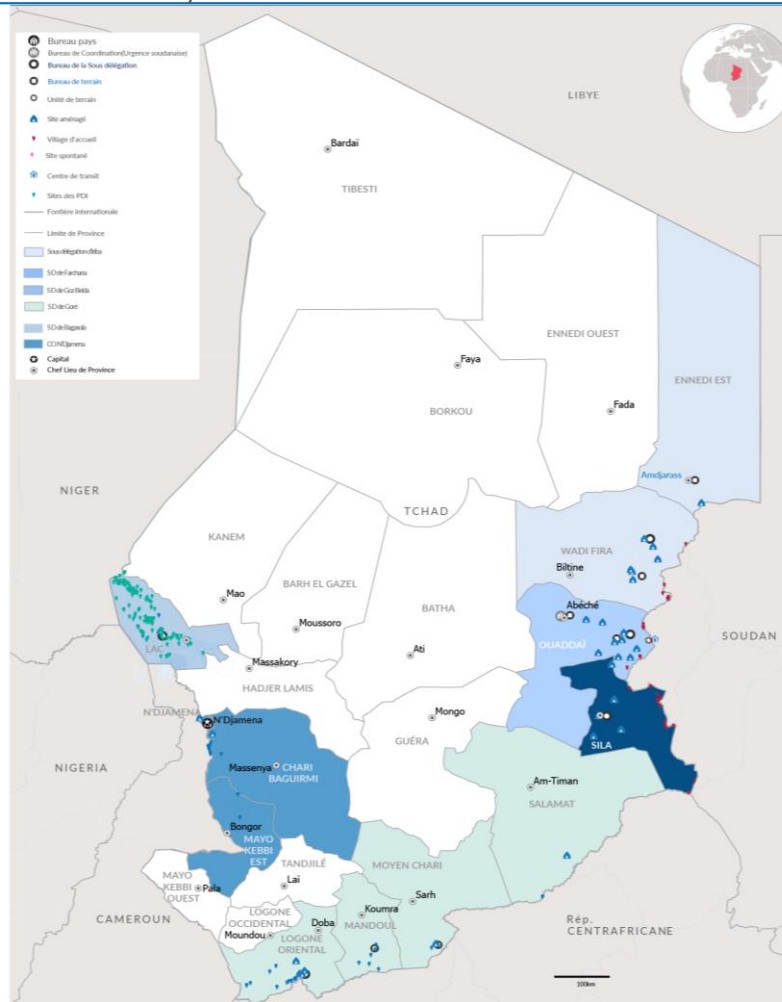

Essentially located in the 21 planned sites and 1 reception village in the East and in urban areas.

CENTRAL AFRICANS

Located in the six camps, sites, and host villages in the South and in urban areas.

Primarily located in the Dar Es Salam camp and host villages in the Lake Province as well as in urban areas.

CAMEROONIANS

Mainly composed of populations who fled intercommunal clashes in the Logone and Chari department in Cameroon. They are located in the two camps around N'Djamena and on the banks of the Logone River.
